The general public are welcome for question time at the start of each months Council Meeting.



Matters arising from the Ordinary Meeting of Council held Thursday 25th June 2009

1. Cultural Awareness Courses.

Council endorsed this concept in the 2009/10 budget with provision to assist in the attendance at "Cultural Awareness Courses" to contribute to both Staff and Elected Members in the issues related to awareness and understanding of Indigenous Cultural issues. Accordingly this is a wonderful gesture and a great step forward in the endeavour for a closer unity within our community.

2. Flag Pole for the Indigenous Flag.

Similarly, at the request of a non indigenous councillor this item was raised and supported unanimously by all councillors present to provide an additional Flag Pole at the Administration Centre in order to fly the Indigenous flag. Again this is a great gesture of recognition and embracing of the indigenous culture by this Government.

3. Wild Dog Controls.

This serious and significant issue was debated at some length at the June Meeting, though it presents some administrative concerns as to monitoring and controls over the delivery of the programme. Accordingly, council is acutely aware of the importance of this issue and has asked that this issue be re-addressed at the July meeting following further research into how best to deliver the programme.

4. Renovations to the Town Hall.

Council also resolved to put aside some substantial funds on the 2009/10 budget for the renovations of the Town Hall and this will subject to further comprehensive advices as to costs, plans and designs (e.t.c.), However, this is an innovatively advanced concept anticipating the future needs and it is wonderful to see the council planning the needs of the community in this type of fashion.

5. Governor to Visit the Goldfields.

Elected members for the Shire of Menzies have been invited to meet with the Governor in a dinner in Leonora in September when the Governor visits the Goldfields. Accordingly this is a great opportunity to meet the head of State and further advices will no doubt issue following this very prestigious event for this council.

6. Town Road Planning for the Future.

Again a particularly innovative concept anticipating the future needs of the community was raised in the endeavour to effectively plan for the future needs by defining the road network of the shire and by doing so effectively delineates the locations of the various vacant sites in the towns

7. Corporate Plan.

The corporate plan as prepared by a consultant was adopted by the Council as the "Blue Print" of the factors of significance and importance for this community and is a major step forward in the direction for this shire. This Plan will enable operational issues to be formed up, Grants applied for and future planning at be undertaken. This is significant and sets the pace and direction for arguably the next twenty years. This is great news and where Council is commended for embracing this "Futuristic Approach" to development.

8. Depot Controller.

Council also approved the engagement of a "Depot Person" to effect controls over the administration of the Depot with security, materials receipts, plant and equipment issue and controls, ordering of goods and services, researching of prices, basic and minor repairs and general support to the Works Manager. This engagement will be advertised locally in the next few weeks once council has approved the "Position Description Form" to define clearly the expectations of the position. Thus, this is also a great step forward in the application of effective controls in a range of areas and over a huge volume of valued equipment and will great support the Works Manager.

9. Budget Adoption 2009/10

The councillors deliberated over this most importance issue well into the evening of Thursday June 25th, 2009 to adopt a budget which includes a range of exciting projects for this community and where further advices will issue to Councillors prior to incurring the expenditure so as to ensure the project develops accordingly to the ambitions and intentions of the Council. Although some projects are dependent on Grant funding approvals, a brief summary of the proposed budget includes the following :

10. Ranger Services for Niagara Dam Site.

On a less pleasing note is that Council had to address the issue of unacceptable behaviour being regularly exhibited at the Niagara Dam and where the potential of engaging a ranger was considered. The issues lead to some administrative difficulties with monitoring, controls and safety. Accordingly council has requested that further research into this matter be applied for further consideration at the July meeting.

11. Tidy Towns Competition.

This very prestigious event has been supported by Council and Shire's participation on the 2009/10 year is established with the involvement of Cr. Kelly to represent the Council at meetings and functions relative to the event. Accordingly, we are thankful to Cr. Kelly for the preparedness to participate and look forward to the judging and the engagement in this State wide programme again for this coming year.

12. Donations to the Children's Cancer Institute, Cerebral Palsy Assoc, and St John's

Ambulance.

The Council for the Shire of Menzies also approved at the June meeting donations to support these Charities which all do a huge amount of good to communities across Australia and are all well deserving charitable organizations. The donation to the St John's Ambulance Association is specifically directed to the Menzies Sub branch as this is a non profit making organization and operated by volunteers, needs to raise its own funds as it is not Government funded. Accordingly, this is a wonderful support from the Menzies Council and indeed is most gratefully received.

Free Skin Cancer Screenings For The Goldfields

Free skin cancer screenings will be available at sites across the Goldfields region in July.

Organised by the Royal Flying Doctor Service through its 'RFDS on the road' Primary Health Care Program, the screening team will visit thirteen sites and communities across the Goldfields Esperance region.

The free screenings are a partnership project between the 'RFDS on the road' Program, supported by BHP Billiton Nickel West, and the Lions Cancer Institute.

A team of professional health volunteers from the Lions Cancer Institute and the WA Society of Plastic Surgeons will join with 'RFDS on the road' staff to spend four weeks providing free skin cancer education and screenings.

The FREE screenings will build on the success of a program conducted in the Pilbara in 2008 which saw 2,236 people screened, resulting in an alarming 24.9 per cent referral rate for suspect skin lesions.

Tim Shackleton, RFDS Western Operations chief executive officer says the screening program will take preventative and life saving health care to communities across the Goldfields Esperance region.

"This mobile health initiative means that people will have access to first class preventative health care and state of the art skin screening services close to their home."

"It is truly a fantastic partnership between us, the Lions Cancer Institute and BHP Billiton. We are certain that this year's program will give many regional people the opportunity to be screened."

Free skin cancer screenings will take at BHP Billiton's Mt Keith and Leinster sites, plus the townships of Leinster, Leonora, Laverton, Menzies, Kalgoorlie, Boulder, Coolgardie, Norseman, Grass Patch, Salmon Gums, Esperance and Ravensthorpe.

Spinefex Art Stories - Profile of Artist

Gerome Anderson

Size Medium 910 x 610 mm / Acrylic on Canvas Spinefex Art Gallery is inside the Menzies Visitors Centre, the 'Former' Lady Shenton Hotel. Artist Gerome Anderson was born 1/07/1940 at Ilbili, his Language is Pitjanjatjara.

Gerome's art is part of the Spinefex Arts Project at the Tjuntjuntjarra Community approximately 750kms east of Menzies.

Miramiratjara

Gerome Anderson was born at ilblii, a place adjacent to Miramiratjara and an area of cultural and geographical significance to the Spinefex people. In this area there is a permanent underground water supply guarded by many snakes. These snakes need to be pacified with a snaking ceremony by initiated men in order to be able to dig for water. Jerome specifically mentions the other rock holes and soak in the immediate area of Tunkaratjara, Parapurtjara,

Minga, Mukuritjara, Ngali and Kalyka. Jerome is a senior initiated man and has lived in the Great Victoria Desert not far from his country all of his life.

Let your kids get their hands dirty these school holidays

How to start your own worm farm...

computer games these school holidays

Entice your children away from the TV or



with the promise of letting them get their

hands dirty. Starting a compost or worm farm to recycle

food and garden waste is a great, fun activity that teaches

them to save the environment.

STEP 1. Chose a container to house your worms

You can buy a ready-made plastic worm farm or reuse old materials. Some ideas are foam boxes from your green grocer, old dresser drawers, a trunk or discarded barrel.

Π Make holes in the bottom of one box to let liquid drain. Place the box containing holes over another box without holes and make a tap in the bottom box to let the liquid out.

Put an upturned ice-cream container or a brick in the bottom box. This will help any worms that fall through the holes to climb up into the upper box. It will also form an island for the worms so they don't drown.

STEP 2. Make the bedding

The best bedding materials are torn newspaper and cardboard, leaves, chopped up straw and other dead plants, seaweed, sawdust, compost and aged manure. Be sure to wet the bedding - it must be moist like a wrung out sponge, then fill about three-quarters of the upper box. Include a couple of handfuls of sand or soil to provide necessary grit for the worm's digestion of food.

STEP 3. Add the worms

The best kind of earthworm to use is the redworm (a.k.a. red wiggler). These worms are incredible garbage eaters! They eat and expel their own weight every day, so even a small bin of redworms will yield large quantities of rich sweet-smelling compost.

When you add the worms they will guickly crawl down into the bedding as they don't like light.

STEP 4. Add food waste

Remember:

Don't add too much at once.

Bury the food 5-6cm under the bedding to help pre-П vent fruit flies.

Chopping the food makes it easier for the worms to Π eat.

Π Meat, bones, fatty food or dairy products often smell and can attract flies and other rodents.

Eggshells will maintain the bedding at a safe pH level. Without them the bedding may become too acidic.

DID YOU KNOW?

Worms will eat most of your kitchen waste and turn it into a high-quality fertiliser.

- Π If there are more than 1 million worms living in a hectare of soil, they could make 100 tonnes of castings. These same 1 million worms burrowing into a hectare of soil can create a drainage system equal to 1.2km of 15cm pipe.
- Π TIP! Keep a tight lid on the container you use to store food scraps before adding them to the bin. This will prevent flies from laying eggs in the scraps

STEP 5. Cover the worm bed

Cover the worn farm with newspaper or a piece of hessian. This will help keep a constant temperature in the worm farm.

Add water to the box whenever it begins to get dry. It should be the consistency of a lightly squeezed sponge if it is too wet the worms will die. Be sure to keep your worm farm out of hot sun and heavy rain.

STEP 6. Harvest the worm castings

After a few months, your worm farm will be ready to harvest. There should be little or no original bedding visible in the bin and the contents will be brown and earthy looking worm castings. To harvest your bin

1. Move the contents of the bin to one side. Add fresh bedding and food to the vacant side. The worms will move from the finished compost in search of food. After a few days you should be able to remove the older, worm free compost.

2. Or dump the contents of the bin onto a large plastic sheet, and separate into small piles. Place a bright light above the sheet. The worms will move down away from the light allowing you to collect the compost.



Don't feed your worms:

Citrus fruits Oily foods Meat, poultry, fish Dairy foods Vinegar or salad dressings Glossy coloured paper (magazines, junk mail)

Bread

Plants from the onion family (garlic, shallots, leek)

Feed you worms:

- Fruit (except citrus) Π
- Π Vegetables (except onions)
- Coffee grounds and filter
- Π Tea bags
- Π Crushed egg shells
- Π Leaves
- Π Hair
- П Shredded paper and cardboard
