SUMMARY:

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this report is to seek Council approval for the Chief Executive Officer to investigate the option of Archival Recording of the heritage-listed Old Post Office Building, Lot 102 Shenton Street, Menzies.

BACKGROUND:

This project has been ongoing for a number of years, without resolution. The main stumbling block appears to be the cost of restoration. Different options have been considered over the time, with the latest being at the Council Meeting on 26 September 2024. Wherein it was resolved:

'That the scope of works for Stage 1 (reinstate the structural and aesthetic integrity) of the Old Post Office Restoration, is noted and that the method of tender be in the form of a schedule of rates for works up to a total value of \$500,000.'

It appears that this decision of council has not been implemented, although the matter has been discussed at subsequent Council Discussion meetings.

COMMENT:

Whilst administration can proceed to implement the decision of 26 September 2024, it may be worthwhile investigating the option of Archival Recording.

An archival recording of heritage-listed buildings is a comprehensive report that documents a historic site's current physical form, condition and history. A detailed photographic survey is also a core component of archival recording. This option can only be pursued if the Heritage Council of WA approves the demolition of the building.

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this report is for Council to formally resolve to accept ownership of Water Corporation assets no longer required by the Corporation and to accept vesting of the subject Crown Land.

BACKGROUND:

Over the past two to three years, Council staff have been liaising with the Water Corporation on the future of the Corporation's assets in Menzies, specifically the five bores and Menzies Dam No. 1.

These assets have become surplus to the Water Corporation's requirements given that the town water supply will be trucked in from Kalgoorlie.

COMMENT:

This matter has also been discussed by Council at Council discussion meetings.

The proposal has now reached the stage that a formal resolution of council is required to accept the assets and to accept vesting of the subject reserves.

The majority of the bore field resides primarily on Crown Pastoral lease N050457 and some of the infrastructure runs through Crown Reserve 9834. The dam is located on Water Corporation Crown Reserve 5064 (513ha).

It is intended that the water from the bores and the two dams (one dam is already vested in Shire of Menzies) will be used for reticulation purposes only so depending on rainfall and runoff in any given year, the use of the bores could be minimal.

Whilst it is assumed that the bores are in working order, there will be ongoing costs associated with the assets in question.

The issue of an abstraction licence will need to be resolved also. Water Corporations licence has lapsed, and they are not in the position to assist Council in this regard. Council will have to submit an application to the Department of Water and Environment Regulation for an abstraction licence; however, this can only be done once an annual quantity figure is known. This can be calculated by administration.

CONSULTATION:

No external consultation has been undertaken. Discussions have been between the Shire administration and Water Corporation representatives.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage for Land tenure and Department of Water and Environment Regulation for abstraction licence.

SUMMARY:

This agenda item is for the consideration of requests from Ora Banda Mining relating to:

1. Proposed construction of a tailings storage facility over the eastern extent of the gazetted Davyhurst townsite
2. Proposed construction of alternative public access to Davyhurst cemetery from Coolgardie North Road
3. Undertaking of mining operations over an unnamed road reserve at Round Dam project
4. Access to materials available from Shire gravel / borrow pits along the Ora Banda-Davyhurst Rd

BACKGROUND:

Ora Banda Mining (OBM) is a major mining company that has been operating in the Shire of Menzies for a number of years in the Riverina – Davyhurst – Mulline area located to the south west of the Menzies townsite primarily accessed via the Evanston-Menzies Road. Council previously deliberated over an agenda item in March 2024 relating to the temporary closure of Shire roads and resolved to provide its conditional approval to OBM on that occasion.

Since that time, OBM has continued to expand its exploration and mining operations and is again seeking the appropriate approvals to facilitate its proposed future operations.

The Shire is in receipt of a letter from OBM (included at Attachment 1) which outlines the proposed mining operations and their impacts on various parcels of land that the Shire has interest in and/or jurisdiction over. A second letter has also been received (included at Attachment 2) relating to a request to access and obtain road building materials from three existing Shire pits located along the Ora Banda-Davyhurst Rd.

The details within these letters are discussed under 'Comments' below.

COMMENT:

Each of OBM's requests is discussed as follows:

Letter (Attachment 1)

i. Proposed construction of a tailings storage facility (TSF) over the eastern extent of the gazetted Davyhurst townsite

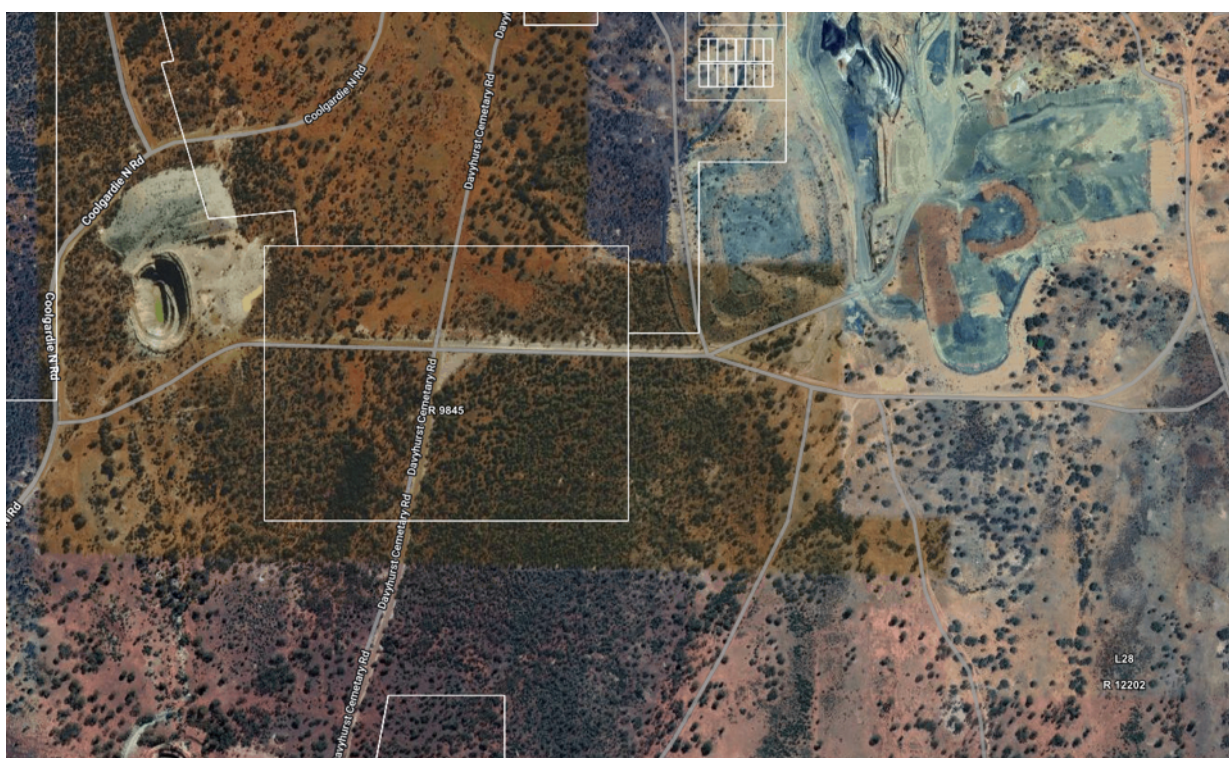
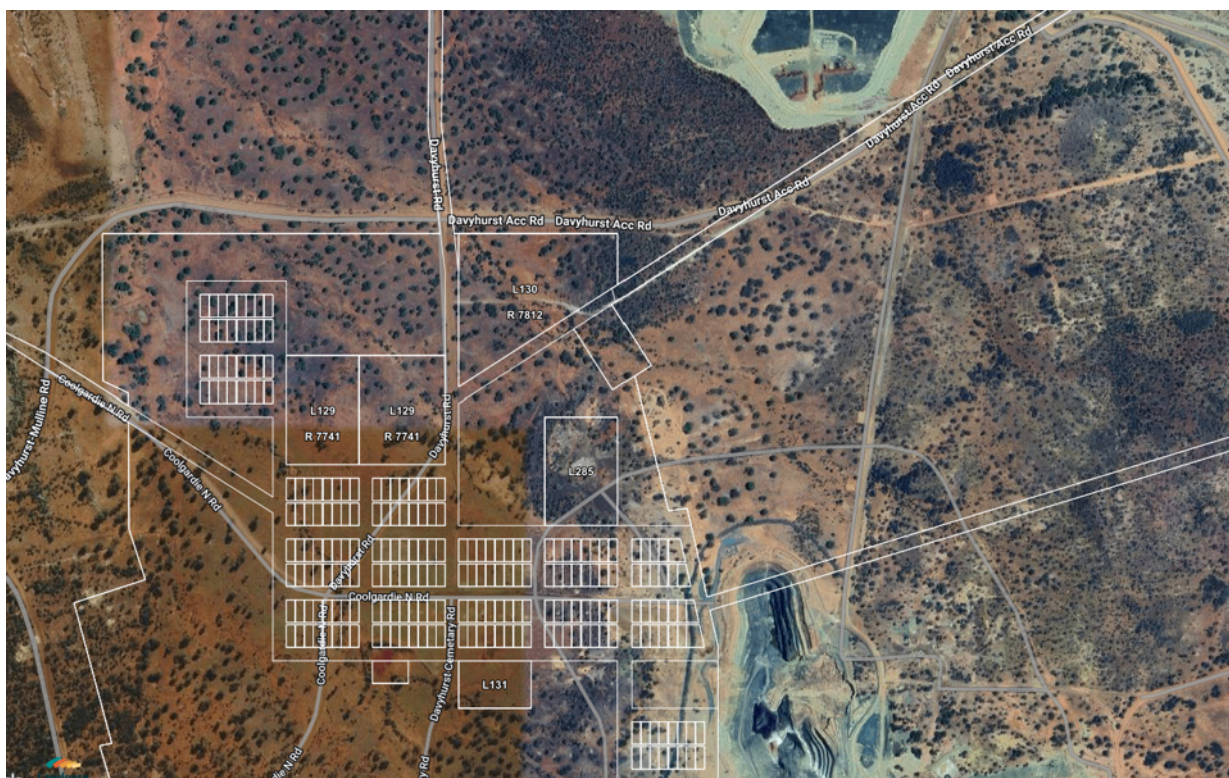
It is noted in the letter that reference is also made to the proposed installation of monitoring bores and topsoil storage to the west of the proposed TSF, also within the gazetted townsite. These are hereinafter referred to as associated activities.

The image included within the OBM letter has been extracted and inserted below to indicate the extent of the proposed tailings storage facility and its encroachment onto the gazetted Davyhurst townsite.

Attachment 2: Proposed Tailings Storage Facility Encroachment onto Davyhurst Townsite Reserve



To gain an indication of the potential land parcels and services (including reserves, lots and roads), other than and/or within the gazetted Davyhurst townsite boundary, which may be impacted by the proposal, the following images have been extracted from the MNG Access platform – a cloud-based system that provides real-time, multi-layered mapping and land parcel data.



In Western Australia, mining activities over gazetted townsites require multiple approvals from both state and Commonwealth agencies, in addition to standard mining environmental approvals. The process is governed by the Mining Act 1978 (WA), the Mining Regulations 1981 (WA), and related environmental (Environmental Protection Act 1986 including Part V – Native vegetation clearing permit) and heritage (Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972 (WA)) legislation.

Should the proposed TSF or associated activities encroach upon any public or gazetted road reserves (whether within or outside the gazetted townsite) then permanent closure and relocation of part of the road may need to be considered. The permanent closure process is governed by Section 58 of the Land Administration Act and administered by the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH), with Local Government and service authorities involved in the process.

Consideration may also need to be given to the purpose, permitted use and activities within any reserves impacted by the TSF or associated activities. This can be determined by referencing the vesting of the reserve and confirming compliance and approval with the vestee which is most likely the Shire of Menzies unless vested with a Service Authority.

It is recommended that the Shire support this proposal subject to confirming any statutory requirements as referenced above and requiring any associated statutory approval processes to be completed prior to commencement of construction.

ii. Proposed construction of alternative public access to Davyhurst cemetery from Coolgardie North road

The image included within the OBM letter has been extracted and inserted below to indicate the location of the cemetery site and the proposed alternate access route from the Coolgardie North Road, crossing the Davyhurst Cemetery Road.

Attachment 1: Proposed public access to Davyhurst Cemetery



To gain an indication of the potential land parcels and services (including reserves, lots and roads) which may be impacted by the proposal, the following image has been extracted from the MNG Access platform.



Noting that the intention of this proposal is to facilitate the use of part of the Davyhurst cemetery road for mining haulage operations and includes the proposed construction of an alternative public access to the cemetery site it is assumed that it is desirable to exclude the use of part of this road by all public traffic by way of a temporary closure of the relevant section.

Should that be the case the process for temporary closure of a road is to be undertaken in accordance with Section 3.50 of the Local Government Act 1995. This would likely involve similar Shire Council resolutions and conditions as was the case in March 2024 relating to the temporary closure of a section of Davyhurst – Mulline road. That included conditions relating to upgrading, maintenance, operation and remediation of the road section, indemnification of the Shire and access by other parties via a permit system administered by the Shire.

Other than the matter of public use of the Davyhurst cemetery road consideration needs to be given to the approvals required for the construction of the alternative access to the cemetery. As construction of this road may be considered ancillary to mining activities it may be necessary to check the requirements under the Mining Act 1978 (WA) and the Mining Regulations 1981 (WA) as to whether this is the governing process. In any case there would still be the requirement to follow the processes under related environmental (Environmental Protection Act 1986 including Part V – Native vegetation clearing permit) and heritage (Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972 (WA)) legislation.

The Shire would also need to include in any approval a condition relating to the required standard of construction and maintenance for this public access road and also for the designation of the land corridor it is to sit within. Noting that it will be for use by the

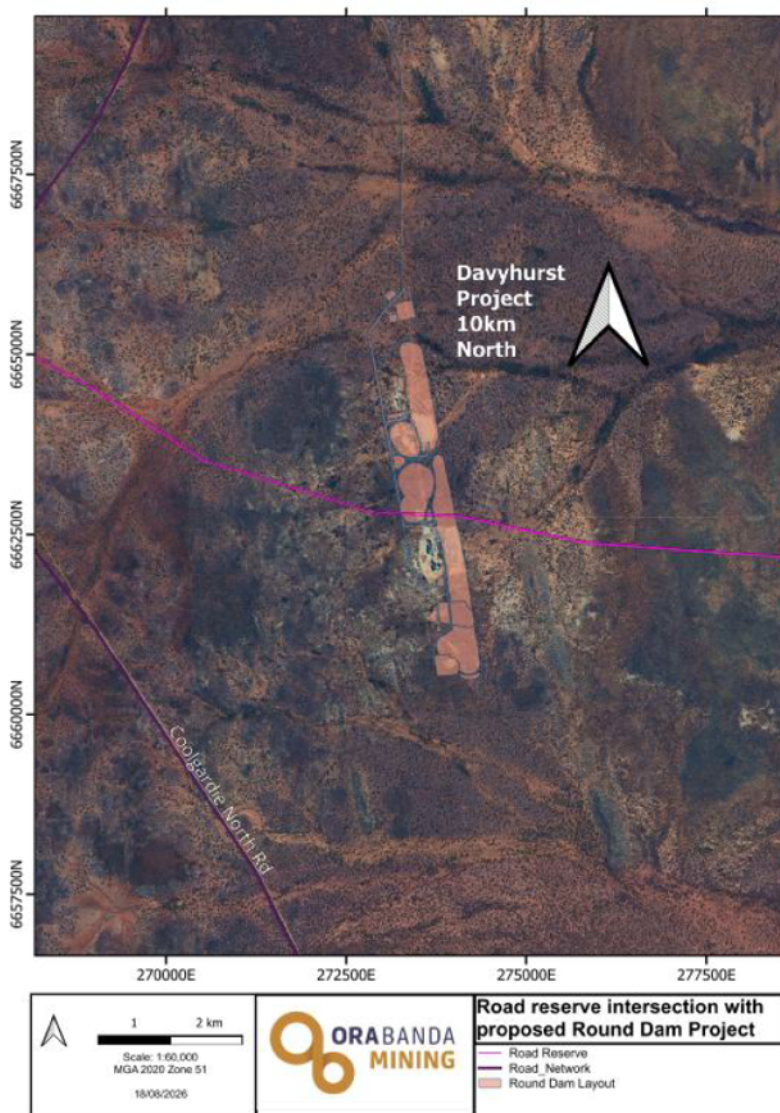
public it may need to be a road reserve vested with the Shire having jurisdiction over it and responsibility for it.

It is recommended that the Shire support this proposal subject to confirming any statutory requirements as referenced above and requiring any associated statutory approval processes to be completed prior to commencement of construction.

iii. Undertaking of mining operations over an unnamed road reserve

The image included within the OBM letter has been extracted and inserted below to indicate the location of the Round Dam project relative to the Davyhurst project and the nearby Coolgardie North Road as well as the alignment of the unnamed road reserve.

Attachment 3: Un-Named Road Reserve intersection with Proposed Round Dam Project footprint



To gain an indication of the potential land parcels and services (including reserves, lots and roads) which may be impacted by the proposal, the following image has been extracted from the MNG Access platform.



The orange colored area is an Aboriginal heritage site which is not impacted. The unnamed road reserve is clearly shown with a designated width of approximately 30m where it crosses the Round Dam project area.

The planned activities associated with the Round Dam project will prevent a section of this road reserve from being used to construct a road. With there being no existing road constructed it is recommended that the Shire have no objections to the proposal subject to any provisions of the Land Administration Act being complied with. Depending on confirmation of the status of this unnamed road reserve there may or may not be a requirement for a permanent closure process to be followed, which is governed by Section 58 of the Land Administration Act and administered by the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH), with Local Government and service authorities involved in the process.

It is recommended that the Shire support this proposal subject to confirming any statutory requirements as referenced above and requiring any associated statutory approval processes to be completed prior to commencement of construction.

Letter (Attachment 2)

- i. Access to materials available from three Shire gravel / borrow pits along the Ora Banda-Davyhurst Rd**

The Three (3) nominated pits are existing pits located at SLK 7.31, 20.73 and 21.33 along the Ora Banda – Davyhurst Rd as indicated in the attachment, previously used by the Shire for sourcing pavement gravel primarily used for construction and re-sheeting

of unsealed roads in the area. Inspections and visual geotechnical investigation of these pits earlier this year indicated that they are virtually exhausted of pavement gravel material within the current cleared footprint area with the base presenting a hard white rock.

Should OBM wish to pursue sourcing of further material from the existing base or by clearing vegetation and extending the pits for potential use as pavement gravel or embankment fill / subgrade material it is recommended that this can be supported by the Shire subject to compliance with appropriate legislative requirements relating to Heritage, Environmental and Land Access clearances.

It is noted in OBMs letter that these three pits have been selected for initial material sourcing but that this request may extend to other locations should further suitable material be required. As part of the earlier inspections and visual geotechnical investigation there were two potential new gravel pit areas identified and mapped at SLK 7 and SLK 23 on the Ora Banda Davyhurst Rd and it was recommended at the time that OBM, in consultation with the Shire of Menzies, commence the approvals process for gaining access to these areas. It is further recommended that the Shire agrees to conditionally support OBM should it become desirable to extend this request for access to potential gravel and road construction material pits in the area.

CONSULTATION:

No community consultation was considered necessary in relation to the recommendations of this report, noting that the conditions included will require consultation in accordance with legislative requirements.

SUMMARY:

To adopt amendments to the 2026/27 municipal fund budget by reallocating funds from projects that are not considered a priority for completion in the current financial year to other projects and activities requiring additional funding.

BACKGROUND:

At the Council Discussion Meeting held on 15 September 2026, Council considered potential amendments to the 2026/27 Annual Budget to reallocate funding between projects.

The proposed amendments are as follows:

- Removing \$50,000.00 from Outdoor Gym;
- Removing \$200,000.00 from Recreation Precinct Upgrade;
- Providing additional funding for Perth Symphony Orchestra Event;
- Providing additional funding towards the delivery of capital projects currently on hold and intended to be completed during the 2026/27 financial year and
- Providing additional funding for minor plant purchases.

COMMENT:

The proposed budget amendment will reallocate \$250,000 from the Outdoor Gym and Recreation Precinct Upgrade to other priority activities and projects during the current financial year.

The two projects will be reconsidered as part of the 2027/28 annual budget preparation process.

Of the funds being reallocated, \$150,000 will support the delivery of the Perth Symphony Orchestra Event. This includes \$50,000 towards employee costs associated with

engaging an Event Coordinator and an additional \$100,000 for event contingencies and infrastructure requirements.

A further \$60,000 will be allocated towards employee costs associated with the recruitment of a fixed-term Project Manager to assist with the delivery of capital projects currently planned for 2026/27.

The remaining \$40,000 will be \$15,000 for the purchase and installation of new smiley speed signs on the main street in Menzies and \$25,000 for the purchase of a street sweeper.

CONSULTATION:

No external consultation occurred during the preparation of this report.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY:

Local Government Act 1995, section 6.8(1)(b) provides for expenditure that is not included in the annual budget to be incurred where the expenditure is authorised in advance by resolution of Council.
