





- Make sure the bottom of any blind or curtain cord is at least 160 cm above the floor.
- Move children's cots, beds, high chairs or playpens away from windows with blind or curtain cords.
- Make sure your child cannot climb on furniture and reach the blind or curtain cord.
- Wrap blind cords securely around a hook attached high on the wall.
- 6 Install a cord tensioning device for vertical blinds.
- When installing new blinds, if in doubt, seek advice from a professional.

NATIONALS' COMMITMENT TO COUNTRY POOLS REALISED

16 JULY 2014

Royalties for Regions will be used to fund a new initiative aiming to assist country local governments keep community pools and aquatic centres well maintained and accessible to all.

In Warburton today with Regional Development Minister Terry Redman, Wendy Duncan MLA said that the \$13.2million Community Pool Revitalisation Program was a 2013 Nationals WA election commitment and would provide regional local governments up to \$30,000 per year to maintain and upgrade infrastructure, improve pool facilities and purchase new equipment.

"Public pools in regional towns and cities are a central point for recreation, learning, exercise and rehabilitation. They teach children and adults about water safety and survival techniques, provide swimming lessons and add to the overall recreational and social opportunities for people living, working and travelling in our regions," said Ms Duncan.

"Evidence also suggests that regular visits to the local pool contribute to reduced chronic disease and improved educational and social outcomes for residents."

Ms Duncan said that of 127 public aquatic centres in WA, almost 100 are located in the regions and that the \$13.2million Royalties for Regions package would ease the combined \$65.7million recurrent expenditure burden shouldered by local governments to maintain their pools each year.


The initiative, which has been endorsed by Royal Life Saving WA, will be managed by the Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) and aims to provide two outcomes:-


- Provide financial assistance to regional local governments that have an aquatic centre to maintain and upgrade infrastructure, improve pool facilities (including development of new programs) and purchase new equipment.
- Ensure aquatic centres continue to be safe and vibrant places that encourage physical activity, a healthy lifestyle and participation in sport and recreation

"Applications are open until August 15 and I strongly encourage local governments to apply for Community Pool Revitalisation Program funding through DSR."

August Offensive

06 August 1915 - 27 August 1915

The August Offensive was the last major attempt made by the Allied forces at Gallipoli to break the stalemate that had persisted since the landings on 25 April 1915. The plan involved a series of thrusts being made out of the Anzac position to seize high points along the Sari Bair range, which dominated the Gallipoli peninsula. These operations would be supported by several diversionary attacks along the existing Anzac frontline.

The offensive began with a diversionary attack at Lone Pine on the afternoon of 6 August 1915, which succeeded in taking a heavily defended complex of Turkish trenches but cost the lives of 2,000 men of the 1st Infantry Brigade.



The main attacks - directed at Chunuk Bair, Hill Q and Hill 971 - followed that night, but although the first two features were held for short periods of time, the attacks had failed by 10 August.

Several smaller diversionary attacks were mounted on the morning of 7 August and all ended in heavy casualties. The most costly was the attack on the Nek, immortalized by the film Gallipoli, in which 375 of the 600 attackers became casualties.

On 7 August British forces were also landed at Suvla Bay to establish a base area to sustain the Anzac position throughout the coming winter. When they had secured Suvla Bay, the British had planned to assist the main attack, but after suffering heavy casualties they were unable to take the heights above Suvla. The need to link the positions at Suvla and Anzac resulted in the last phase of the August Offensive - the attacks on the Hill 60 area that took place between 21 and 27 August.

AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT MOBILE SERVICE CENTRE VISIT TO MENZIES

Australian Government Mobile Service Centres travel to rural and regional communities to provide community members with information and access to government services. They provide personalised face-to-face servicing to individuals and families who may not have easy access to a Department of Human Services office. Staff from the Department of Human Services travel with the Mobile Service Centres and can help the community with Centrelink, Medicare, Child Support and Australian Hearing payments and services. From time to time, representatives from other government agencies also travel with the Mobile Service Centres.

The Mobile Service Centres are fully functioning offices outfitted with next G technology, satellite phones and internet connections, laptops and printers. An on-board generator is available to power the equipment in the Mobile Service Centre.



LEONORA TO SEE REGIONAL OFFICE AND ADMINISTRATION CENTRE 13 JUNE 2014

The Shire of Leonora Regional Office and Administration Centre proposal has taken a major step forward after Cabinet approved funding of \$4.62million from *Royalties for Regions* for the project as part of the Goldfields-Esperance Revitalisation Plan.

Member for Kalgoorlie, Wendy Duncan MLA, said that the project was vital to the towns' needs and a key piece of infrastructure to assist with moving the towns' services forward.

"Currently there is a lack of office facilities in the Northern Goldfields which puts pressure on agencies to offer 'drive in- drive out' services from Kalgoorlie approximately 234kms away," Ms Duncan said.

"Under the \$7.2million dollar project \$4.62million was been funded through the Royalties for Regions program with confirmed additional funds contributed by the Shire of Leonora, allowing for larger office space and additional office space for agencies to operate from and provide essential services to the people of Leonora."

Once complete, the Northern Goldfields Regional Office and Administration Centre will provide for agencies and not for profits including Department of Corrective Services (Youth Justice Services), Department for Child Protection and Family Support, the Goldfields Esperance Development Commission, the Leonora Community Resource Centre and Hope Community Services.

Ms Duncan said that the Northern Goldfields Regional Office and Administration Centre is scheduled to be opened in mid-2016 and will greatly reinforce the important role Leonora plays for business and government in the Northern Goldfields.

"What I want to see now is that local contractors and tradesmen reap the benefit of this money flowing into the district at a time when the mining industry is a bit flat," Ms Duncan said.

Since the Royalties for Regions program started in 2008, it has allocated more than \$4.2 billion to over 3,500 regional development projects across the State.





movie review

From producers, Steven Spielberg and Oprah Winfrey, **The Hundred-Foot Journey** follows Hassan Kadam, a culinary ingénue with the gastronomic equivalent of perfect pitch.

Displaced from their native India, the Kadam family, led by Papa, settles in the quaint village of Saint-Antonin-Noble-Val in the south of France.

Filled with charm, it is both picturesque and elegant – the ideal place to settle down and open an Indian restaurant, Maison Mumbai.

That is, until the chilly chef proprietress of Le Saule Pleureur, a Michelinstarred, classical French restaurant run by Madame Mallory, gets wind of it. Her icy protests against the new Indian restaurant a hundred feet from her own escalate into a heated battle between the two establishments until Hassan's passion for French haute cuisine – and for Madame Mallory's enchanting sous chef, Marquerite – combine with his mysteriously-delicious talent to weave

magic between their two cultures, and imbue Saint-Antonin with the flavours of life that even Madame Mallory cannot ignore.

At first Madame Mallory's culinary rival, she eventually recognises Hassan's gift as a chef and takes him under her wing.


The Hundred-Foot Journey abounds with flavours that burst across the tongue.



SPRING VEGETABLE SALAD

Ingredients:

- 6 slices prosciutto
- 1kg baby potatoes, washed
- 400g green beans, trimmed and halved
- 1 bunch asparagus, ends trimmed and sliced diagonally
- 1 tablespoons honey
- 2 teaspoons wholegrain mustard
- 1 crushed garlic clove
- 1/3 cup white wine vinegar
- ¼ cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons snipped chives



Preparation time: 10 mins Cooking time: 25 mins

Directions:

- Lightly oil a frying pan.
 Cook prosciutto over medium heat until crisp and golden.
 Set aside to cool.
- 2. Quarter the potatoes and steam for 15 minutes or until just tender. Remove and set aside to cool.


Steam beans and asparagus for 4-5 minutes or until just tender and bright green.

Drizzle over vegetables and top with prosciutto and chives.












18 August each year is Vietnam Veterans' Day. Originally it was a day to commemorate the Battle of Long Tan which took place in 1966, but it has since been adopted by all veterans.

The battle of Long Tan was the largest single unit battle fought in Vietnam by Australian troops. It began on the afternoon of 18 August and went right through the night until the morning of the 19 August. The reason why is was looked on as decisive and significant was because the Australians had only been there a few months - it was the first major conflict involving Australian troops in Vietnam. The Viet Cong and the North Vietnamese Army were aware that the Australians were there to secure the province and decided that they would take them on. That was the fate that befell a company of men - Delta Company, from the 6 Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment - who were on patrol that particular day. The enemy lay in wait for them - a huge ambush in a rubber plantation called Long Tan. The Australians had to hold off thousands of enemy troops for the duration of that battle. Eighteen Australian troops were killed - up to a thousand of the enemy. The skills of artillery men and arrival of armoured carriers with more men saved the day. The 6 Battalion was called the "Baby Battalion" as it was made up largely of national servicemen - and they certainly underwent a baptism by fire."

In acknowledging Vietnam Veterans' Day Communities throughout Australia remember the sacrifices made by our young men and women in a conflict that spanned a ten year period, thus making it the longest war in which Australian's participated.


