THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT AUGUST 2022

11th July attended Special Meeting of Council to adopt the Annual Budget 2022/2023.

Met with Laura Russo, Ron Yuryevich and members of Council to discuss recruitment of a new CEO.

Travelled to Kalgoorlie on 14th July to attend a meeting with CEO, Works Manager, Cr Ian Baird, City of Kalgoorlie/Boulder and Main Roads to discuss Tjuntjuntjara access via the Cutline.

Wednesday 20th July attended farewell drinks in the Menzies Hotel Beer Garden with Brian, Eve and members of staff.

21st July attended the Briefing Session followed by a meeting with available Councillors, Independent Member Ron Yuryevich and Consultant Laura Russo.

22nd July, participated via video, a meeting with Rick Wilson to discuss upcoming Legislation to abolish the Cashless Debit Card. There are concerns from neighbouring shires as to the escalation of anti social behaviour once the card is withdrawn.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

AUGUST 2022

I am pleased to again be given the opportunity to work with Council, Council Staff and the community in the capacity of Acting Chief Executive Officer.

Council is working through the recruitment process for a permanent Chief Executive Officer with the view to filling the position as soon as possible.

The July Council meeting was held on Thursday, 28th July. A number of items were up for consideration:

1. Draft Menzies Tourism Development Strategy

Council resolved not to endorse the plan and has requested the Acting Chief Executive Officer review the document and report back to Council at the August 2022 Council meeting.

2. Sale of 21 and 23 Reid Street Menzies

Council has deferred a decision on the disposal of the above vacant land pending further information on the availability of auctioneers.

3. Lot 29 Reid Street Menzies

An offer to purchase was received for 29 Reid Street (vacant land). Council resolved not to dispose of this lot as it is required for Shire use.

4. Tjuntjuntjara Community

Council has approved a contribution to \$18,500 to the Tjuntjuntjara Community for playground infrastructure consisting of fencing, soft fall and shade sails. This work will be complementary to the existing playground recently constructed.

5. Maintenance of Cutline Road

The Shire of Menzies has entered into an agreement with the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder for the upgrade and maintenance of the Cutline Road.

The Cutline Road runs from Kitchener on the Trans Access Road through to Red Drum Corner at the intersection with the Connie Sue Highway and is used by the community of Tjuntjuntjara to travel to and from Kalgoorlie. The section of the Cutline Road in question is within the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder.

A proposal has been agreed whereby the Shire will maintain the road on the City's behalf with the City providing funding that they have available. Economies of scale can be made with the Shire incorporating works in with other works on the Connie Sue Highway and Tjuntjuntjara Access Road.

We say goodbye to Antonio Giometti and Pema Chhunzom. Antonio has held the position of Chief Finance Officer and Pema our Community Engagement Officer with the Shire of Menzies for the past 14 months. We thank them for their service and wish them all the best with their new positions with the Marra Worra Worra Aboriginal Corporation in Fitzroy Crossing.

Council approved 2022/23 budget

After three separate council briefing sessions, the draft budget for 2022/23 was tabled for council consideration at a Special Council Meeting, Monday 11 July 2022 and a balanced budget was, through an absolute majority, approved.

The key items of note are as follows

Revenue - Operating	\$11.5M
Revenue – Capital	\$4.3M
Revenue – Total	\$15.8M

Expenditure - Operating	\$8.0M
Expenditure – Capital	\$13.9M
Expenditure – Total	\$21.9M

Funds are being drawn from Reserves, Rates revenue and Grants to accommodate both operating and capital expenditure.

COVID - 19 Awareness

With increasing cases of new COVID-19 variants spreading in the community, the chance of reinfection is now more likely.

For this reason, the window for potential reinfection of COVID-19 has been reduced from after 12 weeks to after four weeks (28 days), based on the latest expert advice from the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC),

This means that effective immediately, recovered COVID-19 cases will be required to test for COVID-19 after 28 days, if experiencing symptoms, and follow the relevant advice if they test positive.

Free Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) for the WA community to ease cost of living pressures and support regular COVID-19 testing are available from the CRC in Menzies

It is important that people who have previously had COVID-19, irrespective of the variant, continue to receive the recommended COVID-19 vaccination doses, as prior infection alone will not provide sufficient protection against severe disease.

From Monday 11 July, 2022, the COVID-19 fourth dose is available and encouraged for anyone aged 30 and over.

This is in addition to the previous recommendations for a fourth dose, which remain in place for:

- all adults aged 65 years or older
- residents of aged care or disability care facilities
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 50 years or older
- people who are severely immunocompromised (external link) (this will be their fifth dose)
- people aged 16 years or older with a medical condition (external link) that increases the risk of severe COVID-19 illness
- people aged 16 years or older with disability, significant or complex health needs, or multiple comorbidities which increase the risk of a poor outcome






