## Antony Gormley, a fascinating artist

Antony Gormley was born in London in 1950, the youngest of seven children, to a German mother and devout Irish Catholic father who happened to be an art lover.

In 1968, he went to Trinity College, Cambridge, to read archaeology, anthropology and the history of art.

Not long after graduating in 1971 he travelled to India to study meditation and Buddhism. He returned to the UK and studied at the Central School of Art and Goldsmiths Collage, before completing his studies in 1979 with a postgraduate course in sculpture at the Slade School of Fine Art.

Antony's breakthrough came with *Field* which has toured America, Europe and Asia. In 1993, Tate Liverpool showed *Field for the British Isles* made with the help of people aged from 7 to 70 in St Helens, Merseyside. This amazing work comprises 40,000 miniature terracotta figures.


He adopted this collaborative approach in other works; *Allotment* in Malmo in 1996, *Domain Field* at the Baltic Centre for Contemporary Art, *Gateshead* in 2003 and *Inside Australia at Menzies*, Western Australia, also in 2003.

Many residents of Menzies including myself had their bodies scanned in Menzies and these scans were used as the basis for making forms which allow attitudes and emotion embedded in posture to be revealed.

They are very interesting because all the bodies have different shapes and sizes and their texture is fantastic to feel.

I would recommend you go and have a look at them as they are really worth the drive.

#### **REMPAH**

Rempahs are a kind of Eastern hamburger with Indian spices. They may be eaten as a snack or served with rice.

#### Ingredients

250g mince
100 g desiccated coconut
1 clove garlic crushed
half teaspoon ground coriander
good pinch ground cumin
1 beaten egg
25g cornflour
Oil for frying

- Soak the coconut in 4 tablespoons boiling water
- Mix the meat, squeezed coconut and spices with beaten egg until the mixture sticks together
- 3) Divide into 12 and shape into small burgers
- Dip each burger in cornflour, shake off the excess, then either fry or grill for 5 minutes each side. Serve hot.

# Ceramics @ Menzies Remote Community School

Last week Mrs Marie Foster visited the school to run a four day ceramics course for the students. She primarily worked with the secondary students who had to build a sculpture for their latest unit of visual art.

The secondary students visited Lake Ballard earlier in the term to look at Antony Gormleys statues, then they researched some of his other works. The students then drew some designs for their own sculptures and Marie came up to teach them how to form clay, methods of slab work, draping, throwing clay and how to build using clay pinch and coil methods.

The students also were taught about some of the kilns features and how a kiln works. Each of the students sculptures look quite impressive and after they have been fired, the pieces will be glazed or have iron oxide on them.











The primary students learnt how to make pinch pots, how to join clay, roll it, form it and coil methods. They each enjoyed making a variety of animals, some of which they will be able to take home and some will be kept for sale at our school market day which will be held in term 4.











During term 3 Marie will be returning and will run two afternoon workshops with adults who are interested.

### Matters arising from the Ordinary Meeting of Council, held Thursday, 19th June 2008.

### 1. Annual Budget Deliberations.

Council has conducted its annual budget preparation meeting in readiness for adoption scheduled for 17/7/08 and a range of exciting plans are mooted for the 2008/09 year. A listing of the major issues planned is as follows:

a) Capacity Building Officer Tjuntjuntjara	\$146,000
b) Water Harvesting Programme	\$137,000
c) Various Local Road restorations	\$2,212,676
d) Preparation for the Main St. Upgrade	\$20,000
e) Plant Purchases	\$335,500
f) Lake Ballard Development	\$210,000
g) Niagara Dam Project	\$40,000
h) Lady Shenton Upgrade	\$150,000
i) Tea rooms/ Butcher Shop Restoration	\$130,000
j) Caravan Park Upgrade	\$1,100,000
k) Public Toilet at the Truck bay	\$100,000
Information Bay at Kookynie	\$50,000
m) Kookynie Walk Trail	\$60,000
Sub total	\$4,691,176

### 2. Current Projects.

Furthermore a range of projects are in various stages of completion and these were not completed by 30/6/08 as hoped due to largely the difficulties co-ordinating the trades people and contractors being pressured with other contracts.

#### a. Playing Courts re-surfacing.

The town playing courts were re-surfaced as planned and Grant funding from the Department of Sport and Recreation was a significant contributor to this project.

#### b. Shire Residence.

This significant project also remains partially completed at 30/6/08 and it is expected that conclusion in readiness for the Works Manager and will occur promptly into the new financial year.

### c. Caravan Park Upgrade.

Whilst this major development has commenced, this is an enormous project and one which has consumed a deal of council time and energy, but will be a significant improvement to the town infrastructure upon completion. The majority of this work will be carried out in the 2008/09 year where council budgets \$1,100,000.

#### d. Accommodation Units.

Staff accommodation units are being progressively developed and this will also be a great asset for the town and the Shire to see completed and utilized.

### e. Kookynie Walk Trail.

This project is in the design stage and it is expected that the work will be underway shortly and will further enhance the development concept and quality of life for the Kookynie community.

### 3. Lake Ballard Project.

This project with huge potential for the growth and development for Menzies progresses along nicely with the Management plan to be drawn to a conclusion by 31/7/08 and this will be the catalyst for future development issues and we can look to great aspects of this project aiding and abetting business development well into the future.

### 4. "Special Series Menzies Motor Vehicle Plates"

Advices received from the Department of Planning and Infrastructure confirm the price of the Menzies special series plates will increase on July 1st, 2008 to \$135 each set and enquires to order these plates may be made at the administration centre.

### 5. Post Office

Council for the Shire of Menzies assumed control of the Postal Service from July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2008 and operates this service from the Lady Shenton premises and this was an innovative move by Council to ensure the service remained in town.

### 6. Appointment of C.E.O.

Mr. B.W. Seale was appointed to the role of Chief Executive Officer for the Shire on 28/6/08 with effective ratification to take place on 17/7/08. Accordingly this is an exciting time of change and for growth for Menzies and we look for a term of united efforts working cooperatively with council towards achievement of the corporate goals and planning well into the future the projects that will sustain and enhance the Quality of Life for the community of Menzies

### 7. Motor Vehicle Accident – Gary Miller.

An unfortunate accident in June dampened spirits in Menzies for a time with the motor vehicle accident involving Gary Miller who rolled his tuck and was seriously injured in this process. We are given to understand that Gary is on the mend and likely to be released from hospital shortly.
