Shire President's Report

It has been a relatively quiet month, with consistent rainfall bringing a welcome freshness to the town and surrounds.

Shire of Menzies Acknowledges the Service of Former Councillor Greg Dwyer

The Shire of Menzies has acknowledged the service of former councillor Greg Dwyer, whose resignation from the Shire Council surprised many as it is just before local government elections, to be held in October.

Mr Dwyer was first elected to the Council in 1995 and served until 2003. He was again elected in 2009 and served until 2015, before being elected again in 2017, where he remained a councillor until his resignation in July 2025. As a councillor and as Shire President he led the Council fearlessly and was respected across the Goldfields-Esperance region for his knowledge of the region, his love for the Menzies District and the Northern Goldfields as well as his dry wit.

Greg championed the history of Menzies, Kookynie and Niagara and always lobbied for the retention of historical structures, including the Lady Shenton building in Menzies (now CRC and post office) and the former post office in Menzies. The heritage-listed Niagara Dam also featured on his list of things that needed 'fixing'.

A further passion was the Kalgoorlie, Menzies and Leonora annual bicycle event, the Goldfields Cyclassic, which was always supported by the Shire of Menzies. Mr Dwyer hoped that the event would keep going until its centenary.

My Dwyer's knowledge of local government, his quiet but assertive leadership and passion for the District will be sorely missed by other Councillors and indeed the whole community. Councillors will hold a special event for the former councillor in the near future.

Cobb & Co. Coaches

Cobb & Co., originally owned by I.J. Cohn, arrived in Western Australia in 1880 and secured the Royal Mail contract for the Perth–Albany route. In 1894, the business was sold to Marwick and Wilkinson, but just two years later it was purchased by Nicholas and Kidman (later Sir Sidney) for £10,000. They retained the Cobb & Co. name and expanded services to the booming Goldfields. The investment quickly paid off, as transport during the gold rush was in high demand. Coaches ran regular routes between Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, Bulong, Edjudina, Broad Arrow, Paddington, Menzies, Niagara, Mount Malcolm, Laverton, Leonora, Lawlers, Wiluna, Black Range, and Mount Magnet.


In March 1896, following heavy rains near Cane Grass and Goongarrie, the Menzies coach encountered a torrent of floodwater near the Cane Grass Swamp Hotel. Other teamsters waited for the waters to subside, but the coachlightly loaded with mail and four passengers, and drawn by a strong team—pressed on under driver Mr. McCannon. At 4:30 p.m. they attempted the crossing. After 60 yards, the current swept the lead horses off their

feet. Despite McCannon's efforts, the frightened team turned back toward land. The pole horses and coach lurched, nearly overturning.

One passenger, Mr. Kennedy, leapt from the coach door and swam to nearby saplings, while the others climbed onto the roof for safety. Another passenger, Mr. Welford, cut at the harness to free the team. After a desperate struggle, he managed to release the leaders, but the pole horses, thrashing wildly, could not be freed and were drowned in the torrent.


Fortunately, the driver, passengers, and mail all survived.



Next Sunday's train will travel right through to Menzies, so those desirous of seeing the northern centre may do so. The journey, however, may be broken at any stage. and those in search of flowers may alight wheresoever the train stops. 



Letter to the Editor


