

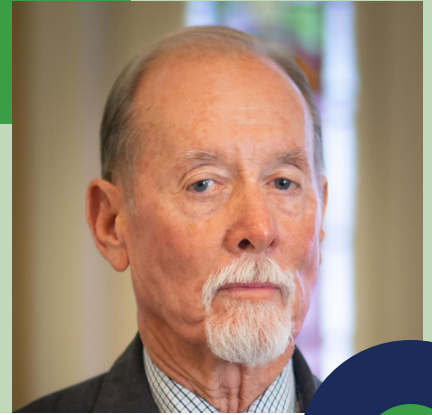

MESSAGE FROM THE Shire President



Presidents Report July 2023

On 30 June, Cr Jill Dwyer and I attended the Northern Goldfields Working Group (NGWG) meeting in Leonora, which coincided with being the last day of the CEO Jim Epis of Leonora, before retirement.

President Patrick Hill, Laverton, spoke about National Roads Congress in Canberra and Outback Highway AGM in Alice Springs with invites to members of the NGWG to attend. Transport, Water, Tourism and Alcohol issue are the ongoing discussion points for the group at the quarterly meetings.

On 12 July, Robert, Acting CEO and I took part in a video conference of a General Meeting of the Midwest Yilgarn Infrastructure Group in Menzies. Guest speaker, David Trotter from the Mineral Research Institute of Western Australia spoke about the Western Australian Green Steel Opportunity Report that had been released recently.

Other items of note were updates from management of Esperance and Geraldton Ports.

On 18 July, Robert and I attended an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act educational workshop in Kalgoorlie to learn about the new Act.

The new Act, which has been creating some controversy, came into effect on 1 July 2023 and replaces the 1972 Act. It creates three tiers of activity requiring different responses from proponents. Tier 3 is the highest level of activity and will require a management plan, Aboriginal Cultural Heritage, consultation among other things. All tiers will require proof of 'due diligence' but there exists a long list of exempt activities requiring no action.

Along with the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs there were many people from the mining sector in attendance.

On Friday 21 July, Robert and I attended a Thank You Function of the Eastern Goldfields Cycle Club for the Sponsors, Supporters, Volunteers and Members at the Hannans Club in Kalgoorlie. Sponsors were presented with framed photos and jerseys of the Menzies Classic/Cyclclassic 2023 Event.

The Acting CEO has advised me that he intends to take personal leave from 7 August to 11 August inclusive.

In accordance with Policy 5.1 (Acting CEO or Temporary Employment of CEO) when the CEO is absent for greater than 48 hours, he/she must appoint an Acting CEO for the period of leave up to five weeks.

In accordance with the policy that appointment is required to be the Chief Financial Officer.

Menzies Community School off to the Gold Coast

With the assistance of the Shire of Menzies, students from Menzies Community School will soon be off to Brisbane and the Gold Coast in Queensland.

Menzies Shire President said that when the request for assistance for the trip came before the Council, there was unanimous support for a financial donation of \$50,000.00.

'Children in remote locations don't get the same opportunities as children in the city' he said, 'and this opportunity to assist children in Menzies to fly to Queensland to further their education was too good to pass up.'

The trip has also received the support of the School Council and the Chair of the School Council Joy Oliver, who is also the District Nurse, sang the praises of the initiative.

'These children have never been on an aeroplane, let alone travelled across the country.' she said.

The adventure has been many months in the planning, including giving assurances to parents that their children would be well looked after.

School Principal Megan Irving commented that just feeding 20 children on a daily basis was a logistical headache, not to mention transport, accommodation, clothing and money.

'This just wouldn't have been possible without the help of the Shire, the Menzies Aboriginal Corporation and the School Council.' she said. 'In fact, the whole community has been incredibly supportive.'

The trip of a lifetime will leave Kalgoorlie on 26 August and return on 1 September 2023, with, no doubt a lifetime of memories.

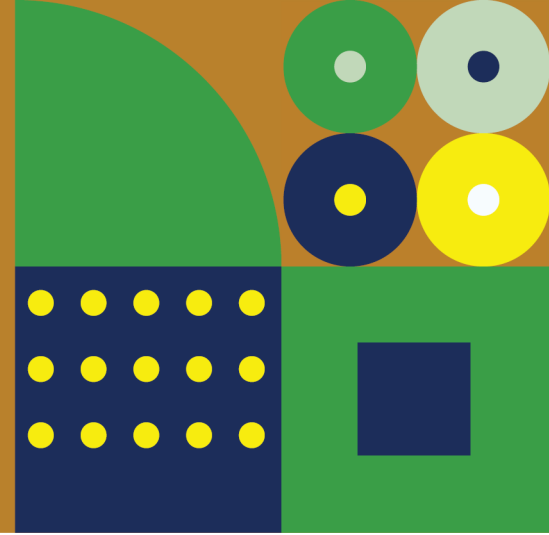

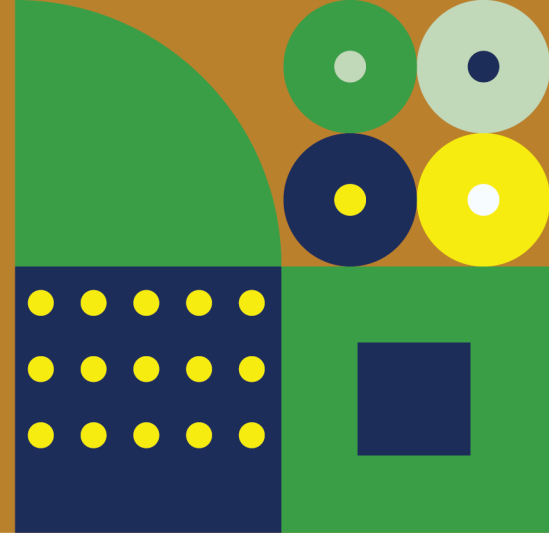

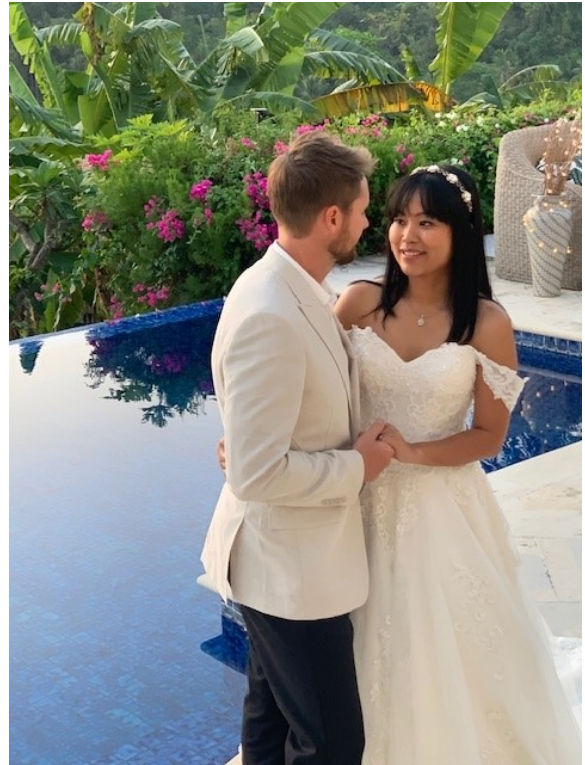

To the editor

Could you please advise whether mining tenement holders are eligible to vote at the upcoming elections. If so how do they go about registering? If a mining company has several tenements do they get a vote for each property?

Thank you

To be considered for enrolment as an elector on the Owners and Occupiers Roll the mining tenement holder would need to submit an Enrolment Eligibility Claim Form (Form 2 - as prescribed and included in the Local Government (Election) Regulations 1997). For a copy, please come to the Shire of Menzies administration building or email: admin@menzies.wa.gov.au

Each elector only has one vote in each Ward of the District, or one vote in the district if there are no Wards. They can check their enrolment at on the WA Electoral Commission website: <https://www.elections.wa.gov.au/oes#/oec>

Each application will be different, and it is necessary to check the Enrolment Eligibility Claim against the requirements of the Act. Division 8 - Sections 4.29 – 4.35 of the Local Government Act 1995 set out the eligibility for enrolment and the process. Part 3 of the Local Government (Elections) Regulations 1997 includes detail on the enrolment eligibility requirements. The requirements include if the applicant owns or occupies rateable property in a district or ward but are not on the residents roll in that district or ward and to qualify as an occupier they must have a right, under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument, to be in continuous occupation of the property for at least the next 3 months.

Companies holding mining tenements must nominate an "Occupier", who will need to register as advised above. Only one Occupier can registered per company, not per each mining tenement.

In the past we have read an article on truancy from the head mistress. Probably the most important information for the benefit of all. Perhaps it should be published every month just to be a reminder.

A report of what is happening with the community garden would also be newsworthy. Perhaps what is needed is a roving reporter to collect snippets of information and share with the community via "Menzies Matters". Would there be any volunteers?

In Menzies we have many people who have unknown skills. What could be done by the new Community Development Officer is to do a human resources audit. We may be surprised by the skills within our community that could be made available to everyone including the Shire, instead of using expensive consultants from Kalgoorlie or Perth the expertise would come from the community. I could do with some IT support at the moment while I'm studying for my Cert II, to fill the gaps in my education.

We read the Shire Presidents report of the councils trip to Canberra to attend the Local Government Convention. Seven people in all. There was plenty of socialising and I hope some new ideas will be forthcoming. I hope that there will be value for money to improve the town. We are still waiting for the past approved project to beautify the main street. If history is read, we know that many problems of small towns have been solved within their communities without outside assistance. Because the problems are unique to their own towns. Menzies has a dilapidated building problem. When is the owner of the Roadhouse going to modernise the building and bring the business back to its success?

Other groups from the Shire are making an effort to restore the buildings on the railway corridor. Thank goodness. We can't expect the Shire to do all the work.

Through the gossip I have heard of some very expensive plans for the old post office and before someone goes and waste money let me type my thoughts from my recent experiences. Since I have lived in Menzies, I have met members of the visiting public who have had past family members living in Menzies. One young man's name was Suter. A name that will be found on the foundation stone of the town hall. At the time I did not know the significance of Mr. Suter. If I had I would have been able to tell the great grandson, the story. Another story from a member of the visiting public was the story of a shop that was disassembled and loaded onto a railway wagon and transferred to Bruce Rock to re-establish the building and business. Would that activity happen today?

These records of history could be retyped into larger print and laminate the pages to be placed around an internal perimeter bench in the large room of the old post office where visitors could read the history of their forefathers. This would be a good purpose for the old building and within budget.

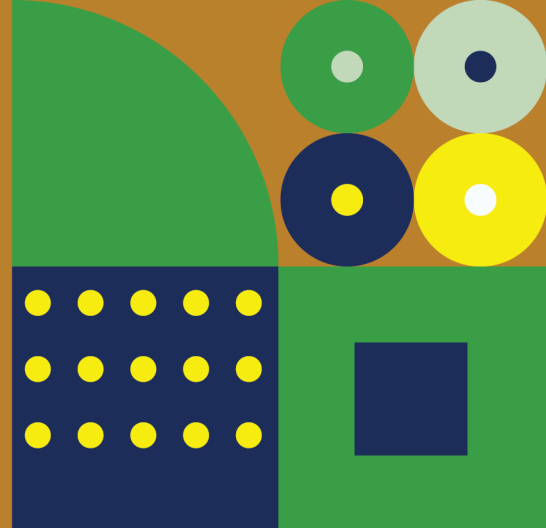

1080 BAITING in this area is a risk to domestic pets

Using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australian, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

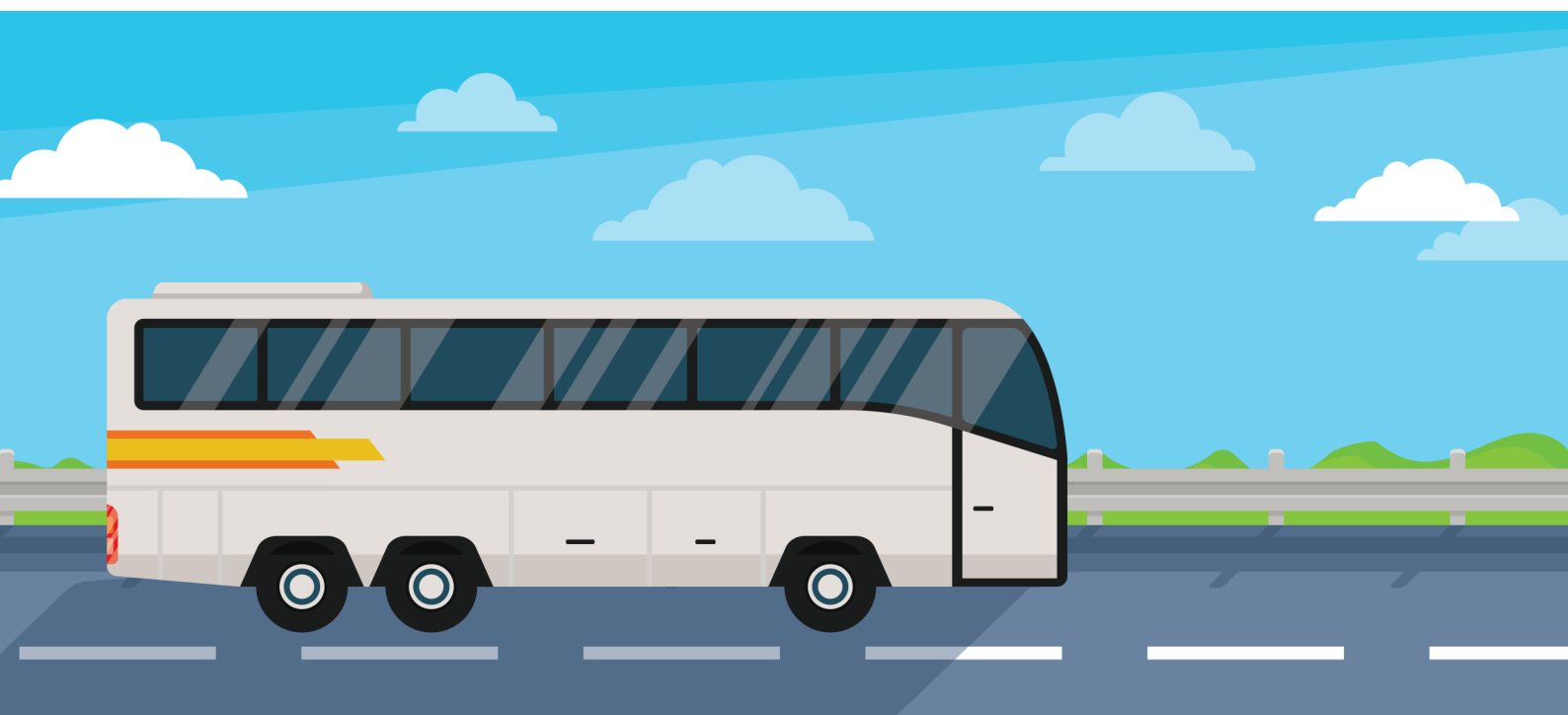

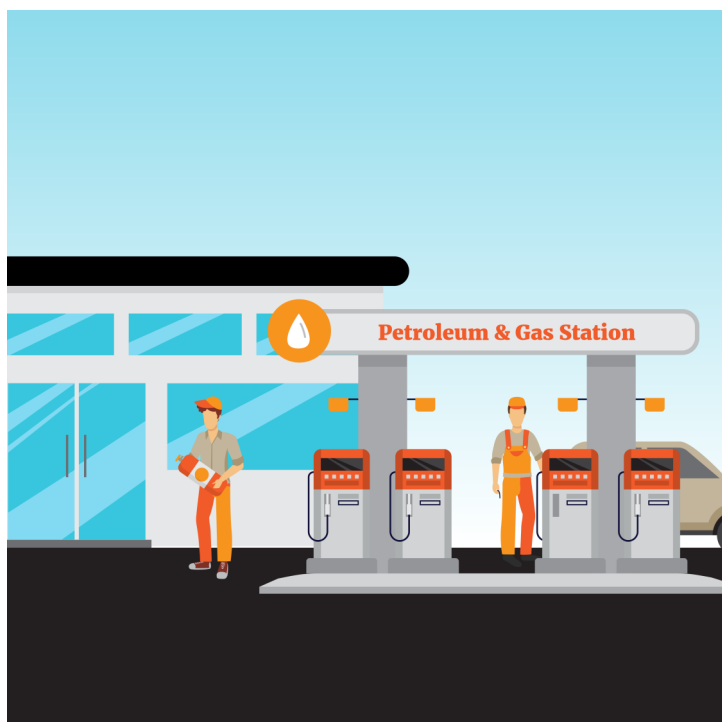
