THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Friday 28 June

With the CEO attended the GVROC Meeting in Kalgoorlie, also in attendance was the CEO of WALGA Nick Sloan. Items of main interest included the pending sale of the Record and Archive Facility to a consortium comprised of the City of Kalgoorlie – Boulder and Shires of Coolgardie, Dundas and Leonora, with equity payments to be made those Shires who are not in the consortium.

With Cr Dwyer we attended a Special General Meeting of GTNA at 1.45pm at which the Constitution was approved for lodgment, followed by a discussion on how the new organisation may operate. Options of operating models will be purchased to Council for approval.

Friday 05 July

I attended a Workshop at Leonora, for the ongoing Future Management and Control of Feral Camels in the Goldfields – Nullabor Region. Of particular and relevant importance was the briefing from Tim and Jack Carmody from Prenti Downs, who have culled over 4,000 camels this year and their outlook for camel harvesting. Nagdalene Zabek from DPIRD presentation of her research into Large Feral Herbivores will be very useful for any strategy going forward.

Thursday 18 July

Attended a discussion on the Health Plan Profile by Consultant Llew Withers, with the CEO and EHO Dave Hadden in attendance. This is a precursor to a consultation process leading to a Health Plan for the Menzies Shire. Following on from lunch, with Cr Mader and staff in attendance a budget document was presented for a workshop. Further workshop pending.

Friday 19 July

Cr Dwyer and myself attended the Audit Committee Meeting in Council Chambers from which recommendations will be presented to the following Ordinary Meeting of Council 25 July 2019.

Thursday 23 July

The CEO and I met with some Board members and CEO of Ora Banda Mining for an overview of where the new company is going with the tenements previously held by Eastern Goldfields, Swan Gold and Monarch that have been long term ratepayers in the Shire of Menzies.

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

ADMINISTRATION

The Council is close to finalising its budget for 2019/2020 and has agreed to a 1.8 % increase which is about the CPI increase. Many of the increases that push up local government rates are the cost of additional consultation services due to State Government cost shifting, the increasing compliance and reporting requirements. Additional increases come from the rising cost water and electricity – increases due to State Government policies.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

There is information coming out regarding the 2019 October Council election. We will be posting information in the Menzies Matters but as this is a monthly document the best place to look for updated information is on the Shire website and Facebook. These sites will be updated as more is known of the Regulations that are changing this year.

FUEL SUPPLIES

The supply of fuel in Menzies from Eagle Petroleum has ceased and though not yet confirmed, I believe this is permanent. The President and CEO had a brief meeting with the owner who has advised that he has been contacted by a few parties interested in buying the site. Unfortunately we have no further information on the likely future of the site.

HEALTH MATTERS

The State Government has introduced a new Health Act which has some significant effects for local governments and our communities. Numerous matters that are/ have been the responsibility are being imposed on local governments (no new funding of course) which will result in changes on how health is delivered. Much of this is unclear as yet but we are in the processing of developing a Menzies Shire Health Plan. I will provide more information to the community as it comes to hand.

ROADS TO TJUNTJUNJARA

The Shire President, Deputy President and CEO have met with the Minister for Transport and main roads WA officials in Kalgoorlie to seek resolutions for the access into the community. The talks were positive and a Working group is to be formed to resolve funding issues for the proposed road improvements.

Pensioner Free Travel

1. I have a Pensioner Concession Card from the Department of Human Services (DHS) / Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

- 2. I have a Gold Health Care Card from Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

 Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).
- 3. How do I register for Pensioner Free Travel and get my concession validated?

 Complete the <u>online registration form</u> and attach images of both sides of your concession card(s).

 Alternatively download and print the registration form (PDF), complete and send to Transwa with photocopies of both sides of your card.
- 4. What do I do if I have a digital wallet instead of a concession card?

A digital wallet allows you to have your concession and health card with you everywhere you take your smart device. Transwa accept either the physical card or your digital wallet as evidence of your valid concession. When registering we ask for a photocopy or scan of your card. You can also screenshot your digital wallet and send us the image with your online registration form.

- 5. Why do I need to give Transwa consent to access my concession records held by Centrelink?

 We need you consent to enable the Australia Government Department of Human Services (Centrelink) to confirm the concession details you provide to the Public Transport Authority of WA (Transwa) when you register with us. The consent you give remains valid with Transwa unless you withdraw your content by contacting us.
- 6. How do I book my pensioner free travel?

There are a number of ways to book your pensioner free travel with Transwa once you have registered. Have your concession card/digital wallet handy and:

- Call us on 1300662205
- Visit us at one of out Transwa Booking Centre's or visit one of our accredited agents
- Book online (available from late 2019)
- 7. What do I do if my travel plans change?

We know plans often change. To cancel or re-schedule your trip, call us on 1300 662 205 prior to the scheduled departure of the first leg of your journey and we will re-book or arrange for your Pensioner Free Travel entitlement to be reinstated.

- 8. Can I still use my WA Free Trip Vouchers from Centrelink or DVA if I have not registered with Transwa? From 2020 you must be registered to Transwa to receive Pensioner Free Travel on Transwa services. Transwa will calculate your travel entitlement each calendar year and you will not need to provide a paper yourcher.
- 9. Can I still receive a concession fare after I have used my free travel entitlements?
 In addition to Pensioner Free Travel, WA Pensioner Concession cardholders and WA Gold Health cardholders can claim a 50% concession on all Transwa services.
- 10. Am I entitled to other travel entitlements if I live in the North of Western Australia?
 If you live North of the 26th parallel in Western Australia and hold a Pensioner Concession Card or DVA Gold Health Card you may be entitled to other free travel options. Visit the Department of Transport for more details.
- 11. Do I need travel insurance?





SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR **PROSPECTING**

Put safety first

Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.

Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)

— it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

Obtain a 40E permit prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit) a prospecting licence

Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

Fill any holes that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.





IOW TO PROTECT AGAINST

* FGHT the BITE

Prevent mosquito bites





COVER UP

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bit through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltouluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.











1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2018/2019

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period: From 1 November 2018 to 15 March 2019 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period. Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

Restricted Burning Periods 2: From 16 March 2019 to 30 April 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened.

You must check the press for details
or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

Unrestricted Season: From 1 May 2019 to 18 September 2019 (inclusive)

Restricted Burning Periods 1: 19 September 2019 to 31 October 2019 (inclusive)


Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

A Brief History Of Menzies

Sir George Shenton and Menzie stumbled upon a rich alluvial deposit while going to far to the west past their camp looking for water. On the 1 October 1894 when the claim was registered Lease no.1380 in the name of LR Menzie and Sir George Shenton. These became the names of The Lady Shenton mine and the place named Menzies. The news of a strike this big spread rapidly and soon the area was crowded with prospectors hoping for similar luck. Water was carted to the town from surrounding lakes and underground supplies then the Government built a dam 1897 and in 1901 this supplied water to the town; The railway line between Kalgoorlie and Menzies opened on the 22 March, 1898, At its height Menzies boasted 13 hotels, 3 banks its own breweries and cordial factories, a Post Office with 25 staff, a school with 205 pupils. A public library (In 1904) and 4 churches.



Do you have citrus gall wasp?



Citrus gall wasp (Bruchophagus fellis) is a pest of citrus and a threat to the citrus industry in Western Australia. It damages citrus by producing galls that can weaken trees, making them unproductive. Heavy infestations can reduce grop yield and cause branch dieback.

Home gardeners are encouraged to act now to stop the spread of this pest.

What to do



Check for galls from April to June.



Prune-out galls by June 30 and place them in the sun to dry out (chop up large galls).




Galls removed after June 30 must be chopped up and solarised (in a plastic bag) in a sunny location for at least four weeks to kill developing larvae.



Work with your neighbours to reduce reinfestation of your tree.

What not to do



Leave galls on the tree.

Throw galls in the rubbish without treatment.

Wasps emerge from galls in September and quickly begin egg laying but new season infestations will not be seen until April.





- 1/2 tablespoons cocoa powder




Method







