



From the Ordinary Meeting of Council held Thursday 31 October 2013

POLICY – INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY – ACCESS AND USE: Council has formally adopted a policy on the access and use of information technology with Shire owned facilities. This policy will be included in Council's Policy Manual and sets the standards for Councillors and employees using Shire computer equipment.

LOCAL LAWS – NIAGRA DAM RESERVE: Council has gone through the process of making a local law and has now formerly adopted the law. The proposal will now be forwarded on to the Minister for his approval. Once that has been provided, the law will be advertised in the Government Gazette and will then become a legal law. The law has been created to control the use of firearms and motor cycles in the Niagara Dam Reserve.

POLICY – HOUSING BONDS AND KEEPING OF PETS: This policy has been made to ensure that Shire employees or persons occupying Shire housing pay a special bond when keeping pets, specifically dogs. It will have the power to recoup cleaning costs from exiting tenants if the house is not cleaned properly, thereby protecting Council from undue costs.


LORD MAYOR'S DISTRESS RELIEF FUND: Council has agreed to donate \$1,000 to the Perth Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund to assist Western Australians in times of emergencies. Many persons have been the recipients of this fund when they have been devastated by floods or bush fires.

APPOINTMENT OF COMPLAINTS OFFICER: Council has appointed the Chief Executive Officer as a Complaints Officer. This is a requirement under the *Local Government Act* 1995 and is designed for administrative processes when there have been perceived breaches of the *Local Government Act* 1995.

APPOINTMENT OF PUBLIC INTEREST DISCLOSURE OFFICER: Council has appointed the Deputy Chief Executive Officer as the Public Interest Disclosure Officer in accordance with the Public Interest Disclosure Act 2003. This Act provides a contact person for the disclosure of public interest and also ensures that the identity of the person making the a public interest disclosure is not made public.

MAIN STREET MEDIAN STRIP UPGRADE: Council has now approved a final design for the upgrade of the median strip in Shenton Street. Construction of this project will be completed before 30 June 2014 and will complete the main street upgrade started a few years ago.




The Railway Man (M)

Starring: Colin Firth, Nicole Kidman

Eric Lomax, a psychologically damaged survivor of the Thai-Burma Railway who



Unfortunately, Australian director Jonathan Teplitzky has not found a way to give Lomax's tale the dramatic weight, narrative tension or emotional charge it deserves. Such a pity because Colin Firth gives a powerful performance as the older Lomax, subtly embodying a man tormented by the horror of what happened to him while enslaved with thousands of other British soldiers in the wake of the taking of Singapore, yet a military man with enough steel to face up to one of his captors. Teplitzky spares us little in the depiction of the building of the railway, with dozens of painfully emaciated men struggling to stay alive in the face of the breathtaking cruelty of their overlords.

But in moving between scenes of the young Lomax (Jeremy Irvine) being punished relentlessly for a relatively minor crime, and the post-war story in which Eric's wife Patti (Nicole Kidman) struggles to cope with her husband's nightmares, the film struggles to establish a satisfying suspense and momentum.



LAMINGTONS FOR AUSTRALIA DAY

Any type of plain cake can be used for these lamingtons - sponge cake, pound cake or Madeira cake. Ideally, make the cake the day before for best results, but the important thing is that the cake is completely cooled before icing. Serves 24

Ingredients


- Cake
- 2 cups plain flour
- 4 teaspoons baking powder
- pinch of salt
- 125g butter
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup milk
- Icing
- 4 cups icing sugar
- 1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup milk
- 500g desiccated coconut for rolling



Directions

Preparation: 45min Cooking: 40min Ready in: 1hour25min

- 1. Preheat oven to 190 degrees C.
- 2. **Cake:** Grease and flour a 20x30cm rectangular cake tin or lamington tray. Sift together the flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside.
- 3. In a large bowl, cream together the butter, sugar and vanilla essence until light and fluffy.
- 4. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well with each addition. Add the flour mixture alternately with the milk and beat well.
- 5. Pour the mixture into the cake tin or lamington tray and bake in preheated oven for 30 to 40 minutes or until a fine skewer inserted into the cake comes out clean.
- 6. Let stand 5 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack and cool completely. Store overnight to give the cake a chance to firm up before icing.
- 7. **Icing:** In a large bowl, combine icing sugar and cocoa. In a saucepan, heat milk and butter until the butter is melted. Add the milk to the sugar mixture and mix well to create a fluid icing (not too runny).
- 8. Procedure: Place coconut in a shallow container. Cut the cake into 24 squares. Using a fork, dip each square completely into the icing, then roll it in the coconut. Place onto rack to dry.
- 9. Continue for each piece. The icing will drip, so place a sheet of baking paper under the rack to catch the drips.



Australia map puzzle

What you need:

- A computer
- A printer
- Printer paper
- Coloured pencils, crayons or textas
- Scissors
- Glue
- Thin cardboard to stiffen the pieces

Activity:

Step 1: Print out a map of Australia onto A4 paper. Tell your children the states and a little about each one - famous landmarks or the state flower.

Step 2: Let your kids get artistic, and colour in and decorate their map however they like.

Step 3: Glue all over the cardboard, evenly.

Step 4: Press the A4 sheet of paper onto the cardboard and smooth out any bumps.

Step 5: Cut around Australia as well as the state lines and Tasmania.

Step 6: Now it's time to put Australia back together! Get your kids rearrange the puzzle back into our nation's signature shape.


