Elected Members are bound by legislation to act with integrity and make decisions for the whole of the Shire.

Attending meetings

Elected Members have a duty to attend all the Council Meetings to ensure that electors are adequately represented. In recognition of this, under the *Local Government Act 1995* an Elected Member who is absent from three consecutive meetings of the Council without leave being granted by the Council, is automatically disqualified. If a member wishes to be absent for more than six consecutive ordinary meetings, Ministerial approval is necessary as well as the Council approval.

It should be noted that applications for leave of absence are usually supported but must be approved by the Council before, or at, the meeting(s) the Council Member is to be absent from. Leave of absence cannot be approved retrospectively.

Voting at meetings

If an Elected Member is present at a Council Meeting, he or she is required by law to vote on all matters before that meeting unless he or she has a financial interest in the matter. Agendas are delivered to the Elected Members within the required timeframes of the Local Government Act 1995, being a minimum of seventy-two (72) hours prior to the advertised commencement of the meeting. While late items are generally not considered there is provision on the Agenda for items of an urgent nature to be considered.

Councillors are required to give due consideration to all matters contained in the agenda. Without adequate time for reading the agenda, it is extremely difficult for the Elected Members to make effective assessments of issues and provide constructive input to the Council debate and decision making. It is recommended that further information be requested if there is insufficient material available to make an informed decision.

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this report is for the Council to consider submissions for Tender 02/23 – Tjuntjuntjara Access Route – Road Improvements and Repairs.

BACKGROUND:

The Tjuntjuntjara community is a remote Aboriginal community located 650km northeast of Kalgoorlie. The community is located within the Shire of Menzies and is managed by the Paupiyala Tjarutja Aboriginal Corporation. The major access route to the community is a route from Kalgoorlie following the Trans Access Road, Kitchener Cutline Road, Connie Sue Road, and Tjuntjuntjara Road (which intersects the Connie Sue Highway at 'Shed Tank'). Due to recent infrastructure development at the community, the route has been subject to heavy traffic in drought conditions and as such, large sections of the road have deteriorated and large bulldust holes have formed.

The work comprises cut to fill through undulating terrain to balance ridges and depressions, removal of unsuitable material from bulldust holes and replacement of this material with locally sourced calcrete gravel to form a widened unsealed pavement suitable for all weather access. The successful Contractor will need to supply a mobile camp, suitable machinery, traffic management and suitably skilled and experienced operators. The works will also require establishment and management of gravel pits and water bores where required.

The route to the community is made up of the following road sections;

The Shire of Menzies has Aboriginal Community Access Roads, and NoRA (Supplementary Funding for Improving Access Roads To Remote Aboriginal Communities) funding available to spend on works on the access route to Tjuntjuntjara Community (Connie Sue Road and Tjuntjuntjarra Road). The Shire has an agreement in place with the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder to tender and undertake the works for the sections in the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder (whereafter the City will transfer funding obtained on receipt of invoices). The City has Aboriginal Community Access Roads, NoRA, and possible additional funding from Main Roads.

On Saturday, 1 April 2023, the Shire of Menzies called tenders from suitably qualified and experienced Civil Contractors to undertake civil works to upgrade and repair sections of the Tjuntjuntjara Access Route.

COMMENT:

Tender open period was from Saturday 1 April 2023 to 14:00hrs (2pm) WST, Thursday 4 May 2023. The tender opening was held on Thursday 4 May 2023 at the offices CORE Business Australia, attended by the Robert Stewart (Shire of Menzies Acting CEO), Bruce Lorimer (Managing Director, CORE Business Australia, authorised by the Shire of Menzies' CEO to open tenders in accordance with Regulation 16 (3) (a) (ii) of the Local government (Functions and General) Regulation 1996), and Milena Lorsignol (Project Support Officer, CORE Business Australia). There were no members of the public present. Three tenders were received (see attached report for detail).

Based on qualitative scores and provided pricing, the tender submitted by Roadtech was evaluated to provide the most confidence in the works being delivered as specified. Roadtech's tender also specified that they would be able to carry out the works in the Shire of Menzies and the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder simultaneously.

Before finalising and executing the contract with the preferred tenderer, the Shire still needs to confirm finalised budget availability for both Shires and negotiate final extent of works in both Shires in line with FY 22/23 budget allocation. In order for works to commence as soon as possible to allow funding to be spend this financial year, the Tender Assessment Panel's recommendation is that the Council delegate authority to the CEO to negotiate final extent of works as outlined above, as well as authority to

renew the contract each financial year (subject to contractor performance and allocation of funds), up to four additional years as outlined in the Request for Tender.

The proposed contract is a 1-year AS4902 contract with four 1-year options for extension subject to funding allocation and contractor performance. The proposed project is to upgrade the access road to an all-weather trafficable unsealed road pavement 6m wide on Kitchener Cutline Rd (In the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder) and 8 m wide on Tjuntjuntjarra Road (in the Shire of Menzies) over 5 years and to undertake selective repair of blowouts while sections await formal construction.

CONSULTATION:

The proposed works have been discussed with officers of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

Local Government Act 1995
