#### **Stock Grids**

The Council will soon be considering a new policy relating to the treatment of stock grids, after seeking legal advice.

The draft policy will be formally advertised for a period of 28 days seeking public input.

The reasoning behind the proposed policy related to the cost of installing grids, maintaining grids, how grids should be paid for and the legal liability of the council relating to grids, especially if they are not maintained adequately.

The Local Government (Uniform Local Provisions) Regulations 1996 defines a grid as a 'device' and therefore comes under the Council's 'care, control and management' if installed in a council controlled road. The policy therefore is crucial to protect the council's interests, especially from a legal liability point of view.

The proposed draft policy will soon be on the Council's website with instructions as to how and when to make a submission.

#### **Royal Flying Doctor**

The council has resolved to consider, in next financial year's budget, an annual donation of \$11,100.00 to the Royal Flying Doctor for the next five years.

The donation was considered at the request of the Goldfields Voluntary Regional Association of Councils (GVROC) which, in turn, had had a request from the Shire of Leonora. The Shire of Leonora has been donating, over the past five years, \$100,000.00 each year and sought assistance from the other Goldfields councils to share that cost over the next five years.

The matter has yet to be finalised as it will need to be considered with all other financial matters that come up during the budget process.

#### **Recruitment of CEO**

At its April Council Meeting, a report was considered by the Council relating to the recruitment of a permanent CEO. Although that report was adjourned until the May meeting, the matters in the report are generating significant discussion among Councillors.

The appointment of a CEO in Local Government is generally considered one of the more important decisions that Councils make, as one of the main responsibilities of the CEO is to cause Council decisions to be implemented.

The recruitment of the CEO is also a very regulated process with many amendments to the Local Government Act and Regulations being put in place in the past two years. The process can take a few months to complete.

Also, with many changes now before Parliament being proposed for the Local Government Act, the appointment is even more crucial as another of the CEO's statutory responsibilities is to advise the Council about its functions under the Act.

The process of recruiting a CEO is recognised by the Council as being crucial and when internet problems impacted some councillors from fully participating, the decision to adjourn was welcomed to ensure full and fair discussion.

#### **Council Meeting held in Tjuntjuntjarra**

The Aboriginal Community of Tjuntjuntjarra is located some 800 km to the east of the Menzies town-site. If travelling by car, the trip is long and demanding, although very interesting.

The Council Meeting for April was held in Tjuntjuntjarra, with some councillors attending in person and others electronically. The Council holds two meetings per year in Tjuntjuntjarra and provides an opportunity to councillors and staff alike to experience this remote community which is such an important part of the Menzies community.

It was a pleasure to be welcomed to the Community and to see the facilities, especially the art and creative facilities, with many artists busily at work producing the now well known 'dot' paintings so familiar to many of us. A book has even been produced of very high quality soon to be launched at the WA Museum (Boola Bardip).

The next meeting of the Council in Tjuntjuntjarra will be in September.

# LOCAL PUBLIC NOTICE PROPOSED POLICY RELATING TO STOCK GRIDS

The Council is proposing to consider a new Policy relating to Stock Grids.

A stock grid is a device installed into a road to restrict the movement of stock, especially when a fence or gate would be inconvenient or dangerous.

When a proposal to install a grid in a road under the Council's 'care, control and maintenance' it can only be done so with the Council's authority.

Submissions are invited from members of the public relating to the proposed policy.

The submission period will extend until 6 June 2023.





The Lions Cancer Institute (LCI) will be providing a free Skin Cancer Screening in Menzies on 13 May 2023. This free service provides for the early detection of skin lesions and where a lesion is identified a referral is made to your GP for further investigation. For booking information contact 08 9024 2702

The LCI is a project of the Lions Clubs of Western Australia. Since early 1990's LCI has been providing full body skin screening clinics throughout Western Australia, with an emphasis on Screening the remote and rural areas of the state.



From humble beginnings the Volunteers of LCI have screened over 80 000 patients and our records show that

with the annual rate of referrals to a GP is in the order of 27% (21,600) and lesions suspected of being life threatening are at 6% (1260). Early detection of lesions will save lives and lessen the need for invasive surgery.

LCI's screening program is supported by qualified volunteer Dermatologists, Plastic Surgeons, Dermoscopists and GP's.



Funding for LCI's screening programs and research grants is provided by donations from Lions Clubs of WA, Business and from the public.

We are currently raising funds to replace our two ageing screening units with one purpose built unit. Donations can be made to The Lions Cancer Institute at WESTPAC BANK, BSB 036-107 ACCOUNT 218 557.

# **History**



### **GOLDMINES AND MEMORIES By Rod Baker**

Rod Baker was born in Kalgoorlie, and has always had a fascination with Goldfields History. The Father of three is retired and lives in Perth, however he regularly visits the region to 'do a bit of prospecting and visit some of the old ghost towns in the Northern Goldfields'. Here is his Local History contribution for this month.

#### **Business in Menzies in 1900**

This information comes from a Business Directory of those operating in Menzies as hoteliers, grocers/ storekeepers and general retailers servicing a population of around 10,000 people in 1900. Most of the businesses were owned and run by individuals or partnerships who lived in the town. Where Branch is indicated means there is a head office located in Fremantle, Perth or Kalgoorlie and that particular store has a Branch Manager. It is interesting to note three Jewellers were operating in Menzies during this period when there were very few women in the Northern Goldfields. .





# **History**





### **History of the Goldfields Cyclassic**

The Menzies to Kalgoorlie race has a magnificent history. The race had its origins in 1928, following a discussion at a race club meeting where there was a concern at the lack of distance races on the Goldfields.

Messrs J. Richards, JC Walsh, Chas Egan along with a small committee set about organising a long-distance event. Their choice of starting point was the small mining town of Menzies, 81 miles north of Kalgoorlie. Many businessmen of the Goldfields supported the venture and, on the King's birthday, June 1928 at 8.00am, the limit men were sent away for the first "Menzies". Twenty-four riders started in this event.

From its inauguration in 1928 until 1932, the race was known as the Menzies-Kalgoorlie Road Race, but two days before the race of that year, Charlie Egan, the well-liked and highly respected secretary of the club, tragically died, and all riders in the race that year wore black armbands as a token of respect. It was decided later that the race should, in future, be known as the "Chas Egan Memorial Race".


Mention of the Menzies Classic is not complete without some comment on the road. During the first five years, the term "road" could hardly apply to the bush track, rough, ripply and sandy, that connected Menzies to Kalgoorlie, and the stretch from Menzies to Comet Vale was a cyclist's nightmare, being almost axle deep sand.


By the late thirties, the road improved. Although it was still far from perfect, at least by then a cyclist could heave a sigh of relief when he reached bitumen at Broad Arrow, instead of bumping over ripples, skidding into ruts and ploughing through sand for the rest of the journey right into Hannan Street, as the early cyclists did.

The inaugural winner R. Bennets won the race in a time of 5 hours and 55 minutes, 45 seconds to cover the 81 miles from Menzies to Kalgoorlie. The great road rider R. Hudson set a high benchmark with the fastest time in the inaugural handicapped race of 4 hours and 48 minutes, 45 seconds, and would go on to win the next two Menzies to Kalgoorlie Road Races.

#### Your rights on runaway rents

A lack of available rental homes in Western Australia means it's becoming harder and more expensive for many tenants to keep a roof over their heads.

With Goldfields-Esperance median rents reportedly sitting at \$500 per week, existing tenants may be asked to pay more to remain in the same property.

There are strict rules surrounding how often rent increases are allowed to happen – they can only occur after the first six months of a new tenancy agreement and on a half-yearly basis thereafter in both fixed-term and periodic leases.

Tenants in financial difficulty who miss (or expect to miss) a rental payment are urged to explain their situation to their landlord or property manager as soon as possible. A landlord might agree to a rent reduction for a period of time, waive a payment or agree to defer payment over a longer timeframe.

While market forces generally determine rental prices, if a tenant believes what they're paying is too high, they should try negotiating with the landlord before applying to the Magistrates Court requesting a reduction, or to argue against a proposed increase.

The court will consider a range of factors, including whether the rent is comparable to similar properties nearby and what the property costs the landlord in upkeep. The cost of services and contents provided will also be taken into account, along with the property's general condition and whether the rent is simply being raised to force the tenant out.

When it comes to securing a new property, some prospective tenants may offer more than the advertised price in a practice known as 'rent bidding'.

While there is no current legislation relating to rent bidding, Consumer Protection can investigate if there is evidence that a landlord or agent has advertised a rental property for a set price, but subsequently insisted that prospective tenants pay more than what was advertised to secure the home.

#### Beware the new breed of bank scams

Scammers have been pretending to call or text from financial institutions for years, but it's the latest twist on these banking impersonation scams that should have all consumers on high alert.

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) raised the alarm after reports to Scanwatch indicated new technology was being used to make scam calls look like they were coming from the bank's legitimate phone number and to allow scam texts to appear in the same conversation thread as genuine bank messages.

These tricks mean it may not be possible for consumers to distinguish a real message or call from those that aren't based on a phone number or message thread alone, and sadly many are falling victim.

Since January 2022, our WA ScamNet team has heard from 20 victims who reportedly lost \$1.9 million to bank impersonation scams. When you consider that's an average loss of almost \$96,000 per person, it's clear just how financially and emotionally devastating these scams can be.

One WA victim's bank account was drained of almost \$41,000, after she answered a call from the same number as one listed on the back of her credit card. Posing as a bank employee, the scammer claimed her accounts had been hacked as a ruse to gain control of her finances.

A big red-flag is communications that come with a sense of urgency, such as claims of fraudulent activity or a frozen account. No matter how legitimate the call or message seems, a bank will never ask you to urgently transfer funds.

We urge all WA consumers to 'practice the pause' to stop scammers in their tracks. If you receive an SMS with a phone number to call, do not use it. Instead, call your bank direct on a number you have sourced yourself. Likewise, hang up if you receive a call from someone claiming to be from your bank requesting you to transfer money to 'keep it safe'. Ask for a reference number and call your bank back using contact details you have found independently.

Never provide online banking passwords, one-time security codes, pins or tokens to anyone over the phone.

#### Avoid being billed for paper bills

Next time you spot a bill in the letterbox, it could be worth looking into whether you're being charged extra to receive this correspondence in the mail and how you might avoid paying the fee if so.

A growing number of service providers now charge a fee to cover the costs of printing and posting your bill. That list recently expanded to include Telstra, which reportedly cited 'environmental reasons' as the reason many of its customers would need to pay \$2.20 each time they received a bill in the mail after 20 May 2023.

Not all of Telstra's customers will need to pay the paper billing fee – those who have a valid health care, pension concession or Department of Veteran's Affairs card are exempt. The charge will also not apply to customers who don't have an email address or access to an active internet service, as well as those who require special bill formats, such as braille or large print.

There are numerous reasons why other companies may elect to not charge fees, such as those customers who receive income support or are on a hardship program.

The best way to find out if you are eligible for an exemption is to contact each of your providers to ask if you qualify for an exemption from paper bill fees, and how to apply.

If you're not eligible, then the easiest way to avoid paying a paper billing fee is to switch to online billing and receive your bills by email or via the company's app or website.

Over the course of a year, these charges for paper billing all add up, especially for people on a low income. By opting out of paper billing or claiming the fee exemption, you could save a considerable amount each year.

Also remember to be wary about fake billing scams via phone calls or emails. Scammers sometimes try to trick consumers by sending emails that look like they are from a legitimate company. The email may ask you to send money for an overdue account.
