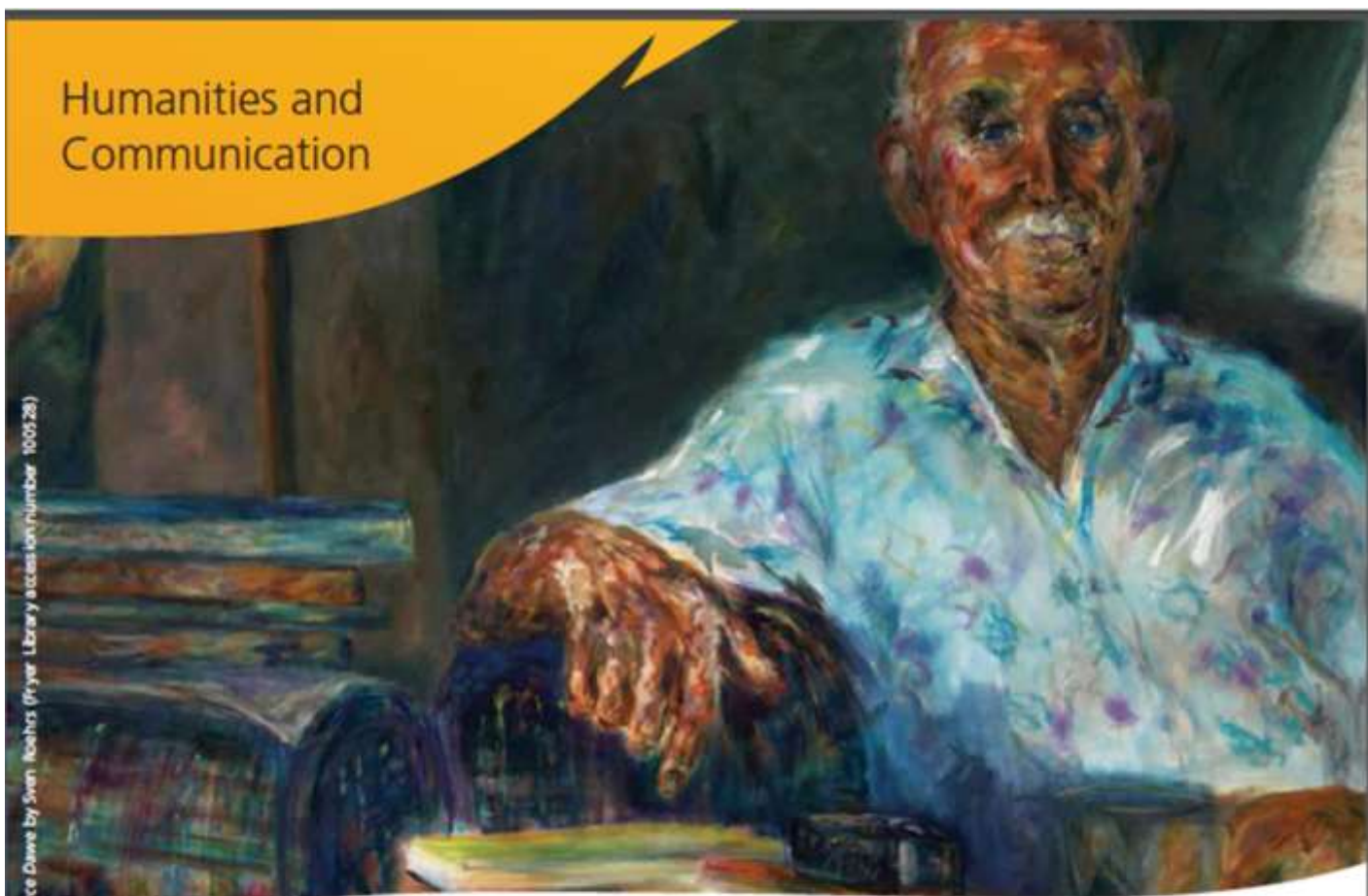
Jake Tucker!

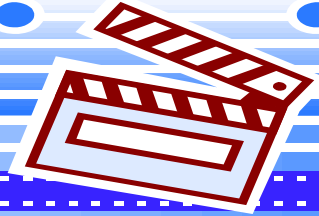
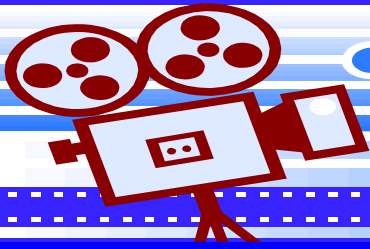

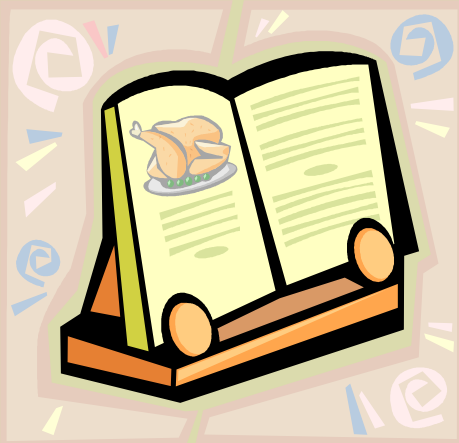
Maleficent

- 160g (2/3 cup) bought basil pesto

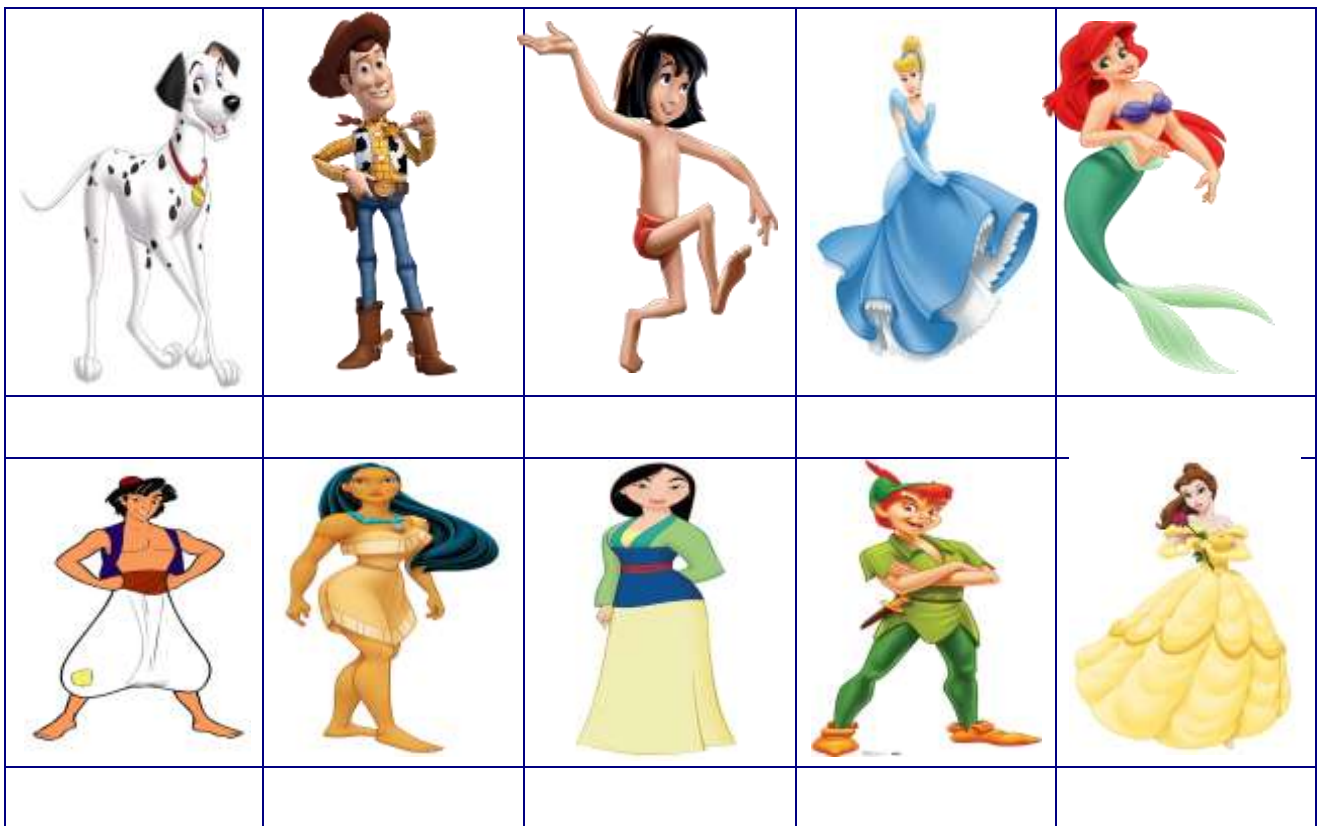
Method:

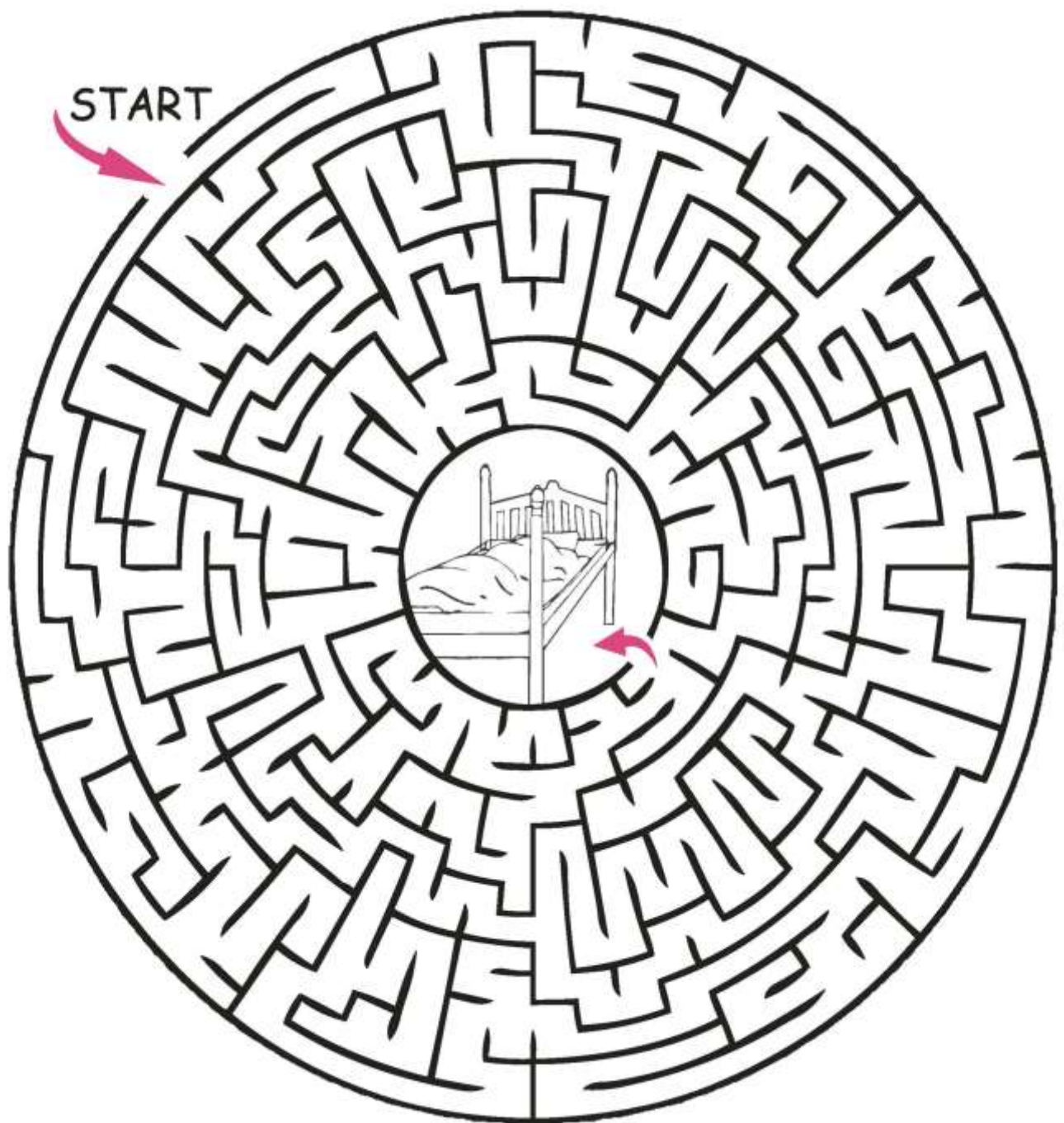

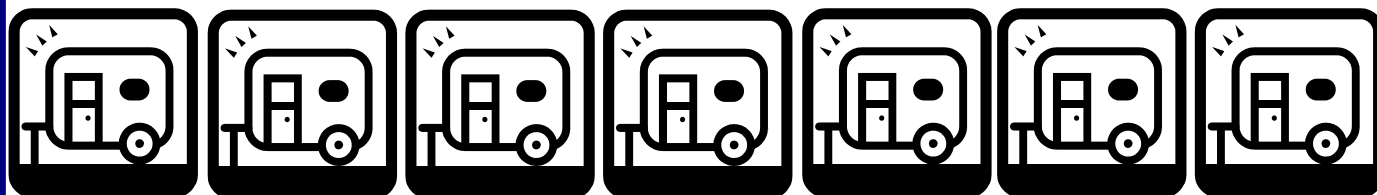

What a great first long weekend of June Menzies had!

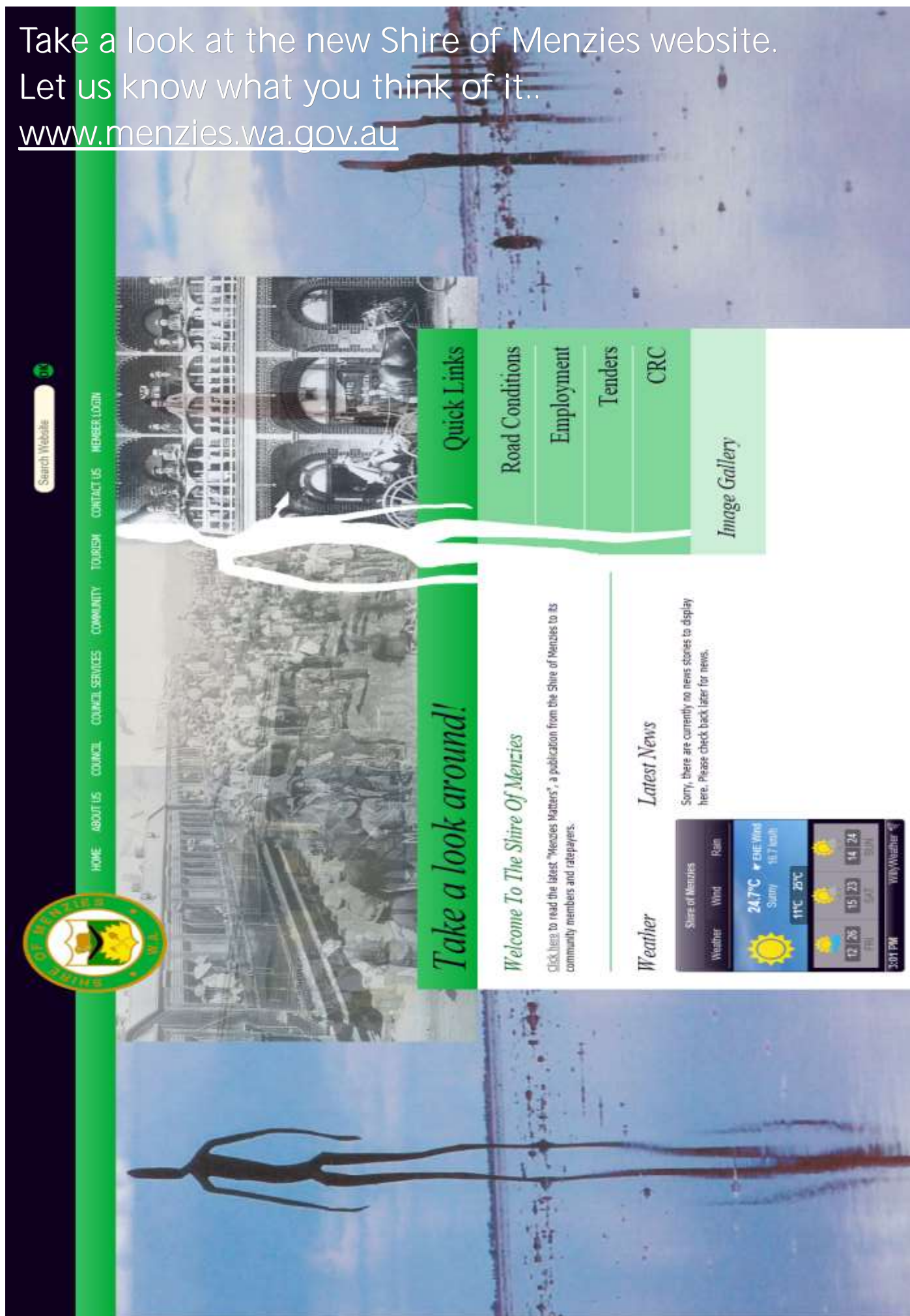

Message from your Member for Kalgoorlie, Wendy Duncan MLA

Prior to 2008, regional WA was shortchanged by both sides of government when it came to funding. This is why the Nationals created the policy of Royalties for Regions – a fund of up to \$1 billion a year, dedicated solely to regional WA communities.

In place for five years now, the backlog of regional community infrastructure is finally being addressed.

We've seen an unprecedented \$4.2 billion allocated to more than 3500 projects in regional communities.

"The Nationals will fight to make sure regional WA continues to get its fair share."

Projects like the Kalgoorlie Regional Hospital upgrade, Burt Street revitalisation, Ngaanyatjarra Media Accommodation, Leonora Oval and Lawn Bowling Club upgrades, Indigenous Visitor Centre, upgrade

of Goldfields Rehabilitation Services, new accommodation for WA School of Mines, the sealing of sections of the Outback Way between Laverton and Warburton and the new Ray Finlayson Sporting Complex would not have been possible without Royalties for Regions.

Royalties for Regions will focus on significant, region-building projects that create jobs, attract investment, stimulate regional economies and make regional WA an attractive place to live.

Royalties for Regions will spend \$1 billion this financial year on projects to revitalise the Goldfields and the Kimberley, continue improving our Pilbara cities and to grow the south of the state including the Wheatbelt.

Because our regions matter, The Nationals will fight to make sure regional WA continues to get its fair share.



REVITALISATION PROJECTS

\$173 million TO 2017-18

A total of \$5 million has been committed this year to continue the rollout of Goldfields revitalisation projects to improve the liveability and functionality of towns in the region. Over the next four years \$173 million will go into priority projects in the Goldfields

Esperance region under the revitalisation plan. The Royalties for Regions upgrade of the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Community High School will commence with \$4 million this year and \$40 million over the next two years. This year, \$5 million has been committed to the upgrade of the Goldfields Arts Centre.

REGIONAL INVESTMENT BLUEPRINTS

\$292 million OVER 5 YEARS

More than \$290 million has been allocated to fulfilling investment blueprints for the regions. This Royalties for Regions initiative is about local people planning and designing the future of the Goldfields-Esperance region. It gives guidance and priority for projects that will create jobs, attract investment and make regional WA an even more tempting place to live. It's about our regions finally getting the focus they deserve.

COUNTRY LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND (CLGF)

Over the State regional groupings and individual local governments will receive \$58.5million to carry out important development projects in their communities. This includes a combined pool of more than \$3.1million of funding reinstated to the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder and the Shires of Laverton, Coolgardie, Menzies, Ngaanyatjaraku and Yilgarn this year for completion of projects that were eligible for funding in the last financial year.

ABORIGINAL INITIATIVES

More than \$8million this year has been committed to the ongoing rollout and operation of remote Indigenous health clinics. Royalties for Regions will support regional youth justice strategies, Clontarf colleges, and governance and leadership development programs. Through Royalties for Regions improved health, education, justice and welfare to aboriginal communities throughout regional and remote WA will be delivered.



TRANSPORT

\$22.7 million

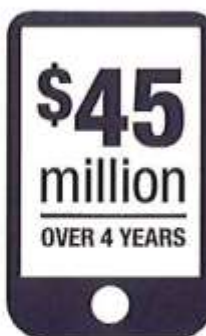
IN 2014-15

The upgrade and widening of Great Eastern Highway from Walgoolan to Coolgardie will vastly improve safety on that stretch of road, with \$26million of Royalties for Regions money earmarked for the project to begin next year which will eventually add 15 passing lanes. Another \$2.7million has been committed to the PortLink Inland Freight Corridor, which will ultimately provide a leading intermodal transport hub in Kalgoorlie linking to the State's most strategically important ports.

REGIONAL MOBILE COMMUNICATIONS PROJECT



Royalties for Regions will be used to continue expanding regional mobile phone coverage and broadband accessibility with \$45million to be spent over the next four years. Higher bandwidth broadband is vital to productive regional businesses as well improving access to health, education and emergency services. This is on top of the \$40million of Royalties for Regions which is delivering 113 new and upgraded mobile phone towers along major highways and in remote communities.



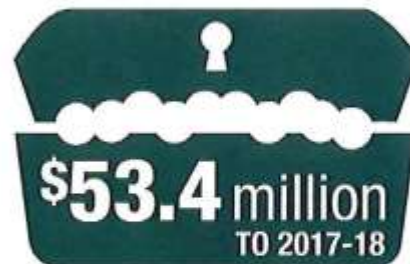
COMMUNITY PROJECTS AND SCHEMES

The Country Age Pension Fuel Card will be increased from \$500 to \$550 with a contribution of \$28.5million from Royalties for Regions. Introduced for the first time this year will be the Volunteer Fuel Card program – a \$2000 fuel card for volunteer emergency service groups to help them cover out of pocket costs. Local governments will each receive \$30,000 per aquatic centre for upgrade, maintenance or training and visitor centres will benefit from a boost from Royalties for Regions.



GRANTS FUNDING COMMUNITY PROJECTS

Community projects and services will have access to funds through the Regional Grants Scheme for larger grants and Community Chest Grants Scheme for smaller projects. These funds will be available through the Goldfields Esperance Development Commission.
