BUDGET 2020/2021:

This month we will be preparing for the 2020/2021 budget which Council wants to adopt by 30 June 2020.

WORKFORCE ACCOMMODATION:

Applications have been received for two (2) workforce accommodation complexes within the Menzies township. Council has given approval that will now enable the developers to apply for planning and building licenses. We will keep you updated on the progress.

TENDERS:

The new accommodation units for the Caravan Park are close to completion and should arrive in the Park in early June.

Council has appointed a contractor for the new ablution building at the Truck Bay. The sand pad preparation has been carried out by the Depot staff under the direction of the Works Supervisor, Paul Warner.

Tenders have closed for the new house to be built and works have commenced off site. The house will arrive in late August.

Also finalised is the tender for the next 5 kilometers of the sealing of the Menzies NW Road which is well underway.

The Tender for the Tjuntjuntjara & Connie Sue Highway has been awarded to Nullarbor Transport. This decision was to reinforce the Government encouraging local governments to employ local contractors where possible. Given that Nullarbor Transport is a Regional supplier and they were submitted the best Tender, it's a bonus when the work can be kept local.

COVID-19 credits paid to business and not-for-profit customers

As the impacts of COVID-19 continue to affect our small and medium business customers, Horizon Power has been working hard to ensure we continue to provide uninterrupted power and support our customers.

This week, a once-off credit of \$2500 was applied to eligible small and medium business electricity accounts, as well as accounts for not-for-profit organisations. This included customers on the mixed business/residential tariff, which are our farming and home business customers.

We are also paying an Energy Assistance Payment boost of an additional \$305.25 per year. This doubles the usual benefit and is available to Centrelink and Veteran's Affairs concession card holders. It unfortunately does not apply to holders of the WA Seniors Card.

We are also offering bill extensions, payment plans of up to 12 months and account suppressions for eligible customers. Please get in touch if you would like to apply for any of these relief measures. Give us a call on 9072 3400 or you can contact our call centre on 1800 267 926 for residential accounts or 1800 737 036 for business accounts.

Our Esperance depot and front counter remain closed to the public and our office staff are still working from home for now. However, we are currently developing a back to work plan for all of our regional offices and hope to be serving customers again in a few weeks' time.

While our front door may still be closed, we are working harder than ever and our maintenance program is in full swing to ensure we operate our network to the highest standard. If the crew attend a fault at your property or are working in your street, please let them do their jobs and observe social distances.

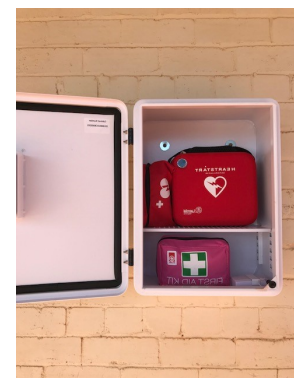


On Thursday 30 April 2020, St John Ambulance officers , Troy Turner (Northern Goldfields Community Paramedic) and Debbie Pianto (Menzies Ambulance Volunteer) presented to Greg Dwyer (President) and Peter Money (CEO) of the Shire of Menzies a defibrillator which will be place in a box on the outside of the Lady Shenton Building. Another will be place on the outside wall of the Shire building when it is received.

The defibrillators will be there as part of the first responder program.

When we are able to start having community meetings again, Troy and Debbie will do a demonstration with the defibrillator and help anybody wishing to become a First Responder.

Menzies ambulance want to keep the ambulance on the road so why not become a volunteer driver now.





The St John WA Community First Responder program is a free service that aims to get defibrillators to cardiac arrest victims in the vital minutes before an ambulance arrives.

When a person unexpectedly collapses due to a cardiac arrest, bystanders may not know if there is a defibrillator close by. Organisations that are part of the St John Community First Responder program have their defibrillator location and a contact person registered with St John WA. This helps a defibrillator to be retrieved as soon as possible and applied to the patient in the time critical period before an ambulance arrives.

Contrary to popular belief, sudden cardiac arrest can strike any person regardless of age, gender or health status and approximately 33,000 Australians die every year from this condition. The single key contributing factor to improving survival rates of sudden cardiac arrest is the time taken to administer early CPR and defibrillation. Where CPR and defibrillation are administered within five minutes of an event, studies have shown dramatic improvements in survival rates.

How the CFR system works

In the event of a sudden cardiac arrest, the flow of events is:

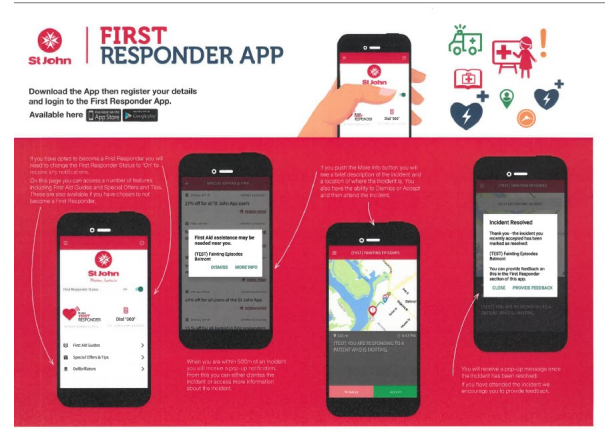
- A person suffers a sudden cardiac arrest
- Bystanders call triple zero (000)
- An ambulance is dispatched
- The first responder is called by the St John Ambulance triple zero (000) call centre and deployed OR the caller is advised where the closest defibrillator is so that it can be retrieved
- The first responder carries out CPR and applies the defibrillator if necessary
- An ambulance arrives and paramedics take over the care of the patient

Benefits of becoming a CFR location

The benefits of adopting the Community First Responder system in your organisation or community include:

- The knowledge that you will be playing a key role in helping to save lives in your local community or workplace.
- Peace of mind that a well-coordinated response plan to medical emergencies is in place.
- Being informed of incidents of cardiac arrest as they are happening.
- A direct communication link between your organisation and St John WA.
- Ongoing support and customer service.
- An easy to implement plan that is already working well in Western Australian communities and organisations.

Help us find you in an emergency

Pinpointing your exact location can become difficult in an emergency situation. The St John First Responder App sends your GPS coordinates to the operator when you call Triple 000 for an ambulance, speeding up the time it takes to confirm your location and dispatch and ambulance.

Over 200,000 Western Australians have downloaded the app which also contains a number of other resources, including:

First aid instruction guides – helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.

Defibrillator (AED) locator - showing all the defibrillator locations near you.

Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations that aren't currently appearing on the app.

Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments - including live ED waiting time information.

Patient transport services information.

Your first aid course information and refresher reminder notices

First aid tips and special offers - keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

Help others in an emergency situation

The St John First Responder app allows qualified first aiders in Western Australia to sign up and become a registered first responder. If a nearby emergency occurs (in a public place within 500 meters), you will be notified and given the opportunity to assist until the ambulance arrives.

To become a first responder you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation. We now offer the ability to become a BASIC level first responder in the app, by uploading your Photo ID.

St John First Responder is a free app and available on [Apple's App Store](#) and [Google Play](#). You can find out more about how to use the app in our [First Aid Responder App Guide](#).

Calling 000

Police, Fire or Ambulance?"

When you are transferred to the correct service you may be asked the following questions:

- What is the address of the emergency? Street, cross reference or landmark will be required.
- What is the telephone number you are calling from? This is in case your call is terminated or further information is required.
- Tell me exactly what has happened? Provide a brief description of the problem.
- How old is s/he? If unknown then approximate age.
- Is s/he awake (conscious)? Yes or no answer required.
- Is s/he breathing? Yes or no answer required.

The Communications Officer will then ask a series of further questions more specific to the problem identified. Answering these questions will ensure the most appropriate ambulance response is provided. The Communications Officer will give you advice over the phone to assist the patient prior to the arrival of an ambulance. They may also ask you to turn on front lights if it is dark; if possible have someone wait out the front; and make sure the door is unlocked and open so the paramedics can enter. Please remember to try and stay calm and speak slowly to the Communications Officer. Often an ambulance will be dispatched while you are still on the phone. If in doubt you should always call triple zero (000). Sadly many people do not call for an ambulance as they are unsure of whether the situation is an emergency or they are concerned about the cost.

By calling triple zero (000), you may save someone's life.

SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

- 1. Put safety first**
 - Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
 - Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.
- 2. Obtain a Miner's Right permit** when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).
- 3. Obtain a 40E permit** prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).
- 4. Get written permission** from the tenement holder when prospecting on:
 - a mining lease
 - an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
 - a prospecting licence
- 5. Comply with all legal requirements** when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.
- 6. Show respect when on Crown land** because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.
- 7. Fill any holes** that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

DID YOU KNOW

1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

WARNING SIGNS ARE PLACED WHERE APPLICABLE, HOWEVER THEY MAY BE DAMAGED, REMOVED, VANDALISED OR DESTROYED

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

1080 is an S7 Poison

DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2019/2020

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period:

From 1 November 2019 to 15 March 2020 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period.

Properties are to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

Restricted Burning Periods 2:

From 16 March 2020 to 30 April 2020 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened.

You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

Unrestricted Season:

From 1 May 2020 to 18 September 2020 (inclusive)

Restricted Burning Periods 1:

19 September 2019 to 31 October 2020 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2019.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2019.

- ✓ **Granted - License for an MRI Machine in Kalgoorlie-Boulder** - Alongside Senator Georgiou we secured the Medicare license for the MRI machine in June 2018 after leading a strong advocacy campaign alongside WA One Nation. Although our town is still waiting for the MRI Machine i reassure you that I will continue to ask the question and update my electorate as to when we can expect it to be operating.
- ✓ **Granted - Funding for Palliative Care** - I accomplished a desired result with obtaining a multi-million-dollar funding injection for Palliative care in regional WA. I was disappointed to hear that the government had again let our people down with in the health department and knew that people deserved to die with dignity.
- ✓ **Blocked Removal of Education components with School of the air** - I won the fight with members of the cross bench when the state government proposed that they wanted to remove critical education components with School.

My To Do List

- Advocating the PHON plan to subsidise apprenticeships by 75% in the first year, 50% in the second year and 25% in the third year.
- **Investigate unfair Native Title Claims**
- Pursue the re-opening of the Mines Department offices in Norseman and Coolgardie
- **Create Suitable accommodation in regional towns for remote community visitors.**
- Continue to follow up on the current status of the MRI machine for the Kalgoorlie Health Campus.
- **Begin the construction on the Kimberly Water Pipelines.**
- Bring Royalties for Regions back to Regional WA.
- **Continue to monitor the age care facility in Leonora.**
- Monitor the Upgrade of the Laverton Hospital.
- **Continue to push for the Wiluna to Meekatharra road to be sealed.**

Greg Hunt also stated that the app, "Provides a Bluetooth handshake. It sits on your phone in terms of the data - that data is encrypted"

If you chose to download the app (which is highly recommend) please remember to keep the app on in power save mode and to keep your phone's Bluetooth on.

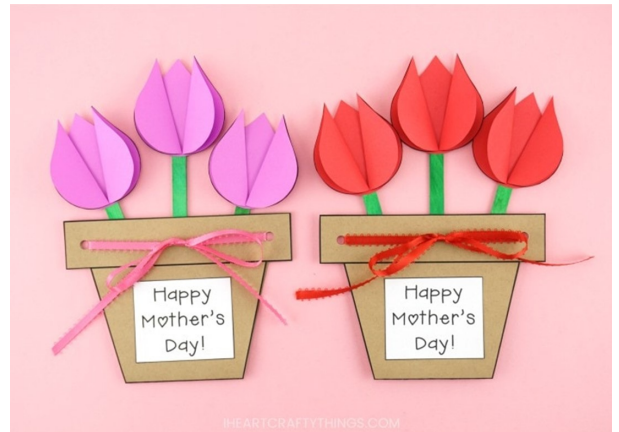

Mother's Day Flower Pot Card



Below are instructions on how to create the Mother's Day Flower Pot Cards.

Step 1. Cut out each of the pieces of the card.

Step 2. Fold the flower pot in half along the line between the two pots to create your card.

Step 3. Glue the Happy Mother's Day tag on the front of the flower pot card.

Step 4. Gather your flower petals. Fold six of the flower petals in half and leave three unfolded.

Step 5. Add glue on the sides of one of your unfolded flower petals and glue two folded petals on the flower with the folds facing towards each other. Repeat this step to make two more tulip flowers.

Step 6. Add glue at the top of your green paper sticks and attach the tulip flowers to them.

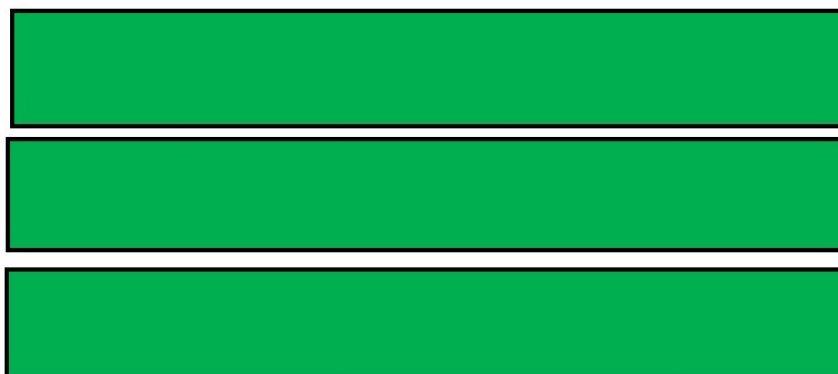
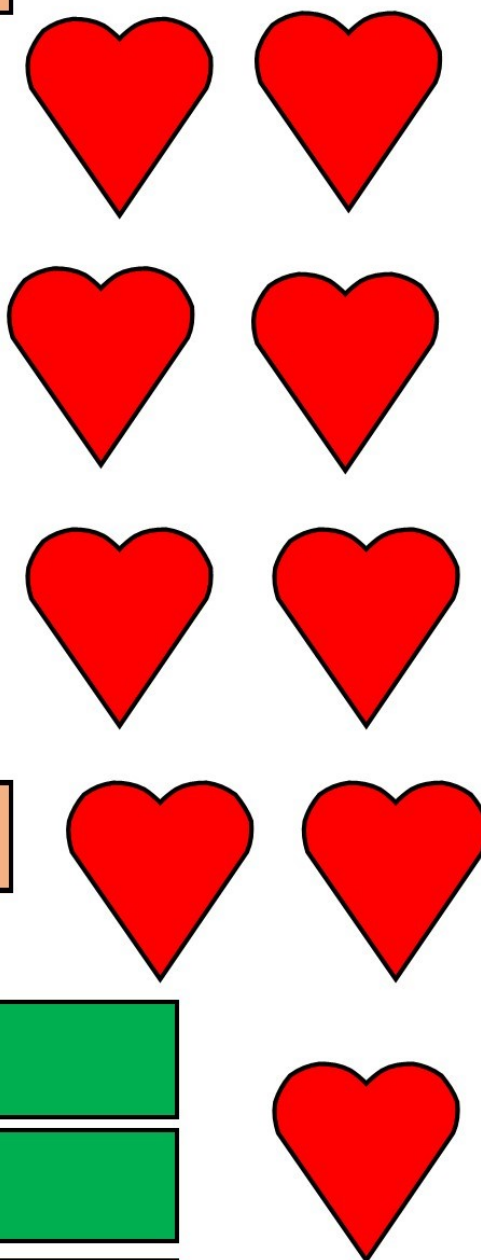
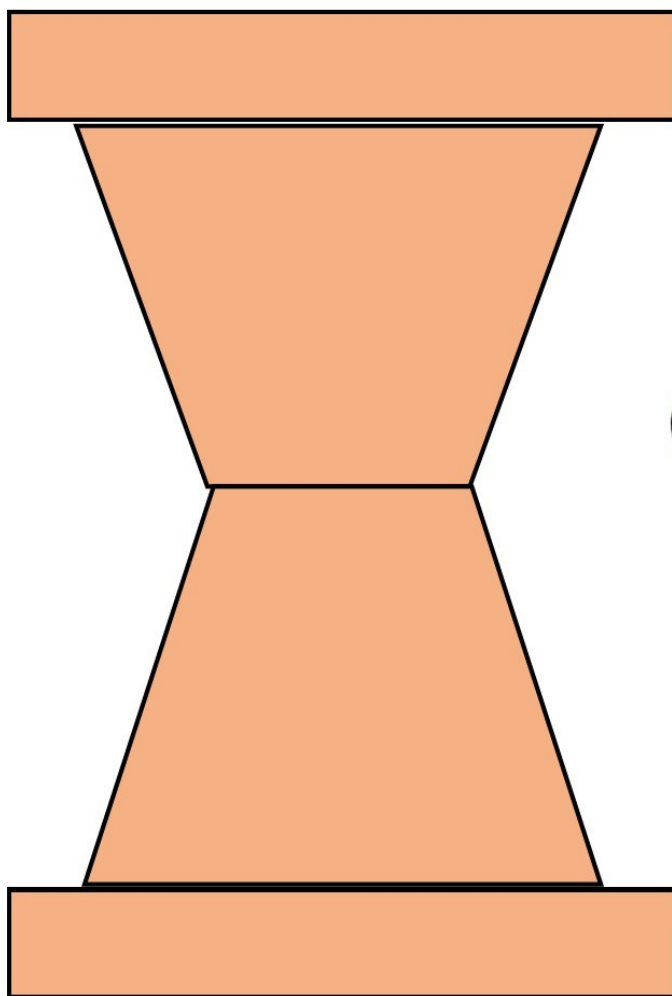

Step 9. Add glue to the back of the bow and glue across the rim of card. Close the flower pot card.



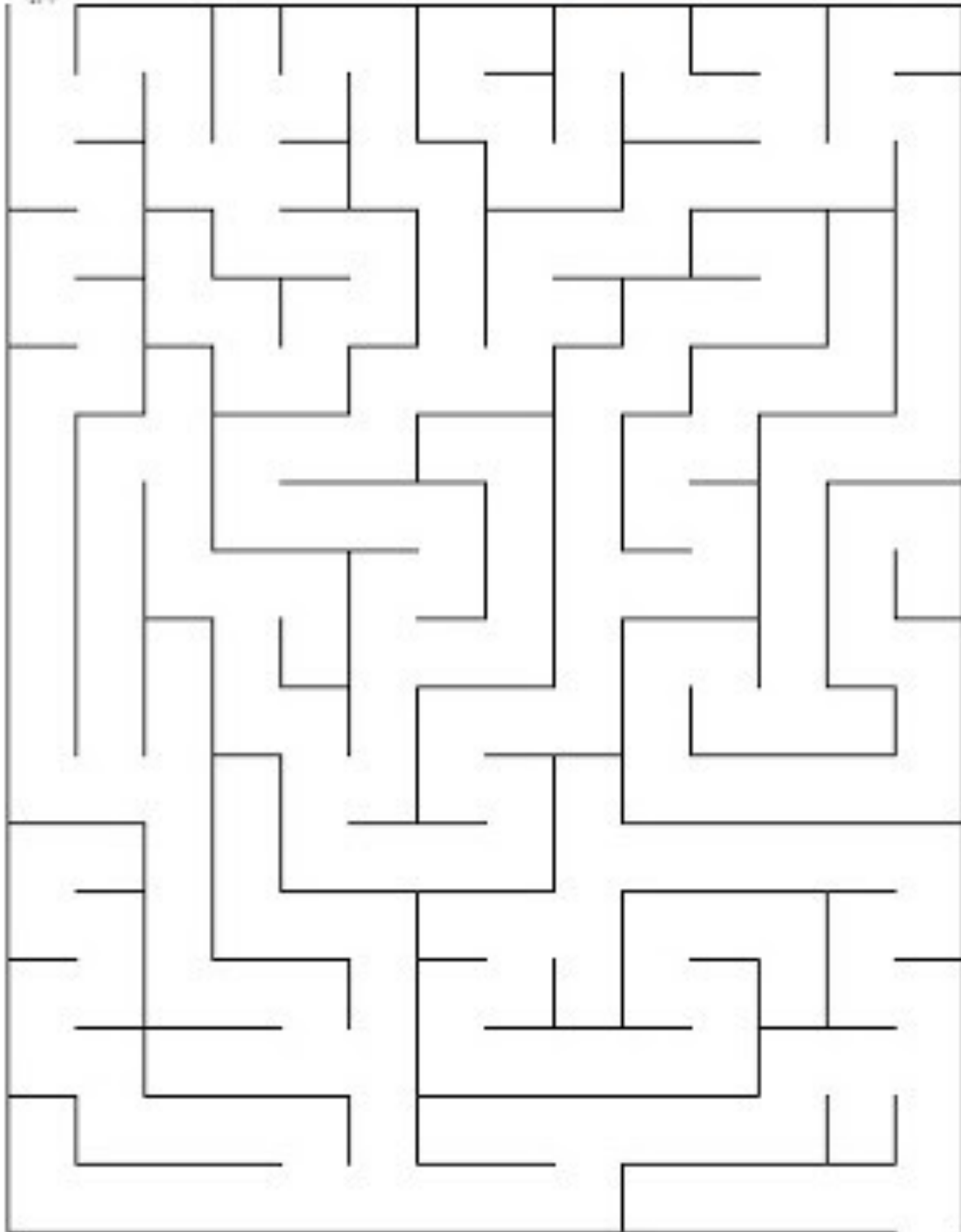
