DUNCAN PLEASED THAT LONG AWAITED PROJECTS GET THE BUDGET NOD

12 MAY 2016

Member for Kalgoorlie has welcomed the State Budget saying that at last the Goldfields is starting to see some of its key projects receive funding.

"Royalties for Regions funding through the Goldfields Esperance Revitalisation is flowing into projects that we have been talking about for some years now," Ms Duncan said.

While not specifically itemised in the budget under the Revitalisation Ms Duncan had been advised that the Masonic Killarney village project, providing sorely needed aged care accommodation for Kalgoorlie-Boulder, is one of those long-awaited projects to be supported.

"Masonic Homes have the runs on the board for providing well-managed, reasonably priced seniors accommodation in our region and it is great to see that their waiting list of nearly 100 now have some hope. An amount of \$4.5m will be provided through Royalties for Regions and this should mean that the project can proceed," Ms Duncan said.

Laverton will also be able to celebrate the allocation of \$8m for the Youth Centre and Early Childhood Precinct to create a multi-purpose community centre incorporating the swimming pool facility, the Coach House and the Community Resource Centre.

"This funding will solve a lot of issues in Laverton. The existing playgroup area and youth centre are old, contain asbestos and are not fit for purpose. It is also important that modern, well-serviced offices and conference facilities are available for the efficient delivery of government services that visit the town."

The funding will complement the recent CSRFF grant of \$850,000 towards the pool and sporting facilities upgrade.

"I am also told that consideration of Royalties for Regions funding for the Goldfields Rehabilitation Centre is also well advanced and I am confident this project will receive some good news soon."

Other budget measures of relevance to the Goldfields are:

- \$500,000 for Forward to Fellowship.
- Expansion of deep sewerage works to cover whole Leonora townsite.
- Continuing funding of
 - Loopline Railway
 - Great Eastern Highway passing lanes
 - Kalgoorlie Boulder High School
 - Goldfields Arts Centre

Ms Duncan said that one item she has not been able to find in the Budget so far is the \$11m required to match the Federal government's commitment to Outback Way.

Goldmines and Memories By Rod Baker



Rod Baker was born in Kalgoorlie, and has always had a fascination with Goldfields History. The Father of three is retired and lives in Perth, however he regularly visits the region to 'do a bit of prospecting and visit some of the old ghost towns in the Northern Goldfields'. Here is his Local History contribution for this month.

Harry Spalholtz and Family– Menzies Pioneers

Bernard Henry Martin (Harry) SPALHOLTZ was born in Germany and was living in Queensland before coming to the Gold rushes of Western Australia. He was a pioneer of Menzies having commenced a partnership with a Frank Walton in the first general store in 1894

soon after the discovery of gold by L.R. Menzies. He had married Matilda ROOKE in Perth in 1894 she was 35 and he 46 years of age. Their first child was born Andrew Bernard Rooke (Andy) SPALHOLTZ on the 7 may 1895 at the Star and Garter Hotel, Goderich St, Perth. Andy died in 1898 and is buried in the Spalholtz plot in the Menzies Cemetery. Their second child Henry Alexander (Alick) was born in Guildford in 1897.

Around 1898 a layout for businesses and residences were planned for a township of Woolgar 7km South of Menzies. The town was later renamed Yunnadga because there was already a town named Woolgar in Queensland, and was gazetted in 1904. Harry took up a lot in Yunnadga and erected a shop with a residence at the rear and dissolved the partnership with Frank Walton and he and Matilda ran a general store/post office. Harry was also heavily involved in prospecting and mining in the district and held leases at Mt Ida, Davyhurst, Menzies and Yunnadga (Woolgar). 1900 saw the birth of their third child Francis John (Jack). In 1907 the Spalholtz's were granted a gallon license (could only sell the equivalent of 1 gallon of liquor in any one transaction) which they ran in conjunction with the store. From 1910 Harry's health deteriorated and Matilda ran the store and ultimately Alick joined as a shop assistant followed by Jack. The family were great sponsors of sporting clubs in Yunnadga, especially the Rifle Club and gave generous donations to charitable organisations.

Alick enlisted for WWI in Menzies on 16 May 1916 aged 19 years and 4 months. His medical was conducted in June at Kalgoorlie, which he passed and soon embarked for Europe. He was promoted to acting Sergeant on 27 September 1917 and was killed in action in Belgium 4 October 1917 where he is buried. His details are listed on the obelisk in the Menzies Cemetery. Harry Spalholtz died in Yunnadga on 30 June 1918 and was buried in Menzies. Matilda and son Jack continued to run the store until 1926 with the district in steep decline they closed the business. Jack married in Kalgoorlie in 1926 and departed for the small

wheatbelt town of Gabbin where he started a general store and later became the local rural agent. Matilda joined Jack at Gabbin and continued to help in the store until she died at Wyalkatchem hospital 5 August 1943, and is buried at Wyalkatchem. Jack died in Perth 30 October 1965 having spent 26 years in Yunnadga and 39 years in Gabbin.



STROKES AND SIGNS

Reading the **Warning Signs** of a Stroke

Strokes happen when the blood supply to the brain is suddenly interrupted. They can happen to anyone and knowing your stroke risk is important, as 1 in 6 people will have a stroke.

Stroke risk factors you cannot control are age, gender and a family history of stroke. As you age, your risk increases. Men are also more prone to having a stroke than women and the incidence of family members having had strokes increases the chance you may be susceptible to having one.

Medical risk factors which increase the likelihood are

- Transient Ischaemic Attack (TIA)
- Atrial Fibrillation (Irregular Pulse)
- Diabetes
- Fibromuscular Dysplasia (FMD)

Lifestyle risk factors are those that you can control. These include;

- High Blood Pressure
- High Cholesterol
- Smoking
- Being Obese or Overweight
- Poor Diet and Lack of Exercise
- Drinking too much Alcohol.

So what are the **Warning Signs** of a **Stroke**?

The Stroke Foundation recommends using the F.A.S.T. test.

FACE Check their Face to see if their mouth has drooped.

ARMS Can they lift both arms?

SPEECH Is their speech slurred? Do they understand you?

TIME is Critical. If you see any of these signs

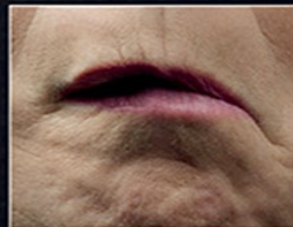

Prospecting popularity prompts safety message to carry personal locator beacons

The Department of Mines and Petroleum (DMP) has launched its annual Seven Golden Rules for Prospecting campaign to highlight safe and sustainable practices.

Mineral Titles Executive Director Dr Ivor Roberts said the department had issued more than 17,000 Miner's Rights for prospecting in Western Australia in the past five years.

"A Miner's Right is the most common prospecting permit used by tourists visiting Western Australia and allows holders to prospect on Crown Land with hand-held tools, such as a metal detector, and to take and keep samples or specimens up to 20 kilograms.

"That is an incredible number and is indicative of gold prospecting's continued popularity in this State," Dr Roberts said.

Dr Roberts said safety should always be a prospector's number one priority.

"Western Australia's outback can be a harsh, remote environment, which is why personal safety is such an important consideration when prospecting in this State," he said.

"This is why we encourage everyone to carry Personal Locator Beacons (PLBs) when prospecting in remote areas."

The device, which can be purchased from most outdoor stores, is ideal for use in remote areas as it does not rely on telecommunication networks to submit a signal.

PLBs are the best way of avoiding the sometimes tragic results of getting lost in the Goldfields and the outback.

The **Seven Golden Rules** campaign will see DMP offices, tourist bureaus, libraries and caravan parks targeted with posters, brochures and booklets.

The **Seven Golden Rules** for prospecting are:

1. Put safety first – Your safety is your responsibility
2. Obtain a Miner's Right permit- when prospecting on Crown land
3. Obtain a 40E permit – prior to prospecting on an exploration tenement
4. Get written permission – if you want to prospect on someone else's mining tenement
5. Comply with all legal requirements – when prospecting on a pastoral lease
6. Show respect when on Crown land – because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes
7. Fill any holes – repair any ground disturbances that you make

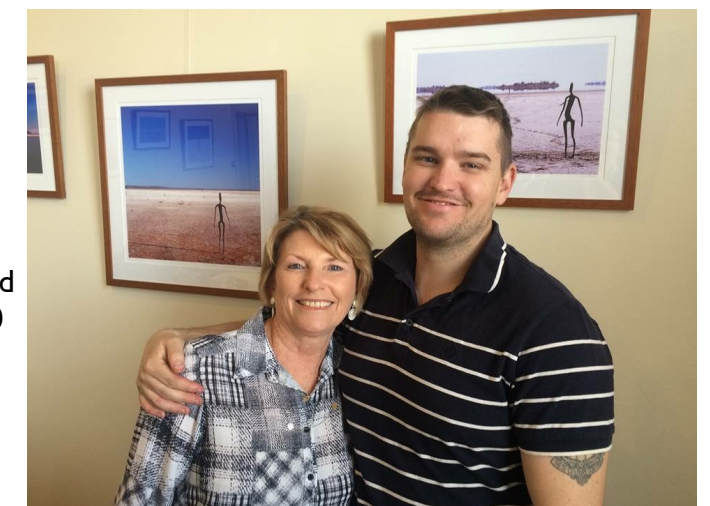
AUSTRALIA'S BIGGEST MORNING TEA 2016

Census recruiting in your community!

Up to 2,300 Census Field Officers needed across Western Australia

Make a difference in your community and join Australia's largest logistical peacetime operation—the 2016 Census of Population and Housing.

This year's Census is on August 9, and the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) is looking for dedicated, enthusiastic self-starters to fill more than 2,300 Field Officer positions across Western Australia. If you're tech-savvy, know your community well and are eager to make a difference, the ABS wants to hear from you.

Working on the Census is a great way to contribute to your community. The data you help collect provides an important statistical snapshot of Australia. It supports planning, policy and funding decisions for a range of local services and infrastructure—from housing and transport to health and education.

A few things have changed since the last Census. In 2016, most households will receive a letter giving them a unique login number and instructions on how to complete the Census online. Approximately 65 per cent of households are expected to complete the Census online however paper forms will still be available for households who need them.

Field Officers play a critical role by visiting households, encouraging online participation and ensuring everyone makes the count. And as a Field Officer, you'll earn around \$21 per hour, receive motor vehicle allowances and enjoy flexible working hours. You will also be responsible for daily administrative tasks and the security of Census materials.

You'll need to be a good communicator, reasonably fit, licensed to drive and willing to travel and work independently. Field Officers will also need to have access to home computer and internet.

The positions are part-time and most of the work will be conducted during August and September. People from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
