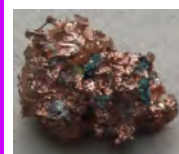
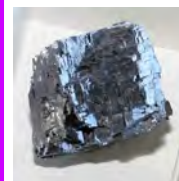

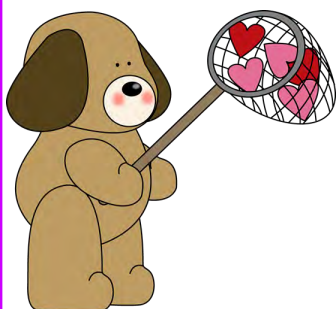

## SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

# 1.

### Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

# 2.

### Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

# 3.

### Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

# 4.

### Get written permission

from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

# 5.

### Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

# 6.

### Show respect when on Crown land

because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

# 7.

### Fill any holes

that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

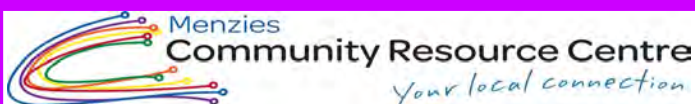

### COVER UP

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



### REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



### CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.

Criteria for the assessment of applications to the Community Assistance Fund includes the promotion and development of activities, events and services in the Shire of Menzies such as:

- Multicultural and indigenous projects

#### **MINOR GRANTS – Requests under \$500**

Typically used for small purposes.

Written applications must clearly state amount requested grant purpose

#### **AD HOC GRANTS – For requests over \$500 up to \$2,000**

Typically used for one-off purchases of equipment or financial contribution to the running of a group's events or activities. If you are an organisation you need not be incorporated, but must provide a list of active members.

## 'LOCAL HERO'

**Charles (Keith) Purchase was born on January 8, 1938 and grew up in the Menzies Shire**

Keith grew up on Jeedamia Station and was home schooled, occasionally attending Menzies Primary School while his mother was off having his other brothers and sisters.

Keith later worked in mustering camps around the Goldfields and cattle stations further north of Menzies. He has been heard to proudly proclaim he has never lived west of the Rabbit Proof Fence.



He has a stint at the Gwalia mine, was a Fireman in Kalgoorlie and had trucks and machinery in Coolgardie. He was also a taxi driver in Kalgoorlie, but his obvious passion was hotels and being a publican. This is the one thing he always returned to. One of his later jobs was driving the school bus from Morapoi to Menzies and back daily.

Keith was the youngest person to become a publican in Western Australia. He spent over forty years in hotels throughout the Goldfields Esperance region. He has had the Railway Hotel in Coolgardie, The Boulder Block (now in the middle of the Super Pit) The Gibson Soak in Gibson, Munglipup, The Grand Hotel Kookynie, and of course The Menzies which was his last hotel.

During his many years in pubs Keith was involved with many charities and fundraising events. During his time in Kookynie as a result of his involvement in the Kookynie Social Club the Royal Flying Doctor benefitted so much from the fundraising they named a plane after the town. The photo of the "Kookynie" RFDS plane still proudly adorns the wall in the hotel today.

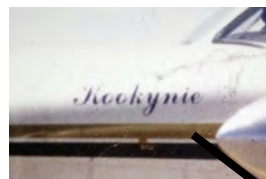
Keith has been a Councillor at the Shire of Menzies and continues to be interested in the local area. He served the Shire of Menzies between 2003 -2007 and 2011 -2013 and is proud of the developments achieved during these times, some having recently come to fruition.

Keith is devoted to his family and many friends. He always has a joke to tell, a yarn to recount or a song to sing. He is known and respected by many. He recently celebrated his 80th birthday with family and friends at The Gibson Soak hotel near Esperance. Many photos were displayed looking more like Clark Gable than Keith (*according to Keith anyway*).

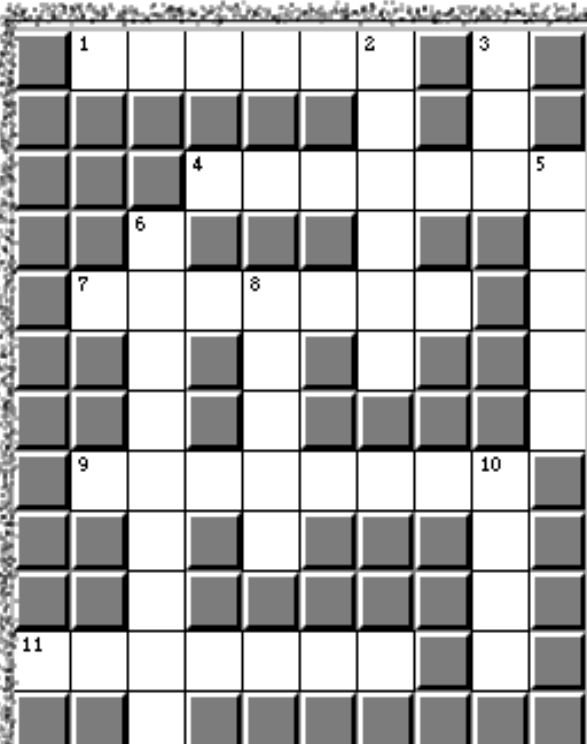

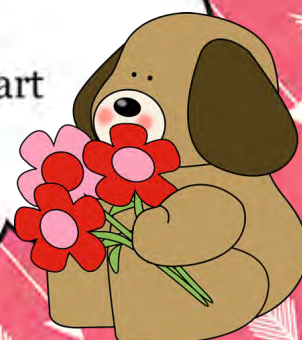
