FROM THE ORDINARY MEETING OF COUNCIL FRIDAY, 21 DECEMBER 2012

CAPITAL PURCHASE - ALTERATION TO BUDGET:

Council approved an alteration to the 2012/2013 Budget to purchase a trailer in lieu of a truck which will be used to transport the septic tank pump around the Shire. This change will realise a saving of some \$90,000 and the trailer will be used to transport a fuel tank for the road crew when not in use with the septic pump.

2010/2012 ANNUAL REPORT:

Council received the Annual Report for the year ended 30 June 2011. This report is well overdue and persons wishing to view this report should visit the Shire Administration Centre. An electors Meeting will be scheduled for Thursday, 31 January commencing at the Council Chambers at 11.00 am.

DONATION TO CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PARTY:

Council approved a donation of \$500 to the Menzies Youth and Community Group to assist towards the Children's Christmas Party function.

MENZIES COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTRE - FUTURE OPERATIONS:

Following a decision by the Menzies Development Association Inc., Council agreed to continue operating the Community Resource Centre as a Shire venture. This decision followed a proposal for the MDA to take over management of the CRC, however, the logistics of such a task in a small town like Menzies proved to be too onerous.

Instead, the Shire will invite the MDA to participate in an Advisory Group which will provide feedback from the community on what they would like to see implemented through the centre. Through this model, the CRC will have the chance to become a most valuable asset to the town.


Incorporating the Visitor Centre, Spinifex Art Gallery, Post Office Agency, Computer Area and Library.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

It is the <u>responsibility of the owner</u> to make sure all dogs are registered with the Council and to ENSURE that dogs are kept in a secured fenced environment at home unless on a leash.

Dog registrations were due to be paid on the 31 October, 2012. If you have not yet registered your dog or renewed registration, you must do so immediately.

All dogs over the age of 3 months within the Shire of Menzies are required to be registered under the Dog Act 1976.

Failure to register the dog is an offence under the Dog Act 1976.

Glimpses of the Past

Destructive Cyclone at Niagara

Buildings Unroofed


Kookynie Nov 25

On Sunday night at 6.30, the most severe cyclone that has yet been experienced in the district came from a north-westerly direction and swept through Niagara with terrific force. The town, when visited this morning, bore full testimony to the severity of the storm. Iron, timber, tanks and other debris were scattered in all directions, and in most instances at a considerable distance from the unroofed buildings.


The Miners Institute, a large hall built of sundried bricks with iron roof, was totally ruined, only portion of one wall being left standing. Messrs. Kennedy Bros store, of similar construction and size, is unroofed and otherwise damaged. Of Mrs West's residence, also substantially built of sun dried bricks, nothing but the walls remain. The verandah of Mr Hugh Kelly's store was lifted onto the roof, which it smashed, causing the walls to bulge out.

The Challenge Hotel, belonging to and tenanted by Mrs Coombes, had half the roof blown away, and the property was otherwise damaged. The Victoria Hotel had its verandah on the northern side swept completely away and the other damage done. Mrs Monaghan, who recently leased the Niagara Hotel is the greatest sufferer, the whole of the buildings, with the exception of the bar and billiard room, being unroofed, the walls severely damaged, and the verandah and windows smashed. The dust and rain that accompanied the tornado beat into the unroofed rooms doing much damage to furniture, clothing and fittings.

The storm extended to Jessop's Well, where some damage was done. It also blew violently in Kookynie, but beyond turning over a few makeshift tenements and smothering the place in dust, little damage was done.

Lamingtons Sponge Recipe

1 cup butter

1 cup sugar

4 eggs (beaten)

2 cups self raising flour*

Icing (recipe follows)

Preheat oven to 175*C

Grease a 13 x 9 inch pan and set aside.

Cream together butter and sugar.

Gradually add the eggs, mixing well.

Add 1/3 cup of flour at a time, stirring gently and thoroughly after each addition.

Pour batter in pan and bake for 1 to 1 1/4 hours, reducing the temperature to 160*C after 30 minutes.

Let cool.

Cut into 2 inch (4 cm) squares.

Chocolate Lamingtons Icing

500 grams of icing sugar 1/3 cup of cocoa 15 grams of butter ½ cup of milk coconut

Melt the butter in a saucepan and remove from the heat.

Sift the icing sugar and cocoa into the saucepan, add the milk and mix through.

Dip squares of sponge cake into the icing mix. Roll in coconut.

Eat and enjoy!



Tips for cooking with kids

- Safety first! Turn in pot handles away from the edge and keep glassware, sharp knives and graters out of reach.
- Read the recipe and prepare to take over any parts you think could be tricky for the kids, such as chopping or frying.
- Set the kids up with their own counter space with items they can safely work with, such as measuring cups.
- Get the littlest kids involved wherever you can ask them to push a button, stir ingredients, or just lick the bowl.

Magic Wands

Makes 24

Preparation 1 hour (+ setting time)
Cooking 25 mins

125g butter, at room temperature, <mark>chopped</mark>

100g (1/2 cup) caster sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla extract


1 egg

190g (11/4 cups) plain flour

375g packet milk chocolate melts, melted

Yellow sprinkles, to decorate

375g pkt white chocolate melts, melted Hundreds and thousands, to decorate



2 Roll 3 teaspoons of the dough on a lightly floured surface into a 20cm-long log. Transfer to 1 prepared tray. Repeat with the remaining dough.

3 Bake 2 trays, swapping halfway through cooking, for 10-12 minutes or until pale golden. Cool completely on the trays. Repeat with remaining tray.

4 Dip half of 1 wand into the milk chocolate, allowing excess to drip off. Hold over a large plate and sprinkle with yellow sprinkles. Transfer to a lined tray. Repeat with half the remaining wands. Set aside for 30 minutes or until set.

5 Repeat with the remaining wands, white chocolate and hundreds and thousands.

Per wand 3g protein • 13g fat • (11g saturated fat) • 30g carb • 0.5g dietary fibre • 1055kJ (250 Cals)



Balloon rocket activity



Ever wondered how rockets fly through the sky? It is thanks to something called thrust. Find out more by completing this experiment.



You will need

- 1 balloon (you can experiment with different shapes and sizes)
- · 1 long piece of string
- 1 plastic straw
- tape

<u>O</u>

Directions

- 1. Tie one end of the string to a chair, door knob or other support.
- Put the other end of the string through the straw. Pull the string tight and fie it to another chair or door knob.
- Blow up the balloon, but don't fie it. Remember to hold the opening tightly closed while you complete the next step (ask a friend to hold it for you if you need help).
- Grab your tape and stick the middle of the balloon to the straw so it is attached and ready for take-off.
- 5. Let go and watch the balloon rocket fly.

How did that happen?

This experiment works by using the same method of thrust that launches a rocket. A rocket's engine uses two kinds of liquid fuels that mix together and burn to release powerful hot gases that blast the rocket off the ground and into the air. The thrust is the energy created by the combustion of the fuels being released from the bottom of the rocket.

In a similar way this experiment uses the thrust created from the energy of the balloon forcing the air out to push the balloon along the string. A balloon weights a lot less than a rocket, which is why it only needs air to push it along instead of a powerful blast of gas.
