



The Lady Shenton Hotel was named after the Lady Shenton gold mine in 1902 and operated as a hotel until 1922. It was the second hotel on the site with the first burning to the ground on 13 December 1901. The current building was opened by its owner, Patrick James Green, and over the years it has been used as a boarding house, mining company office and accommodation and has had periods when it had been left abandoned.

Today this substantial brick Federation building has been restored and is now in the hands of the Shire of Menzies. It is home to the Visitor Centre, Postal Agency, Public Library and Shire history collection.
