

For immediate release: Digital TV now available in Menzies

STRA also assisted the Shire of Menzies to obtain a 75% funding subsidy from SES Corporation to help with the installation costs for the SES digital television service.

Shire of Menzies President, Greg Dwyer said "Menzies residents and visitors will continue to enjoy free access to television services, as it should be". With 15 new digital channels available from the council owned site and four more from the ABC site, there is now much more choice than the old four analogue channels.

Mr Glenn Welsh – General Manager at STRA, said; "the Menzies digital self help site upgrade includes remote monitoring equipment that allows reconfiguration and troubles hooting if ever it's required.

Future West Coast Eagles games can now be enjoyed in digital clarity as the new Commercial and SES digital channels went to air in Menzies on Friday 21^{°°} June. Local residents were excited to have digital television in time for the West Coast vs Hawks match that night.

Satellite Television and Radio Australia Pty Ltd (STRA) completed the installation of the digital retransmission equipment and a new 15 metre broadcast pole at the council office on Thursday the 20^{°°} of June. The ABC digital services are due to commence on June 25.

The Menzies conversion from analogue to digital was part of the Goldfields TV conversion project. The shire now also has a brand new broadcast pole located at the side of the council office. This pole ensures that the transmit antenna is high enough to cover the township and surrounding area as well as providing a much more suitable location than the roof of the council office.





The theme for NAIDOC Week 2013 is We value the vision: Yirrkala Bark Petitions 1963.





This year's theme proudly celebrates the 50th anniversary of the presentation of the Yirrkala Bark Petitions to the Federal Parliament.

PETITIONS 1963 In August 1963, the Yolngu people of Yirrkala in northeast Arnhem Land sent two bark petitions – framed by traditional ochre paintings of clan designs – to the Australian House of Representatives.


The petitions protested the Commonwealth's granting of mining rights on land excised from Arnhem Land reserve and sought the recognition by the Australian Parliament of the Yolngu peoples' traditional rights and ownership of their lands.

Asserting title to Yolngu country under Yolngu law, the petitions were the first traditional documents **recognised by the Commonwealth Parliament and helped to shape the nation's acknowledgment of** Aboriginal people and their land rights.

We value the foresight, strength and determination of the Yolngu people whose Bark Petitions set into motion a long process of legislative and constitutional reforms for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

While appealing for the recognition of Yolngu rights to land, the Bark Petitions were a catalyst in advancing changes to the Constitution in the 1967 referendum, the statutory acknowledgment of Aboriginal land rights by the Commonwealth in 1976, and the overturning of the obstacle of the concept of terra nullius by the High Court in the Mabo Case in 1992 that recognised the traditional rights of the Meriam people to their islands in the eastern Torres Strait.

Today, we look to a future that better understands and celebrates the unique connection that **Aboriginals and Torres Strait Islander's share to country, as we continue to build an Australia that** reflects the achievements and furthers the aspirations of our people.


