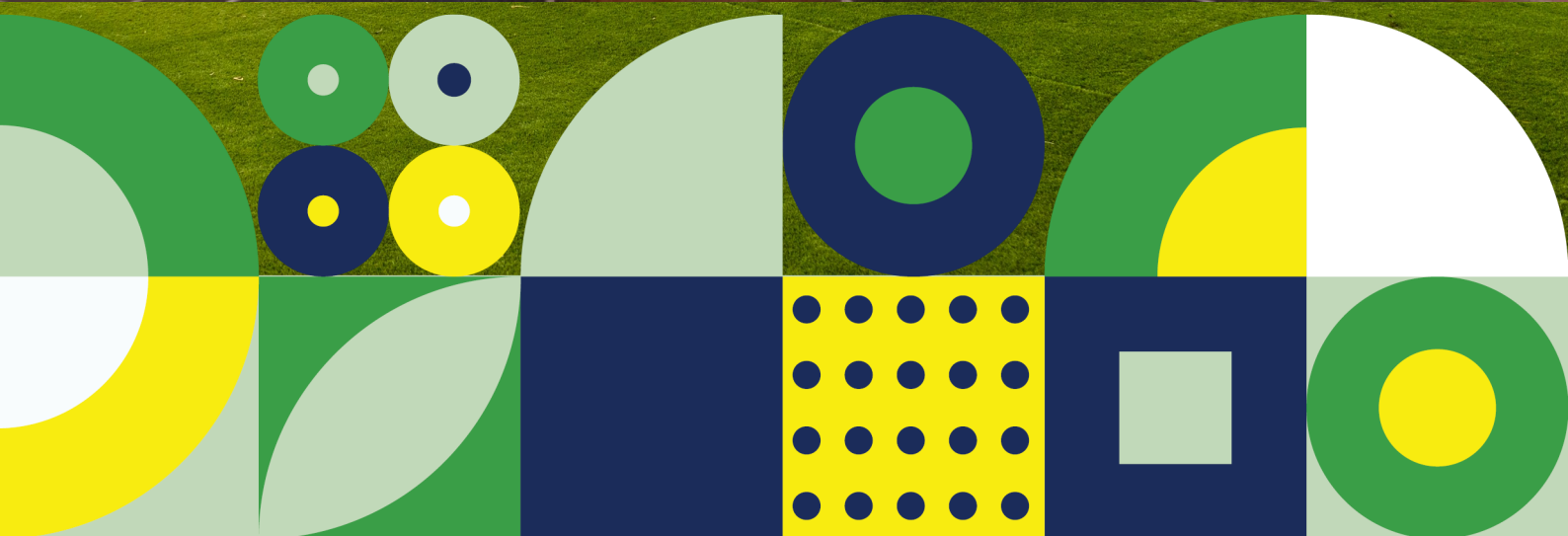

Work Report



Works Report to 22nd January 2024

Contract Grading.

Only a few days of grading was carried out in early December. Operator has been away and will start back today, but will be working directly with our own crew.

Heavy rain in January resulted in severe damage to Malcolm Road and Mt Remarkable Road.

The damage has been coned off, but is still a danger to traffic. Gravel will be hauled from Kookynie Tip using our truck and then graded out with contract grader. Our roller will be used for crushing.

Shire Grader

Work has been carried out on Menzies NW Road and on Mt Ida Road. This will be continued in the near future, but for the present our operator will assist with Malcolm Road and Mt Remarkable Road when he returns on Wednesday 24th January.

Town Work

Heavy winds has caused damage to some infrastructure. Sails have been torn off the water park and children's playground and at seating area near hotel. The one near the hotel has been re-fastened, but a pole at the water park has been damaged and will need replacing. New sails will be ordered once the new pole is erected.

Garbage collection was carried out over Christmas without any problem and has now resumed as normal. The garbage truck has had a small problem with the hydraulics which appears to be connected with a worn pump and hot oil. However, normal operation occurs when oil is not too hot. If the problem persists we will need to replace PTO pump.

There has been plenty to do with cleaning up wind blown rubbish, leaves and some trees and branches.

Recent heavy rain has promoted growth and there is always weed control necessary.

Protective Bollards have been placed at the café and arrangements have been made for large gas tanks to be installed.

Other

The new vehicle ordered to replace Prado 1MN is being collected presently. A decision on what to do with old vehicle, eg auctioning, will need to be made.

The new drop deck trailer for the grader camp has been ordered and will take several months to arrive. Side Tippers Australia are seeking permission to haul ore on Mt Celia Road, Pinjin Road and Yarri Road. I have no problems provided they have a firm agreement to maintain Roads and grids in good condition. The matter is before Main Roads.

Power has been laid to the new staff house, but we are still waiting on final connection to the houses and also on water meters to both houses. This has been discussed with relevant persons.

Drop offs include - Kalgoorlie Regional Hospital/Medical Centre, St Barbara's Square, Woolworth, and Coles.

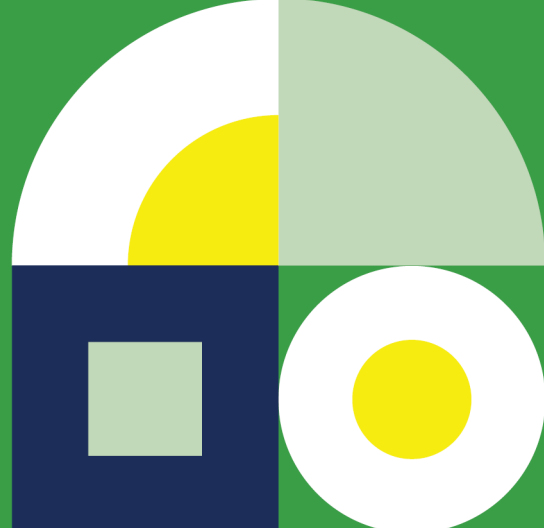

The improvements of the Hotel and the Diner came from Private enterprise and that is what we have to encourage. If we are to re-invent the Rodeo we have to ask our selves who are going to benefit. Menzies has only has 2 proprietors. The only answer to that question is that we must charge the stall holder's a fee and a participants entrance fee if that can be engineered.

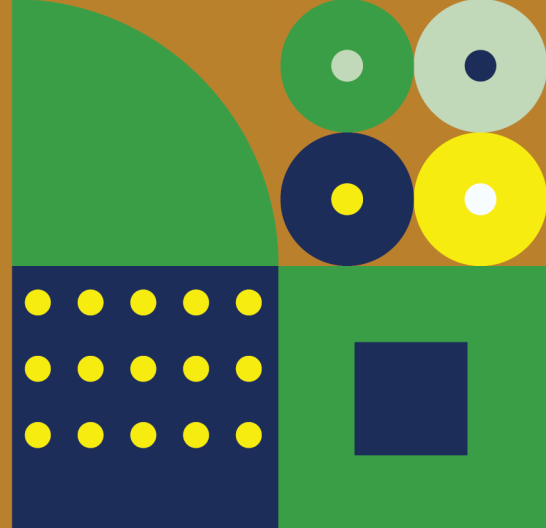

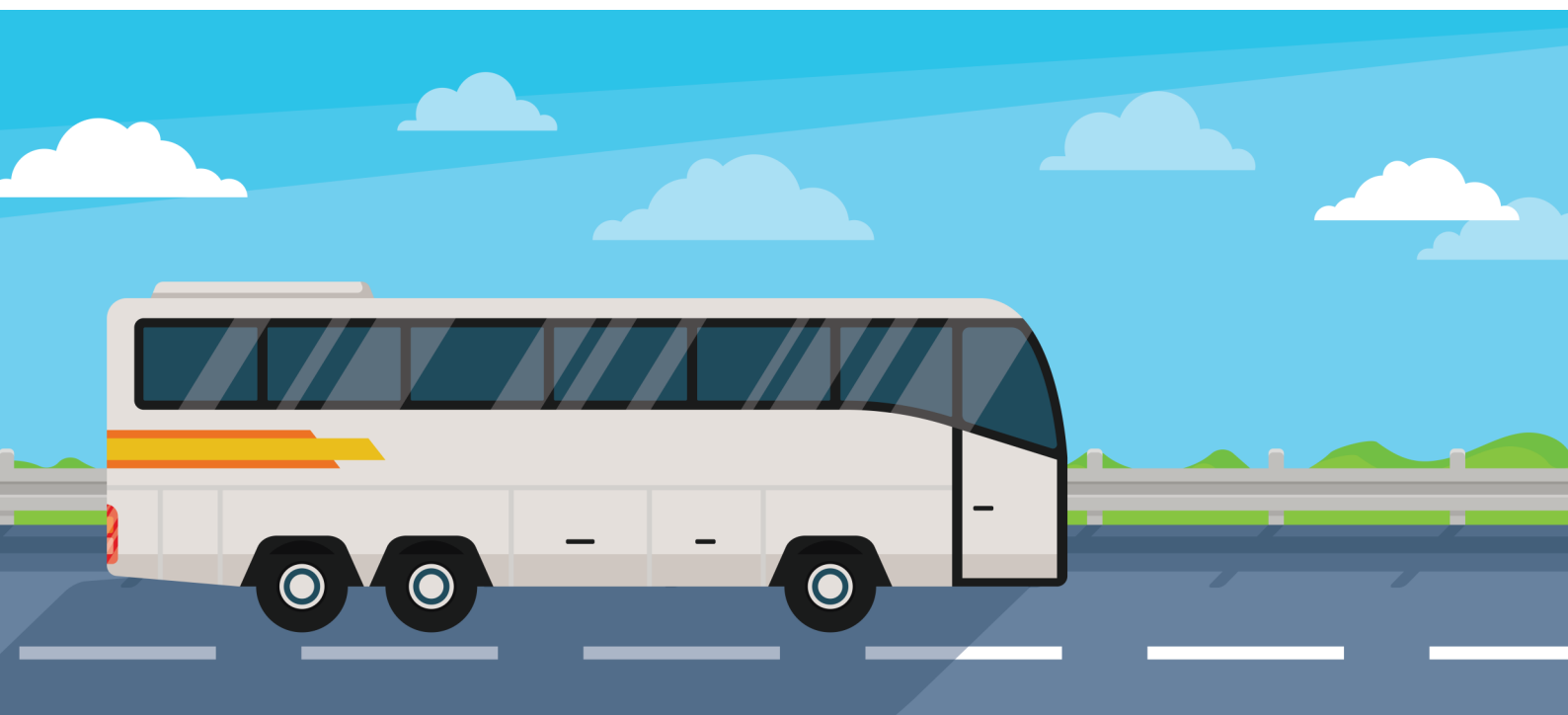

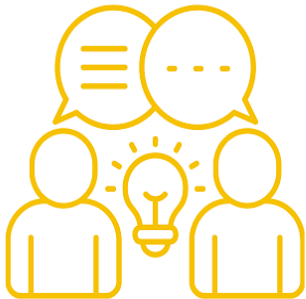

It's been too darn hot for too long in the gardens without the rains we so desire.

I along with most garden lovers are in mourning for things that simply just could not tolerate the heat without withering away. Suffering from the long days of sun, wind and above average scorches that burnt the leaves and roasted the roots.

No amount of water could save some poor plants as the soil temperatures rose to over 50C .

There is nowhere better to see the results of this than out in the bush, where this year the Sandalwoods in our area have failed to flower or fruit and are dying back. We really do need to see some significant rain this season or we will be losing them in large numbers.

The additional stress of relentless winds over January adding to the garden woes.



There were some stand out survivors in the early part of the month like the Capsicum and Cucumbers and the old standby Zucchini. Red Hot Chilli peppers as well in abundance.

I would love to add tomatoes to the food bowl but they are in the deceased category and any that may have looked like a possibility have been raided by the Bower Birds.

I must confess I do find these birds attractive in colour, rather shy even. We do enjoy them visiting the bird baths and water stations around the garden.

Water just makes for great reconnaissance missions by the family of 5 that visit here, seeking out what is ready to eat. The colour " Red "when it shows on the capsicum means that they are eaten or tasted by these loveable rogues.

The flowering Hibiscus have provided some joy and food for the bees over the Summer and they have put on quite a show along with the Bougainvillea around the neighbourhood. Hibiscus are standout performers all through Summer with several flushes of flowers and a wide variety of colours to choose from. Well worth seeking them out for your garden. Let's hope we can add to the rainfall this month .



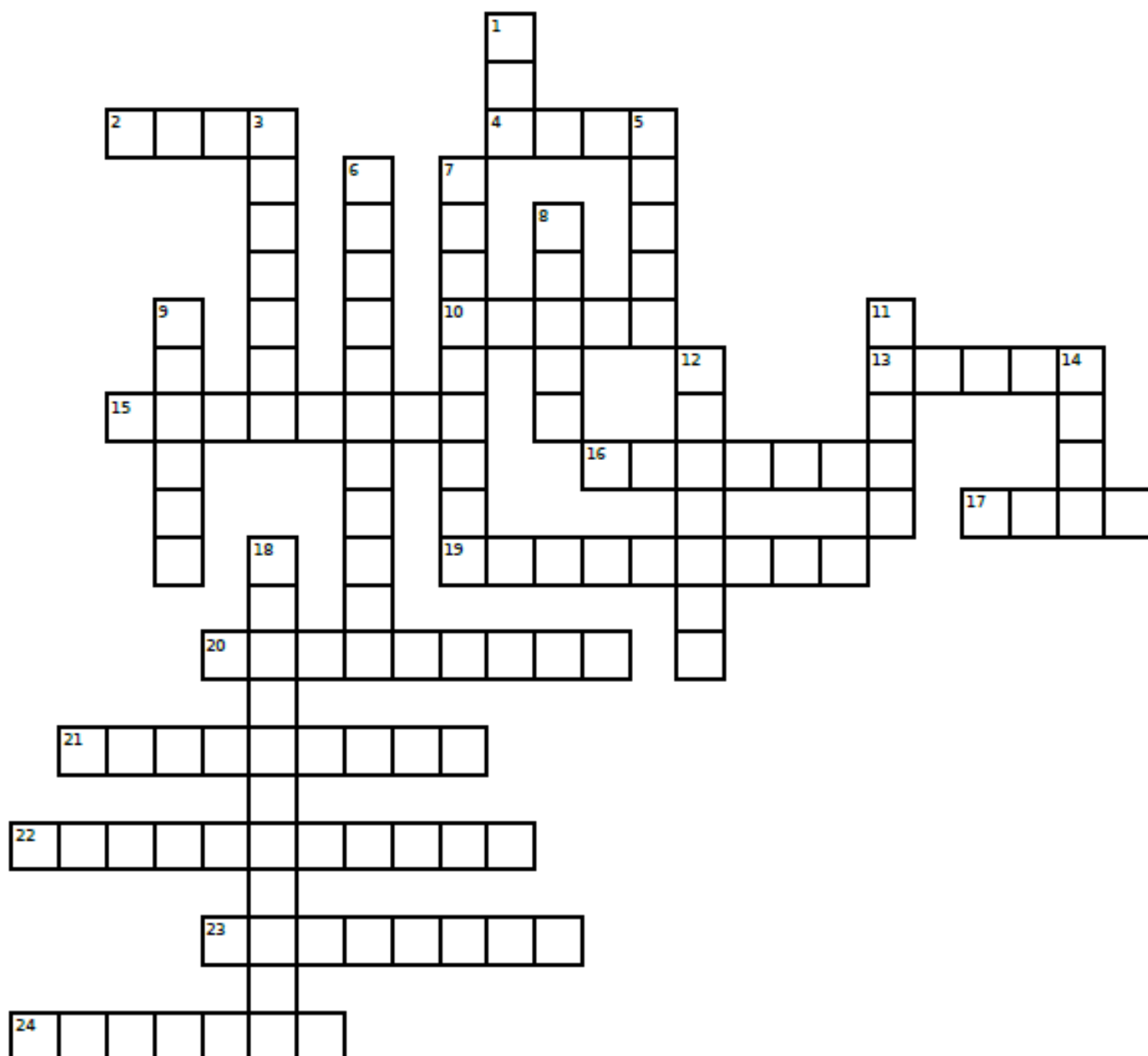
Just an update on the rainfall for January.

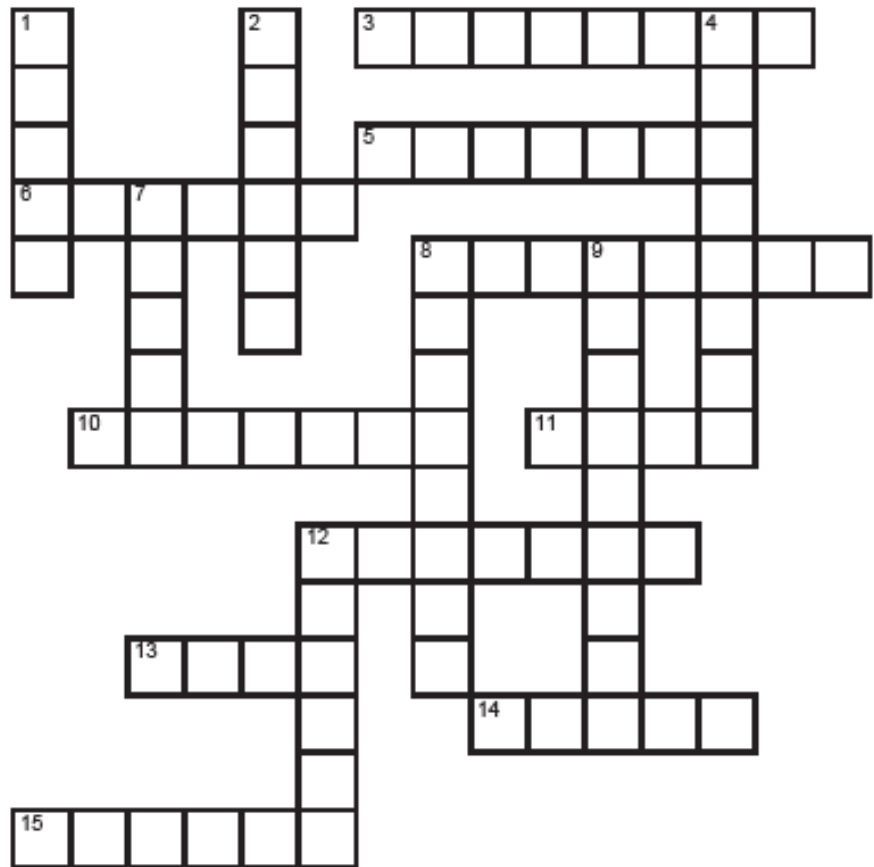
