THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT



On the Monday morning of the 15th August 2022, the Acting Chief Executive Officer and myself, along with President Malcolm Cullen, Shire of Coolgardie staff and the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder Chief Executive Officer and staff met with the Federal Assistant Minister for Senior Citizens for Social Services, Justine Elliot MP. The Assistant Minister is in the Goldfields for a week meeting with the Local Government and discussing the cessation of the Cashless Debit Card following the last Federal Election. It is anticipated there will be few problems transitioning out of the CDC card for those recipients on the benefits concerned as the numbers a very low in relation to the adjoining Local Governments.

On the morning of Thursday 18 August, Councillors attended a Risk Workshop with the Acting CEO. Following lunch the Briefing session was then held with those Councillors that were available.

As a follow up to preceding in person at Kalgoorlie on the Friday 19 August 2022, I joined a video conference hosted by Rick Wilson MLA, Federal Member for O'Connor. Those also participating were from the Local Governments of Leonora, Laverton, Coolgardie and Kalgoorlie who are all keen to keep the gains that have been made since the introduction of the trial of the CDC and the Federal Opposition plans to pursue the matter in Parliament

SHIRE NOTES

1. Sale of Land

Council has resolved to dispose of 21 and 23 Reid Street, Menzies, by an online auction on Saturday 17 September, 2022. Each lot will be auctioned separately. Details are on realestate.com.au

2. Lady Shenton Building (CRC)

Renovation work is continuing. Expenditure to date is \$513,000. It is estimated the renovations will be completed by December 2022 at which time the building will be fully functional again.

3. Horizon Power

Council has granted approval for the excision of some 5.6 ha of land from Reserve 49393, of Trafalga Street, Menzies, for the purpose of a renewable energy facility.

It is Horizon Powers intention to have Menzies transition to 100% renewable energy generation by 2025.

4. State Government Road Funding

Council has adopted a five year road upgrading program for submission to the Goldfields Esperance Regional Road Group for funding under the State/Local Government Road funding agreement.

The funding is distributed 1/3 Local Government contribution and 2/3 Main Road WA contribution.

Council has approved the following roads on nominated sections as the basis of the five year program:

- · 6090038 Kookynie Malcolm Road SLK 0.00 to SLK 5.56.
- 6090007 Menzies North West Road SLK 54.20 to SLK 66.78, SLK 57.83 to SLK 59.28, SLK 131.00 to 136.00 and SLK 151.52.
- · 6090013 Riverina Snake Hill Rd SLK 0.00 to SLK 34.96.
- 609008 Evanstone Menzies Road SLK 26.50 to SLK 27.31 including SLK 0.00 to SLK 0.67 on 6090010 Davyhurst Road.

5. Old Post Office Building

Council will give further consideration to the future of the Old Post Office building.

Consultants appointed to prepare a scope of works/specifications for the major renovations to the State Heritage listed building will report to Council on 29 September, 2022 on a way forward with the renovations.

\$936,000 has been budgeted for this project.

Restricted Burning Periods 1: 19 September 2022 to 31 October 2022 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2022.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2022.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravenedor permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period: From 1 November 2022 to 30 April 2023 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period.

Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2022.

Restricted Burning Periods 2: From 1 May 2023 to 31 May 2023 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened. You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

Unrestricted Season:

From 1 June 2023 to 18 September 2023 (inclusive)

SHIRE OF MENZIES

Notice to all Owners and /or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Menzies

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 38 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required, on or before 1 November 2022 to clear fire breaks and remove flammable material from land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder.

This work must be carried on or before 15 October 2022 and kept maintained throughout the summer months up to and including the 30 April 2023.

1.0 Land Outside Townsites

Buildings on land which are located outside townsites shall be surrounded by a fire break not less than two metres wide and that land inside the fire break shall be cleared of flammable material.

2.0 Land in Townsites

- 2.1 Where the area of land is 2,000sqm or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the land.
- 2.2 Where the area of land is 2,000sqm or more, fire breaks of at least 2.5metres wide shall be cleared of all flammable materials and in general comply with the requirements of the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Act 1931

3.0 Fuel Dumps/Tanks/Depots

Where there are flammable liquid or gas containers on the land, such and shall be cleared and kept clear of all flammable materials and in general comply with the requirements of the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Act 1961

4.0 General Provisions

The term "flammable Materials" for the purpose of this notice includes (as defined in the Bush Fires Act 1954) timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like materials, but does not include buildings, green standing trees and bushes or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns. If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear the land of flammable materials, you may apply to the Council for permission to prepare fire breaks in an alternative position. If such permission is not granted, you shall comply with the provisions of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954. The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$1,000 and a person is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing work directed by this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the required date.



Celebrating CDP remote based participants Gaining Skills and Qualifications

The Waalitj Foundation recently celebrated 14 Community Development Program (CDP) participants and 3 staff members from Laverton, Mount Margaret, and Leonora Communities (Yaaliku Region WA) through a Certificate Ceremony held at the Laverton Training Centre (An Initiative of Australian Potash). WA Regional Development Minister Alannah MacTiernan presented all students with Certificates on the day, acknowledging the training provided solid career pathways.

Nationally Accredited Vocational Training units in Senior First Aid, Basic Machinery and Ranger Training delivered by Central Regional TAFE formed part of a Certificate II in Rural Operations, tailored to align with genuine oncountry Northern Goldfields employment opportunities. This targeted approach allows locally accessible training with flexibility for students along with a culturally supportive learning environment.

Coordinated efforts commenced earlier this year (March 2022) as a broader partnership between the Waaiitj Foundation CDP Program Manager Blanca Cordulo, Mac Jensen (Laverton Training Centre Manager) and Sarah Sullivan (Australian Potash) working closely with lead Activity Supervisors Garry Adams and Chris Hediam.

"Through consistent dedication in engaging with students and their families, both Chris and Garry as lead Activity Supervisors have been able to retain 100% of attendance. Their work as leaders and mentors to students across local communities is commendable on every level* Blanca Corcluio, Waalitj Foundation.

From March this year, a number of Waalitj students have secured employment as a direct result of training, whilst other local businesses employing Waalitj participants are looking to increase capacity of their current employees.

Further planning and consultation continue into 2023 across the Region with additional partnerships formed supporting pre-employability including support securing identification and driver training programs delivered through a partnership with the Department of Justice and Department of Transport and local Shire Councils. Aboriginal Open Days have been well attended by staff and local participants. In-house support across Waalitj offices Regionally will also support regularity of these services with a person-centred approach.



SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR **PROSPECTING**

Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit

(\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office)

Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

Get written permission

- the tenement holder when prospecting on: a mining lease an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit) a prospecting licence

Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land many purposes.

Fill any holes that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.
