A Nurse Practitioner (NP) is an advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) who has completed advanced didactic and clinical education beyond that required of the generalist registered nurse (RN) role.

Nurse Practitioners are able manage acute and chronic medical conditions through comprehensive and make referrals for a wide range of acute and chronic medical conditions. NPs can serve as a patient's history taking, physical exam, and the ordering of diagnostic tests and treatments. NPs (within their scope of practice) are qualified to diagnose medical problems, order treatments, prescribe medications, primary health care provider and they may see patients of all ages depending on their specialty.

### MP fights for road funding in the region

Federal Member for O'Connor Rick Wilson highlighted the need for continued road funding when he backed the Coalition's Land Transport Infrastructure Amendment Bill 2014 in Parliament today, Monday, March 24.

The Bill includes a commitment to \$1.75 billion to continue the important Roads to Recovery program until 30 June 2019.

In a speech delivered to Parliament, Mr Wilson discussed how vital road and rail projects are to improve efficiency, boost productivity and drive Australia's economy forward, especially in rural and regional areas.

"With an electorate that covers over 900,000 square kilometres, road infrastructure is very important to the people living in O'Connor, mainly because there is very little alternative than to drive everywhere."

Mr Wilson said the Government was aware that local councils, particularly those in rural and regional Australia, faced significant problems maintaining local roads from within existing funding.

"Funding through the Roads to Recovery program has been a huge help to local Councils involved in improving the condition of roads, making them safer to use," Mr Wilson said.

Mr Wilson highlighted work done by the Shires of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and Dundas which used their Roads to Recovery allocations to good use benefitting all the community.

"The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder used their Roads to Recovery allocation of \$1,119,859 to fund five road reconstruction projects, including the reconstruction of Bourke Street, Connolly Street, Cheetham Street, Moran Street and Hampden Street.

"Although these five projects might not be considered glamorous road projects, they are much needed asset management replacement to serve the needs of the community and the city's infrastructure replacement backlog."

The Shire of Dundas undertook a resealing program on existing town streets in Norseman and Eucla over a 10-year period to maintain the current level of service to residents and visitors.

"The Shire of Dundas Bitumen sealing works for 2013/14, made available by the Roads to Recovery program, has seen 21 projects be undertaken," Mr Wilson said. "That is a far cry from the one or two that the Shire would be able to complete with rates income alone."

Mr Wilson said he had been told if the funding was not available the level of maintenance and reconstruction would then compound and increase which would lead to the Shire having to use more rates money on road works. This would result in less money for other community projects such as youth services and grants to community groups that are an important part outback life.



Unfortunately criminal activity is not limited to the town site of Menzies. Further recent happenings occurred at the following;

A small fuel container was removed from the roundabout area in Kookynie while Shire staff were working hard to improve the area, whipper snipping, mowing etc.

A large amount of damage was done to the facilities at Niagara Dam over the last long weekend, spoiling things for both locals and tourists. Sadly after repairs were made by Shire staff this senseless act was repeated only a matter of weeks later, this would indicate it could be someone from our own area. Shame!

On several occasions fuel was removed from water pumps being used by contractors while they were working on the Sandstone Road.

These incidents don't reflect well on our community so keep your eyes open and report any suspicious behaviour to the Leonora Police on 90 376 100.





### GOLDFIELDS RACES ON TRACK WITH RIGP.

26 MARCH 2014

Two goldfields racing clubs have been successful in receiving funding from the latest round of the Racing Infrastructure Grants Program (RIGP) which was announced by Racing and Gaming Minister Terry Waldron.

The Leonora Race Club and the Golden Mile Trotting Club are among nine applicants who will share in funds to complete critical infrastructure works or works on patron facilities.

Wendy Duncan MLA said that the Leonora Race Club would utilise their funding for fencing of the stables area while the Golden Mile Trotting Club would purchase a replacement tractor.

"Funding for these goldfields tracks was boosted by the Royalties for Regions program which contributed 50% of the total project costs towards each venue."

"Racing facilities throughout the goldfields provide a social hub and create tourism opportunities for the region through offering people the experience of a true country race day in the golden outback," said Ms Duncan.

"Both of these race tracks offer just that experience which will be enhanced through upgrades to their facilities and equipment through the RIGP and Royalties for Regions funding."

Ms Duncan praised the strong commitment of volunteers and supporters for the successful clubs, saying that racing in the goldfields is part of the glue that holds the community together and generates considerable economic benefit for the region.

Since the program began in 2011, a total of 49 clubs have shared in \$11.4million of funds.

Regional tracks can apply for up to 90% of the total project costs up to a maximum of \$900,000. The additional funding for regional venues has been made possible through a funding boost from the Royalties for Regions program.

Local community and interest groups have until 5:00pm Friday 30 May 2014 to apply for funding.





### RESIDENTS URGED TO BECOME WATER WISE

### 1 APRIL 2014

Residents of Kalgoorlie-Boulder are today being reminded to take part in the free Showerhead Swap initiative which allows homeowners to sway up to two old inefficient showerheads for high-efficiency replacements for free.

Member for Kalgoorlie, Wendy Duncan MLA said that up to 7,000 litres of water could be saved per year per household by swapping to the high efficiency showerhead.

"Residents wishing to get involved in this initiative need to take a copy of their water account and up to two old showerheads to the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder offices and exchange them for the new water-efficient showerheads," said Ms Duncan.

Similar programs in Laverton and Leonora and other regional towns across Western Australia have seen up to 500 showerheads exchanged, leading to a saving of 3.5 million litres of drinking water. The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder has 1,000 showerheads available as part of the swap program, where it is estimated up to 7 million litres of water could be saved.

"This is a great initiative involving both the Water Corporation and the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder to deliver long-term water savings for the local community, and I strongly encourage residents to do their bit and take part."

Residents of Kalgoorlie-Boulder have until the 30th June 2014 to take up the offer.

It has produced some wonderful random acts of kindness too. One lady received a \$10,000 donation from a complete stranger so she could have a liver operation she couldn't afford. Another boy noticed a parking meter was expired. He convinced his mother to top up the meter so that one car owner avoided a \$79 fine.

The founder of "Pay it Forward Day" Mr Blake Beattie, says "he is overwhelmed at the support. Of course we should be paying it forward every day, but many of us get so caught up in the busyness of every day life that we lose sight of what is most important. Pay it Forward Day is a great reminder of the positive energy that occurs when we give to others."

### O'Connor MP welcomes NBN funding announcement

The announcement of an \$18.4 million expansion of the Interim Satellite Service is another step forward for NBN users in the O'Connor electorate, according to Federal Member Rick Wilson.

He said the proposed upgrade of the current Interim Satellite Service capacity announced today (Tuesday, March 25) by Communications Minister Malcolm Turnbull would provide interim satellite users with speeds they were promised when the NBN was first announced.

"I have been pushing for an improvement to the NBN service such as this since being elected to the seat of O'Connor," Mr Wilson said.

"Most interim satellite users have been putting up with often worse than dial-up speeds until now.

"This funding to improve the service is good news for farmers, the owners of small businesses and families who have struggled to undertake the basics, such as internet banking, because of the slow speeds.

Mr Wilson said more than 5,600 interim satellite users in Western Australia could expect to be better off after the changes which would result in the purchase of more satellite bandwidth.

"Farmers have had trouble accessing CBH Loadnet to transfer grain," he said. "They need this service for business not for pleasure."

First, at a cost of \$18.4 million, the NBN Co will upgrade the current capacity to all users on this satellite service by one-third.

Second, a new, stringent fair use policy will be instituted to ensure a minority of very heavy users cannot crowd out the majority.

Mr Wilson said trials by NBN Co of the changes had demonstrated that interim satellite users would be able to answer emails, surf the web, do banking and see kids complete their homework.

"This was something many families in remote areas of O'Connor have been unable to do. It will not be as fast as the speeds promised by Labor, which was never going to," Mr Wilson said.

"But it will be broadband and much higher and certainly not anywhere near slow dial-up speeds experienced at present."

Mr Wilson said the Government was working on additional measures to provide new services so that up to 9,000 people would finally be able to get access to the NBN.

### **ANZAC BISCUITS**

### **INGREDIENTS**

125g butter, chopped coarsely

2 tablespoons golden syrup

3/4 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

1 tablespoon water

1 cup (90g) rolled oats

1 cup (90g) desiccated coconut

1 cup (150g) plain flour


34 cup (165g) brown sugar



### METHOD

- Preheat oven to 160°C or 140°C fan-forced.
- Combine butter and syrup in a small saucepan. Heat gently until butter and syrup melt.
- Combine bicarbonate of soda and water in a small bowl and stir into butter mixture.
- Combine remaining ingredients in a large bowl. Pour over warm butter mixture and stir well to combine.
- Roll rounded teaspoons of mixture into balls. Place about 4 cm apart on baking paper lined baking trays and flatten slightly.
- Bake in preheated oven 12-15 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from oven and cool 5 minutes on baking trays; transfer to a wire rack to finish cooling.





- ◆ The mothers, sisters and wives I eft behind during World War I sent ANZAC biscuits made of oats, sugar, flour, coconut, butter and golden syrup to their sons, brothers and husbands at Gallipoli. ANZAC biscuits were hard and I ong-I asting, designed to survive the I ong journey to the troops. They were eaten instead of bread (which went stale quickly). Some men crushed them, mixed them with water and ate them I ike porridge.
- The Last surviving ANZAC, Alec Campbel I, died on 16 May 2002.
- World War I was often referred to as the 'Great War'.
- In World War I, Australians not only served at Gallipolibut also on the Western Front (France and Bel gium) as well as in the Middle East.
- ◆ The Austral ian Imperial Force (AIF), the Royal Austral ian Navy (RAN), the Austral ian Light Horse and the Austral ian Flying Corps all fought in World Warl.
- The word ANZAC has been protected by Austral ian I egisl ation since 1921. This ensures that the word is not misused. To use the word you must seek permission from the Minister for Veterans' Affairs.
- Al though women were not allowed to fight in World Warl, many tended to the injured troops overseas and in Australia as members of the Australian Army Nursing Service.
- All the ANZACs were volunteers.
- Simpson's donkey was most often called Duffy, but was also called Abdul or Murphy.
- Two decades after the end of World War I, Austral ia once again followed Britain into war for World War II.


