

LEONORA GOLDEN GIFT AND MENZIES CYCLASSIC THRILL THE GOLDFIELDS

5 JUNE 2012

In Leonora over the long weekend, Wendy Duncan MLC enjoyed the opportunity to join in the festivities surrounding the Leonora Golden Gift and historic Menzies Cyclclassic.

Ms Duncan said that the Golden Gift event was proudly supported by Royalties for Regions through the Regional Events Scheme (RES) and involved a weekend long festival which included a free community concert with Australian music legends the Choir Boys and James Reyne, plus a horse racing carnival, fireworks, market stalls and street performances.

The carnival's main attraction - a 1600-metre sprint along the bitumen of Leonora's main street - attracted many competitors from across Australia and this year included two members of Australia's Olympic team, Jeff Riseley and Kaila McKnight.

In total around 200 athletes from across Australia competed in events over the long weekend, which had a total prize pool of \$50,000 up for grabs.

"The young winners made it very clear that if it was not for events like this, they would not have the funds to pursue their training and careers interstate and overseas, so the corporate sponsors must be acknowledged and thanked."

Ms Duncan said that there was added excitement in Leonora with the arrival of 120 cyclists taking part in the Menzies Cyclclassic. Cyclists from all over Australia and some from overseas rode 120km to Menzies on Saturday and then completed the 105 km to Leonora on Sunday.

"It was great to greet the riders in Menzies on Saturday night and help out the small band of the amazing Kookynie Volunteer Association along with Shire of Menzies staff and Councillors who cooked up a storm for riders and their support teams."

The investment of \$40million of Royalties for Regions funds over four years to the RES will see continued benefit for regional towns such as Leonora and Menzies as they contribute towards making their communities active and vibrant through holding regional events.

"The Royalties for Regions funding is just a small part of the contributions that went into these great events. Congratulations to the Shires of Menzies and Leonora and all the volunteers for their huge effort."

"It is a unique event on the Western Australian festival calendar that attracts countless visitors and supports the whole community both socially and economically. It also shows visitors why the people of Leonora and Menzies love where they live."

Western Australia Day (WA Day) A New Name, a New Way of Celebrating

It's official. WA has a public holiday named after the State – Western Australia Day (WA Day).

The first WA Day, formerly known as Foundation Day, will commemorate the State's proud history and exciting future on 1 June 2012.

The renaming of one of WA's most historically significant days received bi-partisan support from WA's major political parties, with legislation passing through State Parliament in March.

According to Celebrate WA Chairman John Poynton AM, WA Day signifies an exciting evolution in the State's history and acknowledges all those who call WA home.

"WA Day will provide us with the scope to embrace our indigenous history, as well as to recognise our European settlers, making celebrations inclusive and contemporary," Mr Poynton said.

"We have had very positive feedback about the name change. WA Day is a fresh, new way of engaging people of all ages in every part of the State," he said.

"To celebrate the special occasion there will be four days of festivities over the June long weekend – with each day recognising and celebrating a different aspect of WA achievement."

Some of the events to be held over the weekend include the WA Day Stakes to be held at Belmont Park and the announcement of the winners of the Western Australian of the Year Awards, formerly WA Citizen of the Year Awards.

The Western Australian of the Year Awards have also been renamed to reflect their position as the State's highest honour and to coincide with the new, more contemporary WA Day.

To preserve the historical significance of the date, WA Day will always be acknowledged on 1 June, but the public holiday will be held on the Monday of the closest weekend. This year WA Day falls on a Friday and the public holiday is on Monday 4 June.

Arts and Culture Important for Community Development

One of the key functions of the Goldfields-Esperance Development Commission is to develop and broaden the Region's economic base and to identify infrastructure services to promote economic and social development within the region, a region that covers more than 771,000 square kilometres covering nine local government areas from Ngaanyatjaraku to Ravensthorpe.

Whilst economic development is the GEDC's core function in terms of creating industry diversification and job creation, social development and regional capacity building is a natural and equally important function.

In this respect, the availability of Arts and Culture plays a key role in promoting the 'liveability' of the Region's towns and is a very important factor in attracting and retaining population. Research shows that Community involvement in Arts and Cultural activities can contribute significantly to individual and community wellbeing and can enhance the efforts of government agencies to realize their respective community wellbeing policies. Access to, and participation in Arts and Culture, contributes to economic development, improves our quality of life and benefits everyone in our communities.

The GEDC commends Country Arts WA's recently published manifesto that outlines the nine "concrete steps" that will guide regional Arts and Cultural development to the immediate and long term benefit of all Western Australians. Within this user friendly and compelling document the point is made that "the Arts and Culture has a critical role to play in growing and enriching the community. This can occur in many ways, including, critically at this time, by creating an environment attractive for people to stay or move and providing the human resource and skills base to maximize the potential of the resources industry".

In this context Art and Cultural centres are important overt signs of communities that recognize the importance of the Arts and Culture sector.

Moreover, there are many people and organizations involved in this sector, some more organised than others. From a government agency perspective it is normally beneficial for a sector to be well organized and coordinated, to the extent that they can be. The state government has sent a strong message to regional communities that it wants more people living in Regional WA - and in this regard the Arts and Culture sector could and should play a leading role. This can only come about if that sector has an agreed vision and therefore the GEDC recommends the 2020nine Manifesto, A Manifesto for Regional Arts in Western Australia, as a guiding document. This document is a statement of intentions that represents the regional arts community of Western Australia as a whole. It is a call for leaders in the public and private sectors to be part of realising these goals.

One of the most progressive business firms trading on the Eastern Gold-fields is that of W and C J Montgomery, trading as Montgomery Bros., Drapers, Clothiers and House Furnishers. It is just eight years since Mr William **Montgomery founded the firm's business at Southern Cross.** When Menzies was discovered they opened a branch of their business



And lately a third branch has been started at Kookynie. When the present business was started growth was looked for but it was scarcely that trade would increase with such volume or that its expansion would have been so phenomenal. Such however, proved to be the case and the firm Montgomery Bros., are now ranked in the very front rank of gold-fields traders.

The accompanying photo's, the one above and the one below give but the slight idea of the stock and resources of the premises at Menzies and Kookynie, which are too small to keep pace with the firm's increasing business.



A Guide to Infant and Child Restraints



Type A1—capsule

Rearward-facing restraint with a harness or other means of retaining the occupant, suitable for infants whose mass is up to 9 kg, and corresponding supine length is up to 700 mm.



Type A/B—convertible child restraint

Dual purpose rearward and forwards facing child restraint also known as a Convertible Child Restraint. Use rearward facing up to 9kg or 12 kg (check manufacturer instructions) and forward facing from 9kg to 18kg. Minimum recommendations for forward facing are 8 kg in weight and at least 6 months of age.



Type B—forward facing restraint

Forward-facing chair with harness, suitable for children whose mass is within the range 8 kg to 18 kg.



Type B/E—combination booster

Combination of forward facing restraint with internal harness that gets stowed away and restraint is used as booster. Suitable for child 8kg-18kg with harness.

Suitable for child 18kg-26kg without harness.



Type E—booster

A booster seat, which is held in place by the interaction between the child, the booster seat and the car's lap/sash belt or a child harness. Boosters are available in two basic configurations: booster cushion - a backless cushion and booster seat (chaise) – a cushion complete with backrest.



Type C—harness

Forward-facing harness without chair, suitable for children whose mass is within the range 14 kg to 32 kg.



Safety in the Outback

Many of the hazards of outback travel can be avoided with a little preparation. Here are some things to consider when you are preparing for your trip.

- Source good quality maps and plan your route in advance.
- Be wary of how much you pack on your roof rack: a heavy load on top increases the chances of a roll-over.
- Store water in small containers instead of one large tank and check all water containers for leaks. If you're unused to the outback, you may need one litre of water every hour; if active (eg walking, climbing, etc.) you will need to consume additional water at regular intervals - remember, don't wait to feel thirsty before taking a drink! Most towns have water but, at some places, you may not be able to get drinking water. We recommend that in dry hot conditions you carry 10 litres of water per person per day. Don't rely on waterholes, dams, bores, mills, tanks or troughs. Soap or detergents should not be used in any natural water course or stock watering point.
- Carry enough food for each person for two days.
- Bring matches or a lighter.
- Pack a fire extinguisher.
- Carry an HF radio compatible with the RFDS (mobile phones and CB radios will not work in remote areas). You can buy an HF radio from most two-way communication centres.
- Get a summary of your medical history and bring all medication and repeat scripts with you.
- Do a first aid course and pack a first aid kit.
- Take a hat, sunscreen and insect repellent.
- Wear clothing suitable for the climate and wear good walking shoes, and take warmer clothes for the evenings.
- Don't travel in the hottest part of the year.

Overseas visitors are encouraged to take out adequate travel insurance when travelling in Outback Australia.
