


Menzies Matters

In Australia, Mother's Day is celebrated on the second Sunday in May.

The tradition of giving gifts to mothers on Mother's Day in Australia was started by Mrs Janet Heyden, a resident of Leichhardt, Sydney, in 1924. She began the tradition during a visit to a patient at the Newington State Home for Women, where she met many lonely and forgotten mothers. To cheer them up, she rounded up support from local school children and businesses to donate and bring gifts to the women. Every year thereafter, Mrs Heyden raised increasing support for the project from local businesses and even the local Mayor. The day has since become commercialised. Traditionally, the chrysanthemum is given to mothers for Mother's Day as the flower is in season during May (autumn in Australia) and ends in "mum", a common affectionate shortening of "mother" in Australia. Men will often wear a chrysanthemum in their lapels in honour of mothers.

Ross River virus warning for outdoor activities in the Goldfields

An increase in cases of Ross River virus throughout the Goldfields has prompted the WA Country Health Service to issue a warning to residents and visitors to cover up when they are outdoors to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes.

Dr Clare Huppatz, the WA Country Health Service—Goldfields Public Health Physician said advised people today to be vigilant about mosquitoes, particularly at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active.

"The school holidays and Easter weekend are popular times for outdoor activities such as camping and bushwalking, and the weather is often ideal for these activities,: Dr Huppatz said. "However, it's also important to protect yourself from the possibility of mosquitoborne infections.

"Ross River virus is transmitted to humans by mosquitoes; with outbreaks of disease in the Goldfields more common following periods of rainfall, when breeding conditions for mosquitoes are optimal.

"Symptoms typically occur one to two weeks after being bitten by an infected mosquito, with common symptoms being painful joints, such as wrists, knees, ankles, fingers and elbows.

"Other symptoms include sore muscles, skin rashes, fever, tiredness, headaches and swollen lymph nodes". While symptoms can be debilitating, they usually resolve with no lasting effects after two to six weeks, however, some people will be unwell for several months, and even longer in rare cases.

"Avoid outdoor activities at dawn and dusk in areas where mosquitoes are active; cover up with long, loose-fitting and preferably light-coloured clothing; and wear a good mosquito repellent, containing diethyl toluamide, commonly known as DEET.

"When camping, make sure caravans, tents and swags are in good repair and are fitted with effective flyscreens. If sleeping under the stars, use a mosquito bed net over your sleeping bag or swag.

"Even the best repellents only last up to four hours, so they are not effective all night. When outside the tent, cover up and wear a repellent.

"There is no specific treatment for RRV, other than pain relief and rest; the only way of confirming infection with RRV is by a blood test ordered by a doctor. Therefore, people are encouraged to seek advice from their General Practitioner if they develop symptoms of Ross River disease".






CYCLASSIC WEEKEND 31 MAY—1 JUNE 2014

The Chas Egan Memorial Race

The Menzies Classic will still stand in its own right as "Australia's Richest Handicap Cycle Race" and although we break in tradition in some respects, the classic nature of this race is retained.

The 2014 race will start in Kalgoorlie-Boulder - home of KCGM and the Superpit gold mine - and will head north along the Goldfields Highway, through the eucalypt woodlands to Menzies, undulating over 132km


Four sprint sections await the opportunistic rider to try and grab some cash on the way. The race finishes in the main street of Menzies.

The race, being a handicap event, means all riders are placed behind the first rider over the line, regardless of which grade they ride in. Hence riders from all grades have the opportunity to win line honours.

Prior to 2011, only once before – for the Menzies Centennial in 1994 – did the race go in this direction.

The current record holder for this direction following the 2013 event is Alex Smyth from the Dome Coffee's Cycling team, in the time of 2 hours 32 minutes.



Kalgoorlie hairdressing apprentice makes WorldSkills cut

Member for Kalgoorlie Wendy Duncan MLA has applauded the efforts of a young Kalgoorlie apprentice who has been selected to represent WA at the WorldSkills competition later this year.

Third year apprentice hairdresser Chanelle Gericke was among the team of 60 selected to represent Team WA when the competition is held in Perth for the first time since 1989 this September.

Ms Duncan said Ms Gericke, 21, epitomised the positive work attitude of young up-and-coming young trade specialists who had a bright future in their chosen careers.

"I'm absolutely delighted that a young woman who calls Kalgoorlie home has been selected to represent her state at this level," Ms Duncan said.

"It is testament not only to her skill set as a hairdresser but her determination to strive and be the best she can in the profession of hairdressing."

Ms Gericke, who works at Gravity Hair, was one of 16 regional apprentices and trainees and three hairdressers chosen in the team, representing the peak of excellence in vocational education and training in the state.

She said she was excited at the opportunity to take on the nation's best young hairdressers and was willing to travel if it means following her opportunities.

"WorldSkills has opened my eyes and encouraged me to think outside the box. It has helped me perfect my skills and has enhanced my creative ability," Ms Gericke said.

"I'm confident but this time I want to take my skills beyond regional level."

Fellow regional apprentice hairdresser Nathan Sandford from Binningup was also selected in the team.

Team WA will compete against the nation's best in almost 40 categories including web design, carpentry, retail butchery, floristry, electrical installation, fashion technology and restaurant service.

The Australian WordSkills competition will be held in Perth from September 18 to 20 and is expected to attract more than 500 participants.

Next year the 43rd WorldSkills International Competition will be held in Brazil.

MAY DAY

International Workers' Day is a celebration of labour and the working classes that is promoted by the international labour movement and occurs on May 1 every year. That day, May 1, is also the traditional European Spring holiday of May Day. Therefore, May 1 is a national public holiday in more than 80 countries, but in only some of those countries is the public holiday



officially known as Labour Day or some similar variant. In the other countries, the public holiday marks the Spring festival of May Day. Further, still other countries celebrate a Labour Day unrelated to International Workers' Day and on other dates significant to the labour movement in that country, such as the Labour Day in the United States which is on the first Monday of September.


May 1 was chosen as the date for International Workers' Day by the Socialists and Communists of the Second International to commemorate the Haymarket affair in Chicago that occurred on May 4, 1886.

While unofficial activities and commemorations associated with International Workers' Day occur on May Day in Australia, Labour Day in the various states and territories generally fall on other days. Only in the Northern Territory is Labour Day celebrated on the first Monday in May, which is a public holiday under the name of "May Day".

CLASSIC MOUSSAKA

2 large eggplant, thinly sliced
Olive oil cooking spray
1 tablespoon olive oil
1 medium brown onion, finely chopped
2 garlic cloves, crushed
800g lamb mince
420g can crushed tomatoes
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ground allspice
1/3 cup grated pizza cheese
Lemon wedges, to serve

VVhite Sauce 75g butter 1/3 cup plain flour 2 cups milk

Spray eggplant with oil. Heat a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Cook eggplant, in batches, for 2 to 3 minutes each side or until browned. Transfer to a large plate.

Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Add onion and garlic. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until onion has softened. Add mince. Cook, stirring with a wooden spoon to break up mince, for 6 to 8 minutes or until browned. Add tomatoes, cinnamon and allspice. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer for 30 minutes or until sauce is thick and liquid has evaporated. Meanwhile, make sauce. Melt butter in a saucepan over medium-high heat. Add flour. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until bubbling. Gradually stir in milk. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until mixture has thickened. Remove from heat

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan-forced. Grease an 8 cup-capacity ovenproof dish. Place one-third of the eggplant, slightly overlapping, over base of prepared dish. Spread half the meat sauce over eggplant. Repeat layers, ending with eggplant. Spread white sauce over eggplant. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake for 45 minutes or until golden. Stand 15 minutes. Serve with lemon wedges.



KIDS CHEESY RICE FRITTERS

- 1cup SunRice brown rice, cooked, cold
- 3/4 cup grated tasty cheese
- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 medium carrot, peeled and grated
- 1 small zucchini, grated
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/4 cup plain flour
- Salt and pepper
- Ricebran oil to shallow fry
- 200g punnet of grape tomatoes, halved
- Bunch of watercress

In a large mixing bowl mix together the rice, cheese, eggs, carrot, zucchini, basil and four. Season well with salt and pepper.

Heat the ricebran oil in a large fry pan over a moderately high heat. Fill a 1/4 cup measure with the mixture and turn into the hot pan, flatten into a round fritter shape, and continue shaping the mixture to fill the pan. Cook the fritters in batches for 2-3 minutes each side or until golden brown and crisp. Transfer the cooked fritters to a plate lined with paper towel.

Serve the fritters warm or cool, tumbled with the grape tomatoes and watercress.







International artist Archana Hande re-interprets history of Laverton in new exhibition

April 2014

Indian artist Archana Hande will this May launch *The Golden Feral Trail*, an exhibition for *spaced* - Western Australia's recurring international event of socially engaged art - and <u>Asialink</u>, held in conjunction with the <u>Laverton Heritage Festival</u> (12 – 18 May 2014).

A product of her three month arts residency in the remote community of Laverton, *The Golden Feral Trail* will reflect on local oral histories and trace the relationship between South Asia and Western Australia. With particular emphasis on the trade routes of the goldfields, the history and development of the community and the identity politics surrounding the elusive cameleers, Hande intends to propose an alternative journey through the past via photographs, archival documents, animation and collaborations with local artists.

Hande comments, "...the archive will also show the growth of the town of Laverton and its history through the eyes of two local artists [Tegan Todd and Laurinda Hill]...one is reflecting on the goldfield history and the other is reflecting on the land, its history and the identity of the town..."

Hande's project and exhibition is made possible through a partnership with Asialink, the Laverton Leonora Cross Cultural Association (LLCCA) and the Shire of Laverton.

The Golden Feral Trail is proudly presented as a part of spaced 2: future recall, the second spaced event that follows on from the success of the inaugural spaced: art out of place program that took place throughout 2009-11 and culminated in an exhibition at Fremantle Arts Centre in 2012.




