
THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The meeting will now take place 6 August 2018 commencing at 1pm. The Audit Committee Meeting will commence at 9.30am on 6 August 2018 in the Council Chambers.

31 July 2018 – 4 August 2018

The Chief Executive Officer and available Councillors will be attending Local Government Week in Perth from 31 July 2018 to 4 August 2018.

31 July 2018-630pm

I attended the GVROC dinner at the Adelphi Restaurant with Cr Dwyer.

1 August 2018-AM

The Chief Executive Officer and I attended the State and Local Government Forum for the Shire President's and Chief Executive Officers. We met with Department of Jobs, Tourism, Science and Innovations pushing the case for funds to seal the remainder of the North West road to the statues at the Inside Australia Art installation at Lake Ballard. We also met with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation/Water Corporation to seek funding to increase the storage and access of non-potable water to reduce the pressure on the use of valuable potable water that is trucked from Kalgoorlie.

I attended Cr Dwyer attended the afternoon session of the AGM of WALGA followed by the Convention Opening Welcome Reception.

2 August 2018

With Chief Executive Officer we took part in a workshop on the GVROC in relation to moving forward with the group and seeking outcomes. It is intended that the works will be undertaken during August and September 2018.



HOW TO PROTECT AGAINST

* FIGHT the BIT

Prevent mosquito bites





COVER UP

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bit through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltouluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from home containers.











SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR

Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- in supplies.

 ive serious consideration to taking some form of elecommunications and a global positioning system of fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office)

Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

Get written permission

- from the tenement holder when prospecting on:
- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

Fill any holes that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

DID YOU KNOW

1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

WARNING SIGNS ARE PLACED WHERE APPLICABLE, HOWEVER THEY MAY BE DAMAGED, REMOVED, VANDALISED OR DESTROYED

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.






All of the speakers had positive and uplifting messages to share with the many who attended. If you left with a catch phrase, a photo or perhaps a book the most important thing you could take away from



The children back in the early to mid-1920's did not have many toys as they worked along with their parent out in the fields or around the home.



Other toys that they would have played with, would most likely marbles, be wooden dolls or cars, balls made from inflated pig's bladders, knuckle old bones and wheels that they pushed along with a stick

Local Hero

Ronald (Hogie—Yogie Bear) Hogarth

Hogie was born in Leonora in 1953 and at the age of only six months was removed from his family and taken to Karalundi Seventh-Day Adventist Native Mission. Karalundi was situated on the Great Northern Highway north of Meekatharra.



His grandfather visited him regularly until he was about five years old at which time he took him with him on the train to Menzies. He was raised by Myrtle and Jimmy Brennan. When he



arrived his sister Joan recalls he was only a little fellow dressed in overalls. He only spoke Aboriginal and Myrtle

worked with him at home for six months teaching him to speak English. After that he was enrolled at Menzies School.



When Hogie was around ten years old the family moved to Gwalia and when the mine closed in 1965 he moved to Kalgoorlie where he finished school. Hogie was a very good sportsman and excelled at running and high jump. His special sporting skill was boxing. Ian tells the story of four blokes who went over east to make their living boxing and upon their return Hogie beat them all in fights.

When he left school he took a job working on the Railways for the "Ways and Works". He painted everything from railway building to bridges and was a general labourer for years. It was after that he moved back to Menzies and lived with his sister Joan and husband Ian. He worked on the rail line with Ian laying sleepers and doing other jobs.





This is where he and his partner Lorraine (Ninny) Williams had their only child Josie. Josie still lives in Menzies and has worked at the school there for almost eighteen years.

Hogie has four granddaughters, and to date he has two great-granddaughters and two great-grandsons. Hogie eventually retired and still remains living in his little house in Menzies.

creative pieces made on the day.











Menzies grandfather was a former resident and he is named after the Town.




