

# Friday 2 August

Attended the first workshop of the 2019-2020 Shire of Menzies Budget.

With the CEO, we both attended the GVROC Dinner at Burswood prior to the WALGA Convention.



# **Thursday 8 August**

With the CEO, we attended the Board Meeting of the GVROC Council at the Perth Convention Centre. Of note was a resolution from the Council to form a working party to investigate and lobby for the implementation of taxation incentives and other possible benefits for business and Communities to encourage growth in regional Western Australia.

The CEO and I visited the Exhibition section of the Convention and met with representatives of the Department of Water and Environment with talks regards a Reserve at Dingo Creek that takes in a Government Well located close to the Kookynie – Malcolm Road, Golden Quest Trail, and a possible tourist attraction. Further discussions were had regards to known contaminated sites in Menzies with the Environment Section.

We visited the WALGA Stand to discuss the Preferred Supplier Arrangement and I Quotes and WALGA will be managing a briefing/video conference on both these matters with Council in the near future.

We met with Chris Berry from DLGCA regards to the Roads Asset List and Aboriginal Access funding.

# Friday 9 August

Leaving Perth, we visited Fox Constructions in Gnangara to view their display units in preparation for tendering for units for the Shire Caravan Park.

Attended the second 2019-2020 Shire of Menzies Budget Workshop.

# **Thursday 22 August**


Along with Cr Dwyer and Cr Mader, attended the Briefing Session in Menzies at which the 2017-2018 Annual Report was discussed.

# THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Hello everyone.

### **BUDGET**

The Council has adopted its 2019/2020 Annual Budget with an average rate increase of 1.8% in the dollar. Rate notices will be issued within the next few days and again there will be options to pay by instalments.





There will be upgrades to the Lady Shenton Building; the old Church building, the Goongarrie Cottages and internally to the Shire administration area.

It is also planned to carry out repairs and seal the walls of the Town Dam and upgrade and repair the fencing of the Dam.

Almost \$2 million will be expended on roadworks throughout the Shire much of will be funded by various road grants.

### **FUEL SUPPLIES**

The Shire has had interest in installing a fuel outlet on Lot 500 Shenton Street (next to the hotel) and I am seeking approval from the State Minister for Planning to use the site.

Traditionally it is a lengthy process to acquiring responses from State Government departments and so I have also contacted MLC Kyle McGin and asked him if he is able to expedite the process through the Minister on our behalf.

### **GYMNASIUM**

There has been a complaint made about late night noise in the gymnasium which is disturbing a nearby residence. I ask users to be aware of this if you are using the gym late at night or during the early hours of the morning.

As the complaint has been made, I now must follow through with ensuring the safety standards for an unsupervised gym are met. Once these requirements are identified and reviewed there may need to be some changes as to how the gym operates.

# **ADMINISTRATION**

Amendments to the local government Act are filtering through and will continue for some months. These amendments along with the Government increasing audit compliances through the Auditor General's office have increased substantially the burden of compliance, reporting, and administration of local governments.

As most smaller local governments do not have the resources to comply with much of the new requirements in-house, they either employ external organisations or as in Menzies shire, we are collaborating with other local governments to share these costs and resources.

These matters do not generally affect residents directly, but they do add to the costs and administrative functions of local government.



# \* FIGHT the BITE \*

# Prevent mosquito bites





### **COVER UP**

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bit through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



### REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltouluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



### **CLEAN UP**

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.











# SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR **PROSPECTING**

**Put safety first** 

Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.

Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)

— it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

# Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

### Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit) a prospecting licence

Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

Fill any holes that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

# 1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

WARNING SIGNS ARE PLACED WHERE APPLICABLE, HOWEVER THEY MAY BE DAMAGED, REMOVED, VANDALISED OR DESTROYED

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

# DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2018/2019

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

# Prohibited Burning Period: From 1 November 2018 to 15 March 2019 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period. Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

# Restricted Burning Periods 2: From 16 March 2019 to 30 April 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning. Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened. You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

# Unrestricted Season: From 1 May 2019 to 18 September 2019 (inclusive)

# Restricted Burning Periods 1: 19 September 2019 to 31 October 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2019.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2019.

# **GOONGARRIE**

Originally called 90 MILE or ROARING GIMLET.

The Goongarrie area was first prospected, and was the first important gold find after Coolgardie this was before Hannans was discovered, by Pickersgill, Frost and Cahill in 1893.


The first miners named the area The Roaring Gimlet because of the cold south-westerly winds through the gimlet trees.

During the 1890's when it was at its most prosperous, it was known as the 'Ninety Mile' on account of its estimated distance from Coolgardie.

The Ninety-Mile boasted hotels, bed and breakfasts, a Cobb & Co coach stop, a railway and several shops.

The remaining historic railway house and cottages are left of the old town site located about 40km south of Menzies.

Being located near Lake Goongarrie, the name Goongarrie was chosen for the townsite when it was gazetted in 1895. The meaning of this Aboriginal word is not known.




Menzies has now turned 7 in July and is in year 1 at school. As you will see, his whole life revolves around all the football codes.





