

**President's Report August 2020** 

## 20<sup>th</sup> August



With Cr Mader, Cr Baird (via Video Conference), staff and myself attended the Briefing Session.

### 24<sup>th</sup> August

With the Acting CEO we met with Katie Hall, the Road Engineer Consultant for the Menzies Shire and discussed a range of topics on roads including water sourcing.

## 26<sup>th</sup> August

With the Acting CEO we met with Sue and Trevor Tough from Outback Grave Makers and received two plaques in appreciation of the funding supplied by the Shire of Menzies to Outback Grave Markers.

We then met with Kyle McGinn MLC and Ali Kent, Labor candidate for Kalgoorlie and discussed a range of issues including the release of the Inquiry into Mining on Pinjin Station, funded signage and upcoming State Elections.

## Shire Notes

#### **Recruitment of Chief Executive Officer**

Beilby Downing Teal has been appointed to assist Council with the recruitment of a permanent Chief Executive Officer. Advertising for the position will commence in the next week.

Due to other commitments Pascoe Durtanovich is unable to continue in the position of Acting Chief Executive Officer beyond 11 September, 2020. Council has appointed Mr Eddy Piper to the position of Acting Chief Executive Officer, commencing 14 September, 2020.

#### STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN

Council has completed a desk top review of the Shire's Strategic Community Plan. This was adopted by Council on 27 August, 2020. This plan, together with the Corporate Business Plan and the Strategic Resource Plan can be accessed on the Shire website.

A detailed review of the Strategic Community Plan was due to be undertaken in 2019/2020, however, with COVID 19 restrictions this was not possible. This will occur in September/October 2020, with community meetings.

#### SHIRE WORKFORCE

Council is currently advertising for cleaning staff and a General Hand – Town Crew.

## COMMONWEALTH GOVERNMENT LOCAL ROADS AND COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

The Shire of Menzies has received \$547,000 under this program. At the meeting on 27 August 2020 Council allocated \$97,000 towards a Playground Park for the Tjuntjuntjarra community. Projects for the balance of the money will be considered at the September meeting of Council.

#### Health Alert for Dog Owners:

Advice on a new Tick borne disease (Ehrlichia canis) has been detected in some dogs in Halls Creek and Kununurra which is the first time this disease has been detected in Australia.

The Department of Agriculture has implemented dog movement conditions in an effort to contain the disease while also releasing the advice to the public so dog owners can be informed to recognise the symptoms.

The disease is transmitted by the brown tick which is prevalent in our region however the disease is normally found in tropical and subtropical areas worldwide.

## Star Gazing in Menzies

#### Stargazing Report by Lewis Johnson

We attended the stargazing night in Menzies on Saturday the 8th of August. This event was organized by the Goldfields Naturalists' Club using the new telescope provided by the Shire of Menzies. It was an excellent night, with a quality telescope, great support from the Visitor Centre and the convenience of being able to stay in the Menzies caravan park.

I (Lewis Johnson) had a great time stargazing with the Menzies telescope. What an asset to the town! I am sure word will travel and more will come to enjoy the opportunity.



I'd like to start by thanking the Naturalist Club and the Menzies Shire for making my dreams come true, by allowing me to play with one of these telescopes. It's been something I've wanted to have for as long as I can remember.

On Saturday afternoon, after checking into the Menzies caravan park, with the brand new chalets—very nice indeed—we "scoped out" (sorry, I couldn't resist) the site for setting up the telescope at the Menzies Rodeo Grounds. We chose a sheltered place on the side of a hill with a nice flat area for the telescope, which was actually a golf green.

We went back to the accommodation to prepare for the cold, clear night. Then we returned to the site with the telescope. It's a beautiful Celestron 8"Schmidt-Cassegrain reflector with an Advanced VX motorized equatorial mount. After a bit of head scratching and reading instructions and pretending I knew what I was doing, I had the telescope set up.


Although there was a bit of a hiccup with a missing power cable. Oh well, adapt and overcome. I considered doing a cross between Bush Mechanics and MacGyver, but I thought I'd better not fiddle more than I already am. When powered up correctly aligned, we should be able to select one of more than 40,000 built in objects and it will go directly to it and track it as long as it is above horizon.

Ramon also brought his telescope along and started setting it up before dusk. I had brought mine too, but was too busy with the main telescope to set it up.

So, left to manually find the stars, I headed straight for Jupiter. Its the brightest thing around, so how could I go wrong? Well, luck was on my side and it went well. We were able to see Jupiter quite nicely with its two red bands, and the four Galilean moons—lo, Europa, Ganymede, and Callisto—appearing very brightly.

Next I went onto Saturn, and we were able to see the rings quite distinctly from the planet. Finally, I found Alpha Centauri, the closest star system to our sun, 4.37 light years away. Alpha Centauri is actually a binary system, with two stars close to the size of our sun, orbiting each other at approximately the distance between the sun and Uranus. After most of the party had had a good look at these, I tried unsuccessfully to find the Jewel Box, and just looked in awe at random patches of the sky, showing countless stars and who knows what else we couldn't make out. Ramon also found Jupiter and some beautiful star clusters with his telescope.

The weather was great during the evening, not one cloud in the sky while we were out there, although it started to get slightly fuzzy after we had mostly packed up; no moon until we got back to camp, and then when it did rise, it was stunning in yellow with all the clouds wisping across it; a bit windy, but completely bearable. Absolutely stunning.

I will say, this is a great initiative by the Menzies Shire. The sky and what's in the dirt would be their greatest assets, as well as the Lake Ballard statues, and they would be doing their best to take their share of mining royalties. So it is great to be capitalizing on the beautiful, clear skies with little pollution. I think it would be a strong attraction getting this telescope set up, with a well set up power supply; a concrete pad at multiple locations—Lake Ballard, the Rodeo Grounds (on the hilltop or sheltered on the side); Menzies hill—with markings to align to the south celestial pole and with the latitude and longitude; solar bollards with red LED's for night vision; picnic tables... Clearly I like spending other people's money, but I really think it could bring in the numbers.

So once again, thanks to all for a great excursion, and I look forward to the next one.









Use your kitchen scraps and yard waste to create garden gold in your own backyard!



#### **Get A Container**

Whether you choose a compost pail or cut the top off a milk carton, any container that will hold kitchen scraps will do!

#### **Choose A Spot**

If your just starting out, pick a spot that's out of the way and get some sunlight (not necessarily in full sun).





#### **Turn Your Compost**

Your compost needs to be turned (every week or so) to get some air flowing and encouraging the break down of all that goodness.

#### Keep It Moist

You never want compost to be dry, so if you go a while without any rain, then just spray some water on it enough to mainstem. This helps the composting process.





#### Use It!

Come spring, or whenever you decide to plant something, get to the bottom of your pile and scoop out the black gold. You'll know its ready when you can't see the kitchen scraps, etc.

# Swedish Apple Pie

#### Ingredients

#### Pie Filling

- 5 Granny Smith apples or enough to fill a pie plate 2/3 full
- 1 tbsp sugar
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon

#### Topping

- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup butter melted
- 1 egg
- 1/8 tsp salt (pinch)





#### Instructions

Preheat oven to 325°F

Peel, core, and slice apples 1/4" thick. Fill pie plate 2/3 full. Sprinkle with 1 tablespoon of sugar and 1 teaspoon of ground cinnamon.

Combine topping ingredients and spread over the apples.

Bake for 1 hour or until crust lightly browns.

Cover leftovers with aluminum foil and refrigerate.

#### Story told by Stewart Macpherson

**1936 Ruston Diesel Generating Plant** Marking the official handing over from the Shire of Menzies to the State Energy Commission of WA.

The original Menzies Powerhouse Ruston engine. Power to Menzies was opened to Menzies on Friday 18th February 1955, The Menzies State Battery was opened on the same day with a similar engine which is still there. The power was DC. The power lines were put up by the Menzies Road Board throughout the town.

> During my primary school days at times Mary my sister and myself used to sleep in the room next to this engine when we were billeted at times to stay with Ted and Aurie Sainty which were the caretakers of the powerhouse, also Ted was the local butcher..

As you read on the plaque the engine was originally in the Leonora powerhouse.

#### RUSTON DIESEL GENERATING SET.

This Ruston Hornsby model 7XHR 40 b.h.p., 300 r.p.m., ho engine typifies the machinery used for many years to generate for small communities remote from the Commission's grid syst

Developed from the Hornsby-Akroyd engine of 1894, claimed to be the world's first commercially successful oil engine, this 1928 model is fundamentally similar to the pioneer cold starting engine of this type, first built in 1912.

With advances in technology and the great strides made in binging sine electricity to remote communities the small independent power station is tast disappearing.

This exhibit serves to immortalise the country power setting and the advent operators relied upon by so many Western Australians before the advent of a power system based on a network of major thermal stations. #### SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

 Put safety first

 • Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.

 • Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)

 • It may turn out to be your most important safety device.

 Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Grown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

 Obtain a 40E permit prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (flyou don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

 Get written permission

 from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

 a mining lease

 an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)

 a prospecting licence

Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. ## Calling 000

#### Police, Fire or Ambulance

When you are transferred to the correct service you may be asked the following questions: What is the address of the emergency? Street, cross reference or landmark will be required.

What is the telephone number you are calling from? This is in case your call is terminated or further information is required.

Tell me exactly what has happened? Provide a brief description of the problem.

How old is s/he? If unknown then approximate age.

Is s/he awake (conscious)? Yes or no answer required.

Is s/he breathing? Yes or no answer required.

The Communications Officer will then ask a series of further questions more specific to the problem identified. Answering these questions will ensure the most appropriate ambulance response is provided.

The Communications Officer will give you advice over the phone to assist the patient prior to the arrival of an ambulance. They may also ask you to turn on front lights if it is dark; if possible have someone wait out the front; and make sure the door is unlocked and open so the paramedics can enter.

Please remember to try and stay calm and speak slowly to the Communications Officer. Often an ambulance will be dispatched while you are still on the phone.

If in doubt you should always call triple zero (000). Sadly many people do not call for an ambulance as they are unsure of whether the situation is an emergency or they are concerned about the cost.

By calling triple zero (000), you may save someone's life.


