News From The Menzies Health Centre.

I would like to thank everyone for their welcome. I have tried to catch with most organisations and people in town. For those I have not met, my name is Stephen Slocombe and I have worked in the Goldfields for many years. I am employed at Kambalda and have a 6 month contract to run the clinics at Menzies and Coonana.

PHARMACY

The supply of pharmacy medications at Menzies is slightly different to what I'm used to so I am still getting to know the system.

Some people have run out of medication for a few days before they can pick up replacements. There can be serious health risks if medication is not taken regularly. Due to the shortened clinic roster it would be better if you collected prescriptions a week or 2 before you run out. This would give you a small back up supply at home.

If doctors or specialists in Kalgoorlie give you a new prescription, it would be safer to fill the first prescription in Kalgoorlie then bring the repeat prescription to me at Menzies to make sure I can stock it for future dispensing.

The roster for clinics is written up on the white board outside the clinic. If I am visiting the school etc it will be written up on the board with an approximate time I will be back. The clinic phone will be diverted to my mobile so I should be easy to contact.

You will be allocated a stall indicated on the site plan.

SETUP



I thought you might like to know that the spirit of Menzies is alive and well in a little pocket of Sydney in the form of a chubby, happy little boy!

I have only been to Menzies once when I was a child but I have very fond memories of the town. I think I remember visiting a small pink house where my relatives once lived – although I might have seen this in Kalgoorlie instead? We are really looking forward to visiting with our children one day and introducing Menzies to his namesake!

My grandparents were Raymond and Nellie Shaddick (nee Nellie Collier). My Dad was Lindsay Shaddick and my Aunt is Marie Martin (nee Marie Shaddick). My Aunt married Ron Martin from Kalgoorlie and they now live in Mandurah.

CHECK MY CRIME WILL FREE UP POLICE FOR FRONTLINE DUTIES

Member for Mining and Pastoral Dave Grills MLC has welcomed the introduction of a program which will make data more accessible to both serving WA Police staff, and to victims of crime.

Mr Grills, who himself served as a member of the State's police force, said that the introduction of the Check My Crime program was a great initiative.

He said that the Police Minister Liza Harvey was correct in saying that the program would make life easier for victims of crime, who would now, for example, be able to access reports required for insurance claims.

"It will also reduce the number of hours police officers spend providing such reports to victims of crime and insurance companies," he said.

The program was developed internally by the WA Police, and will make record keeping within the force more efficient, while enabling victims of crime to access certain records needed in order to deal with the impact of crime.

It is part of the Frontline 2020 reform project, which aims to develop a more efficient and effective policing model.

"As part of that work, it is a step forward and as such I welcome it, but we still need to remember that effective crime prevention is still the best way to improve the efficiency of a police force, and improve society as a whole.

"We would now expect to see an increase in hours of proactive patrolling in crime hot spots, which should then reflect the success of the program by producing a reduction in crime in those areas."

PORK WITH ASIAN SLAW

- Olive oil spray
- 500g lean pork loin medallion steaks
- 1 large carrot, peeled, cut into thin matchsticks
- 1 small red onion, halved, thinly sliced
- 100g bean sprouts, trimmed
- 100g snow peas, thinly sliced lengthways
- 1/2 small wombok (Chinese cabbage), finely shredded
- 1 cup chopped fresh coriander
- 1 tbs finely shredded fresh ginger
- 3 tsp sesame oil
- 3 tsp salt-reduced soy sauce
- 2 tsp honey
- 1 garlic clove, crushed



Step 1

Heat a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Spray with oil. Cook the pork for 2-3 minutes each side or until golden and just cooked through. Transfer to a plate. Cover with foil and set aside for 5 minutes to rest. Thinly slice across the grain.

Step 2

Meanwhile, combine the carrot, onion, bean sprouts, snow peas, wombok, coriander and ginger in a large bowl.

Step 3

To make the dressing, whisk the oil, soy sauce, honey and garlic in a small jug. Add the pork to the salad. Drizzle over the dressing and toss to combine.

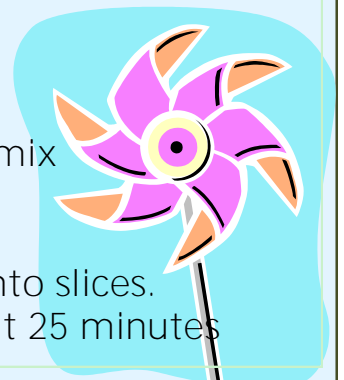

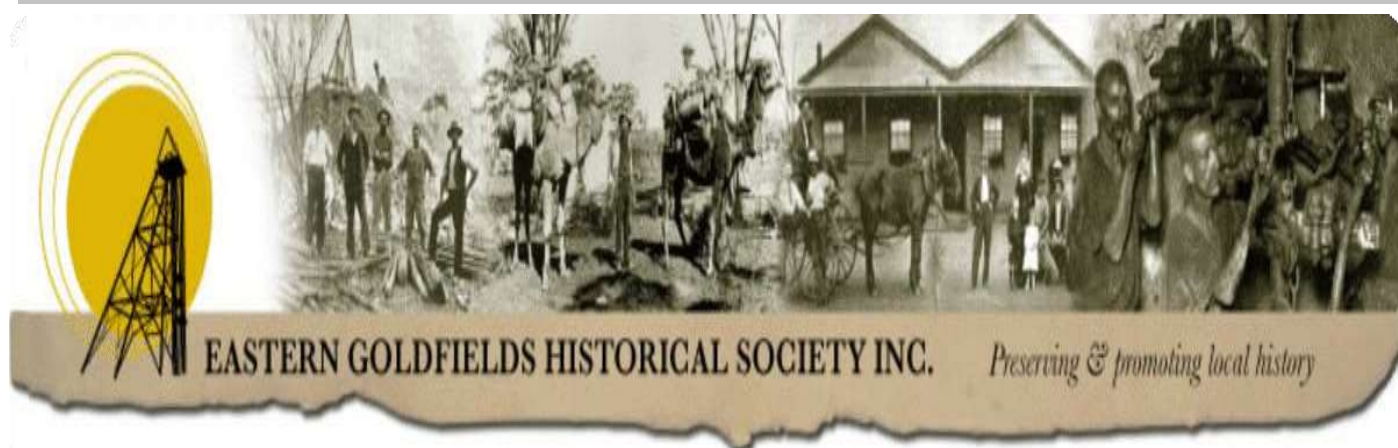

Introduction	
Objective	To ensure no political statements are made on Council controlled land
History	Adopted 29 November 2012
Policy Statement	

1. No advertising materials of a political nature, whether elections or general is permitted on any lands controlled by the Shire –
 - “advertising materials” includes materials –
 - relating to a Commonwealth, State, local or organisation election erected for or on behalf of a political party or candidate,
 - identifying or are promoted by a political party
 - attempting to influence for political purposes
 - but does not include –
 - notices of impending elections
 - notification of right to vote, closure of enrolment, directions to polling station etc
 - “lands” includes –
 - road reserves
 - recreation or other reserves
 - land owned in freehold
2. Political and election advertising materials erected on Shire controlled lands will be removed by the Shire, without prior notice to the advertiser, and an invoice raised for costs of removal at private works rates, with a minimum charge for half an hour.

– *End of Policy*

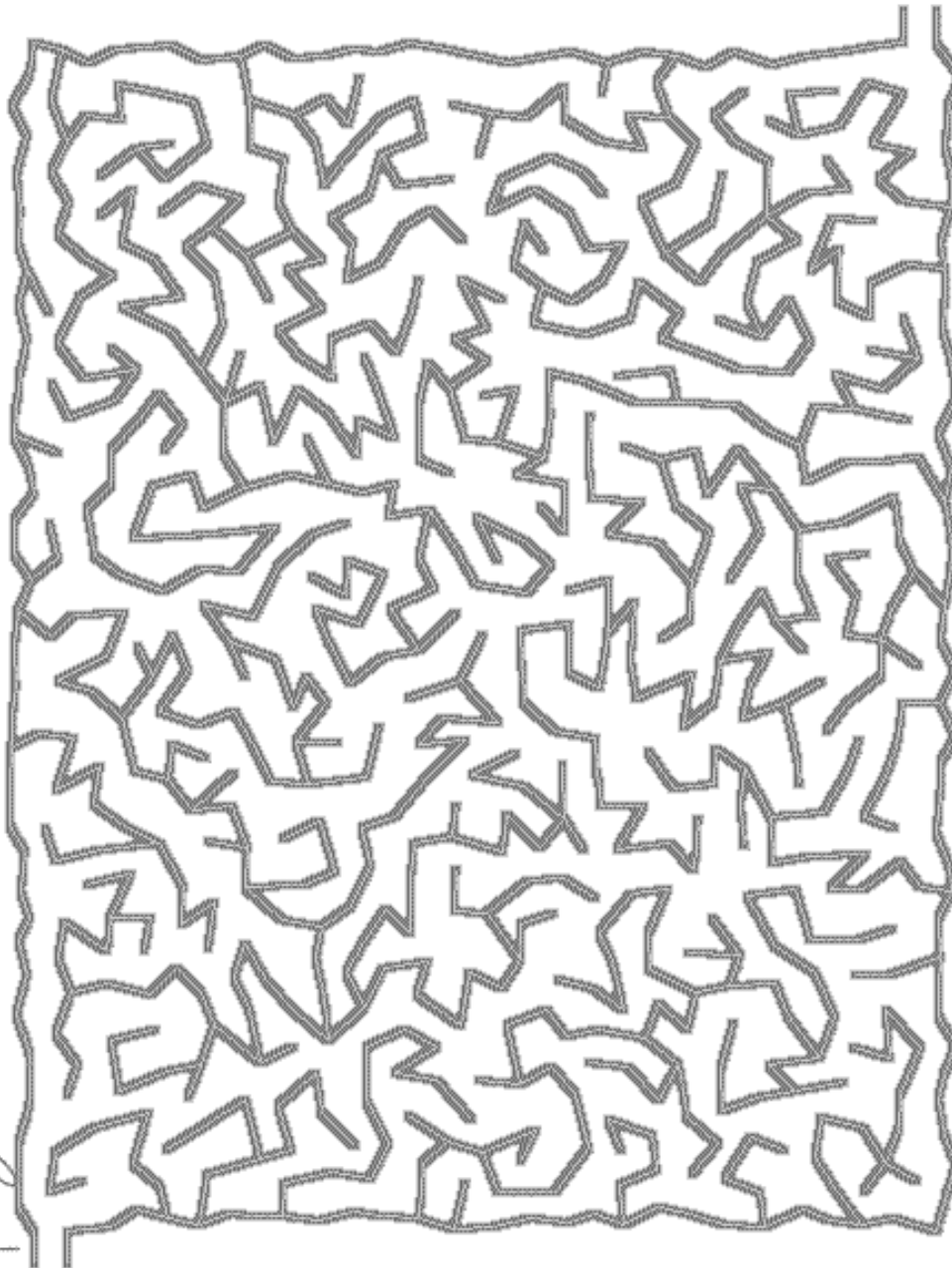
COMMENT

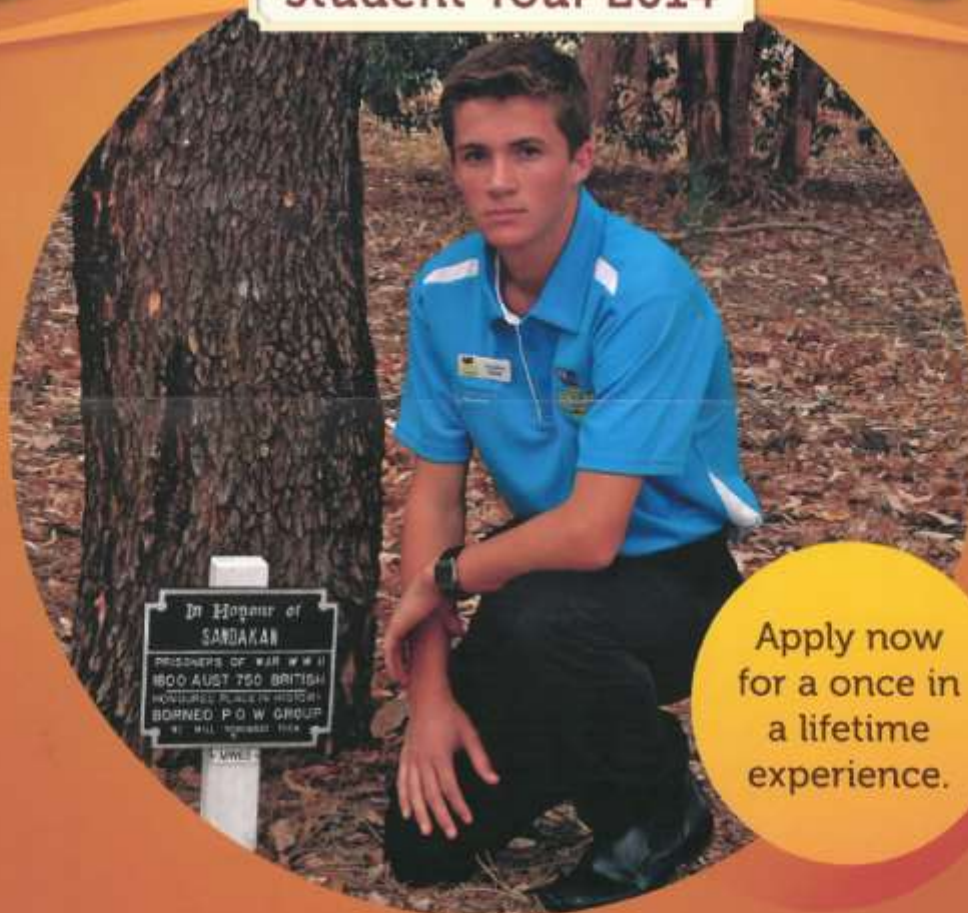

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY INTO SANDALWOOD INDUSTRY TO CONTINUE – DUNCAN

14 AUGUST 2013

The Standing Committee on Environment and Public Affairs has decided to continue with the inquiry into the sandalwood industry that was commenced during the previous term of government.

Member for Kalgoorlie, Wendy Duncan, has long been an advocate for the amendment of the legislation relating to the harvesting and sale of Australian sandalwood and supported the petition in the Legislative Council that led to the previous inquiry.

"The previous inquiry recommended that their work continue under the new term of government and I am very pleased to hear that the Committee has made the decision to do so," Ms Duncan said.

The Standing Committee on Environment and Public Affairs yesterday tabled a report (No 32) in which it advised the Legislative Council of its decision to accept recommendation of the Interim Report and inquire into:

1. The roles of the Department of Environment Regulation, Department of Parks and Wildlife and the Forest Products Commission in the management and commercialisation of sandalwood;
2. How future contracts for harvesting, marketing and selling of sandalwood can be managed to ensure that all sectors of the industry remain viable and sustainable and the returns to the State are maximised;
3. The management of wild sandalwood, including monitoring the resource and regeneration;
4. The government resources required to effectively detect and prosecute illegal harvesting and exporting of sandalwood, including the transport, storage, purchase, possession and identification of the sandalwood resource; and
5. A review of all relevant legislation pertaining to the sandalwood industry.

"This is welcome news as we need to get on with the job of sorting out the sandalwood industry and put an end to the uncertainty that the questions raised have caused," Ms Duncan said.
