## SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

Put safety first
Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies. Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

**Obtain a Miner's Right permit** when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office)



Obtain a 40E permit prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on: a mining lease

an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit) a prospecting licence

**Comply with all legal requirements** when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

**Fill any holes** you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

## ★ FIGHT the BITE ★ Prevent mosquito bites ★ COVER UP. REPEL. CLEAN UP.

MOSQUITO



#### COVER UP Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bit through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



#### REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltouluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



#### **CLEAN UP**

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period. Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

## **Restricted Burning Periods 2:**

## From 16 March 2019 to 30 April 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning. Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

## TJUNTJUNTJARA'S COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTRE

## **GETS A WELCOME UPGRADE!**

Paupiyala Tjarutja Aboriginal Corporation (PTAC) has all but completed a major upgrade of its Community Resource Centre (CRC) in Tjuntjuntjara.



The building works were completed by DBuild & Co. and are part of our new CRC business model that will improve access to the CRC's services and amenities.

The new facility collocates additional services in the new building, including the community's Community Development Program (CDP Work for the Dole and Job Services) and training room. With more indoor and outdoor space, the upgraded building will create a community hub that will link CDP job services, Centrelink hosted services and create areas that can be utilised during agency visits and functions. We will be able to host interagency meetings for example. Along with a planned upgrade of community WiFi and online access the activity space, additional offices, a meeting & training room, staff and public toilets, large undercover area on the decks, the CRC is looking good.

A major benefit and highlight of the project is the partnership developing with DBuild & Co. who have demonstrated the value of engaging with CDP and the local workforce to get the job done. With DBuild's support, there is even potential for the development of an Indigenous manufacturing enterprise in Tjuntjuntjara that would produce Structural Insulated panels (SIP) for the construction industry. The unique building technologies utilised in constructing the CRC highlight the ease and simplicity of DBuild's process, with the use of components that are ideally suited to remote Indigenous communities like Tjuntjuntjara.

Being connected to existing services the building uses less power and water on a unit cost basis by implementing energy efficient Gas Hot Water systems, LED lighting. Passive thermal design in the building and by reducing electricity and water use in the community office where our CDP program is currently located. Collocation makes good sense if we are going to reduce overheads.

As a long term strategy the community is working to secure funding for a solar system for its HACC Centre as well which will reduce the impact on the community's diesel power station. Our hope is that State and Commonwealth agencies will support sensible and integrated solutions to introduce clean and cost effective solar capacity in Tjuntjuntjara rather than relying on diesel as the only fuel source for our remote power station.



Funded by Lottery West and the Australian Government (PM&C), with support from the community CDP program, the CRC project in Tjuntjuntjara is a great success! PTAC expects the new building to be ready for use early in November after the AGM and is planning an official opening around March 2019!

## COCHINEAL ARRIVES IN SHIRE OF MENZIES TO ASSIST IN ERADICATION OF HUDSON PEAR

The Shire of Menzies recently received a visit from Michelle Donaldson who works for the Goldfields Nullarbor Rangelands Biosecurity Association (GNRBA) and she presented the Shire of Menzies with a delivery of Cochineal to help eradicate the Hudson Pear within the Shire.

Biological control of the pear has been one of Australia's success stories when it comes to weed control. And, biological control continues to play a very significant role in controlling various pear species in Australia, particularly in the drier, warmer areas.

One of the most important biological control agents is Cochineal. Cochineal insects (*Dactylopius* spp.) attach to the outside of the host plant and (a bit like the way a mosquito works on people) draw the

food and moisture out of the plant:

There are four main species of cochineal insects (and one mealy bug) of importance in the biological control of the main prickly pear (cactus) species found in Australia. The four species of cochineal insects look the same, but they're not. And, very importantly, they will only survive on their own, specific host plant!

#### DESCRIPTION OF COCHINEAL INSECTS

The adult female cochineal is a soft, shapeless sack hidden beneath a white, silky covering. The female grows to about the size of a "match head". Once the female attaches itself to the plant, it sheds its "legs" and cannot leave. The male is a small two-winged insect with mobility to visit the females



## THE INDIGENOUS LITERACY FOUNDATION

Seven students from communities in Western Australia and from the Northern Territory were picked to go to Sydney for the Pamela Lofts Mentor Program managed by the Indigenous Literacy Foundation. This is the inaugural program that was held Monday 22 October to Friday 26 October.


