Greetings to everyone,

As we rapidly the Christmas season, and the New Year, I thank you all for your contribution to Menzies and our wonderful life style. It has been a joy to have shared that past year.

On Thursday 13 December I invite every one to join together share the fellowship of our community, first at the oval, where we will have the annual Children's

SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

Put safety first
Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies. Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office)



Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on: a mining lease an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)

a prospecting licence

Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

Fill any holes you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

MOSQUITO



COVER UP Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bit through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.

REPEL



Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltouluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.



1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2018/2019

Restricted Burning Periods 1: 19 September 2018 to 31 October 2018 *(inclusive)*

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning. Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2018. Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2018.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period: From 1 November 2018 to 15 March 2019 *(inclusive)*

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period. Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

Restricted Burning Periods 2:

From 16 March 2019 to 30 April 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning. Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened. You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

Unrestricted Season:

From 1 May 2019 to 18 September 2019 (inclusive)

TJUNTJUNTJARA NEWS

School Holiday Program Photographic Report

2017-18

Menzies Shire has been supporting the Tjuntjuntjara School Holiday program for 8 weeks per year to coincide with each school holiday program period. This allows trained Sport & Recreation officers to spend 2 weeks each school holiday period running activities to engage the kids in sport and recreation.

Some of the activities include bike riding, bush camps, art, crafts, games, sport, picnics, discos and movie nights to ensure that boredom is not prevalent leading to vandalism and anti-social behaviour. Over the last 7 years, Tjuntjuntjara has seen a marked reduction in the amount of vandalism and property damage in the community. Further, the kids are engaged and developing new skills and have now have access to a service that is routinely provided in regional and urban centres.

Unfortunately, in June 2018, our Youth Worker program came to an end resulting in a gap in ongoing services throughout the year for young people. This has coincided with the major capital works program in Tjuntjuntjara which has caused regular and significant disruptions to community life leading to a spike in anti-social behaviour such as property damage, vandalism and sniffing amongst young people. More than ever, the School Holiday Program has become a critical component of the community services to engage kids and young people and to provide activities as part of a diversionary strategy to minimise vandalism and anti-social behaviour.

Over the last year we have had floods which provided a whole new opportunity for kids to engage in water play in a lake (see photo below). We are not quite sure where the boat came from but it was well used. There has been a range of other activities including hair dying, cooking, face painting, party games, sports on the saltlake, cycling, running, bush trips, painting, movie nights in the hall, disco's and rage cage games.

HISTORY SNIPPET

The missing headstone of Cons Lionel Bradley P.C. (Pilkington)

Somewhere between 1871 and 1891 Lionel travelled to Australia while serving in the British Army.

In 1891 he was living in Lygong St Ballarat Victoria and Agnes was living in Nelson St Ballarat Victoria. Lionel married Agnes in Fitzroy Victoria 1891. Agnes had lost a 5 month old boy the same year it is not known if it was Lionel's. Lionel and Agnes only had one child a girl Ida born 22 May 1892. Lionel left his wife and daughter in 1895 in the care of his mother-in-law at Queenscliffe Victoria.

In the midst of the depression in the 1890's. Lionel joined the Western Australian Police Force on 1 January 1895 and was transferred to Menzies in the August of the same year using the name of Lionel Bradley it is unknown why he dropped his surname (Pilkington) and preferring to use his middle name Bradley as his surname.

To add to the confusion the police records have him dying at the age of 34 in 1895, but in the 1861 English census show him as a 5 year old with a date of birth of 1856. Also on the police records he gave his wife's name as Agnes McMillen and that he was born in Yorkshire England but on his daughter Ida's birth certificate he gave that he was born in Doncaster England. However Lionel Bradley Pilkington was born in Ireland around 1866. Lionel's father was born into a prestigious English family. His grandfather Henry Pilkington Esq. pf Park Lane was a Barrister at Law and his father Henry Foster Pilkington Esq was Capt of the 21st Riding of the Yorkshire Rifle Volunteers (1860). His father married Maria Dunsford (born Guignard) widow of Harris Dunsford MD and live in Ireland were all of the children were born Lionel being the third son.

Lionel died of Typhoid fever on 27 April 1865 and buried in the Menzies cemetery.

There is no trace at all of Lionel's headstone. The Police Historical Soc have place a plaque at cemetery's entrance.






