

THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

6 August 2018

Ordinary Meeting of Council (July Meeting), Budget for 2018/2019 was not approved at this meeting, it was decided to go through to another workshop prior to the calling of a Special Meeting.

8 August 2018

Cr Jill Dwyer, Chief Executive Officer Rhonda Evans and I attended the Cashless Debit Card Working Group, in Leonora, convened by Alan Hughes (Department of Social Services), for an update.

9 August 2018

The Chief Executive Officer Rhonda Evans, Cr Jill Dwyer and I met with ARDEA Resources for a briefing about the Goongarrie Nickel Cobalt Project. It was pleasing to hear that ARDEA would be utilizing local employment, contractors and housing.

11 August 2018

Attended a small ceremony to dedicate a plaque to Allan Henderson in recognition of his Voluntary services to the Shire of Menzies. The plaque was affixed to the bench outside the CRC, Visitor Centre and Post Office. Cr Jill Dwyer and I then traversed the road to Lake Ballard and inspected the roadworks, in preparation for sealing and then travelled on to inspect the infrastructure at the Inside Australia Site.

16 August 2018

A Budget Workshop was held in the Shire of Menzies Council Chambers. In attendance were Cr Jill Dwyer, Cr Keith Mader, Cr Ian Baird (via Video linkup), Chief Executive Officer Rhonda Evans, Manager of Finance and Administration Jeanette Taylor and myself.

23 August 2018

A Special Meeting of Council passed the 2018/2019 Budget. In attendance were Cr Justin Lee, Cr Jill Dwyer, Cr Keith Mader, Cr Ian Baird (via Video linkup), Chief Executive Officer Rhonda Evans, Manager of Finance and Administration Jeanette Taylor and myself.

This was followed by a briefing by the Shire Environmental Health Officer Dave Hadden on the proposed changes to Plumbing Regulations. The Acting Chief Executive Officer and a new Board Member of the Goldfields Esperance Development Commission briefed the Council on future directions the GEDC propose to take.

24 August 2018

Cr Jill Dwyer and I attended the Menzies Community School for the opening of the 1997 Time Capsule. Lunch was provided and we witnessed the burial of a New Time Capsule to be uncovered at a date to be decided on. It was pleasing to see the former 1997 Principal Richard Ewan in attendance along with former staff and students, some who are parents of current students.

The date for Menzies Rodeo is rapidly approaching, I hope every one has the 20 October marked on their diary, and will be able to attend. Many of our local businesses have sponsored this event. Their logos will appear around the arena on the day. Thank you for your support.

The warmer weather will hit us soon. Please remember that fire restrictions will commence on 19 September. A notice detailing the restrictions is in this edition of Menzies Matters. The lack of rainfall this year has left the land very dry. Please look after yourselves, your neighbours and the country by careful management of fires.

SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR **PROSPECTING**

Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- and supplies. Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) it may turn out to be your most important safety device.
- Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office)
- Obtain a 40E permit prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).
- Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on:
 - a mining lease
 - an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
 - a prospecting licence
- Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.
- Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.
- Fill any holes you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.





HOW TO PROTECT AGAINST

* FIGHT the BITI

Prevent mosquito bites





COVER UP

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bit through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltouluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around vour home or holiday around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from home containers.











1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2018/2019

Restricted Burning Periods 1: 19 September 2018 to 31 October 2018 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2018.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2018.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period: From 1 November 2018 to 15 March 2019 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period. Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

Restricted Burning Periods 2: From 16 March 2019 to 30 April 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened. You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

the reporter within
72 hours

Coordinate

CCA coordinates a response via local service providers where possible, calling upon members of the VSU Working Group as needed

raised their two sons. One son now lives in Townsville and the other son lives in Launceston. Margaret has five grandchildren and four step-grandchildren.




Margaret later divorced and began to travel extensively throughout Australia. She eventually arrived in Kalgoorlie where she worked in several different businesses. Marg worked at the Victoria Café and also did different cooking jobs. She cooked at the Agricola College for almost four years. Margaret also managed a small hotel called Surrey House which is now a back-packers. The owners of Surrey House also owned the Grand

Hotel Kookynie.

Margaret moved to Kookynie and managed the Grand Hotel for six months after which time she then leased it for a further two years. It was here she met and married Kevin Pusey. Their wedding featured in Post Magazine in 1990. Kevin and Margaret renovated six shops in Cumberland Street and turned them into a home. One end housed a museum and at the other end a pottery and art studio for Margaret. The couple lived there for eight years. She became heavily involved in the Kookynie Community after moving there and this continues to this day.





Margaret is a published author of a compilation of people's memories and was featured in the book '100 Women of the Eastern Goldfields', and also is an accomplished artist and potter.

When the Grand Hotel Kookynie came back on the market Margaret swore she'd never go back to the hotel to work fifteen-hour days. After eighteen years Margaret and Kevin are still there today.

Margaret is a living legend of the Northern Goldfields and has hundreds of stories to share. She is also quick to come out with a little ditty on occasion. One she recently shared is

'For every old person that dies a library burns down'.

Margaret Pusey loves nothing better than to have a chat with friends, share a glass of red wine and a chat. No-one is a stranger to Margaret. She is a beacon of welcoming light and friendliness in the goldfields and is definitely worthy of the title 'Local Hero'.

Menzies Aboriginal Corporation

In 2017 Menzies Aboriginal Corporation applied for a Lotterywest grant for a Skid Steer Loader and a Toyota Hiace 12 Seater bus. In May 2018 we received official notice that our application was successful in gaining part payments for both machine and Bus, Menzies Aboriginal Corporation also contributed to the purchases.

The 12 Seater Hiace Bus purchased at Midland Toyota will be used to safely transport children to sporting events and for school excursions. It will also be used in the community for Elders and Adults to transport them to cultural and sporting events in the Goldfields. The bus is well equipped and has the added feature of individual seatbelts for all 12 passengers.



The Skid Steer Loader was purchased at Clarkes Equipment in Perth. A representative was in Menzies on Tuesday the 21st August to handover the new machine to our staff members. The skid steer loader is a welcomed addition to MACs fleet and in the coming months with Riklan Training Services Kalgoorlie we hope to have several members gain their operators ticket, before some work can be done.





TJUNTJUNTJARA NEWS

The Tjuntjuntjara band the Desert Stars and a band from NSW the Re-Mains are doing a desert tour in September from Tjuntjuntjara up to Broome and back down to Kalgoorlie. After a warm up show in Tjuntjuntjara on Thursday 6th Sept. they do the first gig of the tour in Warburton on Saturday September 8 and follow the schedule on the poster. There are 9 musicians, a free-lance journo who sometimes contributes to the Sydney Morning Herald and Rolling Stone and a film maker who has produced a couple of music videos for the Desert Stars. They are travelling in a Isuzu 4WD bus and troopy leased from PTAC, Tjuntjuntjara Community. The community concerts will be free. The tour is mainly being underwritten by the Menzies Shire.

The resident Tjuntjuntjara desert rock band, the Desert Stars, recorded a second album of 11 original songs at the Ngaanyatjarra Media Centre in June 2016. The band engaged an experienced producer/sound engineer, Leigh Ivin, from Tamworth who produced the CD and mixed and mastered it in his studio near Tamworth.

The band have engaged a distributor, Sugarrush, in Brisbane who are promoting the band digitally and organized the production of 400 CDs for distribution to promote the band's music. In 20187/18 the Desert Stars engaged a filmmaker (Tristan Pemberton – Flywire Films) to come out to the Goldfields to make promotional videos of the band around a performance in the Menzies Town hall.

2018/19 is shaping to be a huge year for the Desert Stars. In September the band is joining with a Country Rock band called the Remains to undertake a 3-4 week tour in central and northern WA. The Re-Mains are an experienced outfit from NSW who have toured Europe and Canada as well as the major cities and regional centres in Australia. Leigh Ivin from The Re-Mains produced the Desert Stars second album and Mick Daley from the band (also a music journalist) visited Tjuntjuntjara with a photo-journalist and subsequently wrote an article about the Desert Stars which appeared in the Sydney Morning Herald Sunday edition as a feature article. The Re-Mains believe in the Desert Stars and their music and will take on a mentoring role during the tour and assist the Desert Stars to develop their stage and touring craft.

The tour starts in Tjuntjuntjara and travels to Warburton, Mutitjulu, Yeundemu, Balgo, and on to Broome. On the way back the tour takes in Marble Bar, Roebourne, Whim Creek, Wiluna and Leonora. The bands will finish off the tour with a performance at the Boulder Town Hall at the end of September. The tour schedule has a mixture of paying and non-paying performances so the Desert Stars support from Menzies Shire is most welcome to meet the cost of mounting the tour. The Remains are prepared to give their time and performances voluntarily if their expenses are covered. Paupiyala Tjautja Aboriginal Corporation (PTAC) has leased a 20 seater 4WD bus and Landcuiser Troopy to the bands for the trip.

An Eastern Seaboard tour by the Re-Mains and the Desert Stars is proposed for 2019 to build on the momentum of the WA Tour. Funding will be sought from the Australia Council for the Arts and Country Arts WA.









