


# "LOCAL HERO" - STACY MILLER

Stacey Miller was born in Leonora, the second youngest child in her family. She has two brothers and three sisters. It was not easy for her Mother raising a large family and when Stacey was six the family relocated to Menzies where Stacey would return to live often over the years. Originally when the family arrived in Menzies they lived on what was known as the "Reserve" which is where the village is now located. At the time there was approximately one hundred and fifty people living in Menzies. Stacey and her siblings grew up with many families helping raise them. Not all the families caring for them were indigenous and to this day Stacey retains a strong tie with many of them, in particular the Henderson's.



Stacey commenced schooling in Menzies and completed all her education to year 10. After leaving school her first job was at the Menzies school as an Early



Her eldest sister Marcia was, and still is, an inspiration to her. Stacey and her siblings slept outside on the verandah of her sisters house year round. Her sister lived in one of the platelayers cottages. This was when there were four cottages, before one burnt down.

At 18 years of age Stacey left Menzies to live in Perth. She was completing a bridging course for University at Churchlands College and lived with a sister whilst studying. She found the city too big and



busy after the bush and when Stacey returned to Menzies on her first break, she never went back to Perth.

She once again commenced employment at the Menzies School, however this time as an Aboriginal Education worker. Whilst working at the school this time she completed her Education Certificate in Early Childhood.


Stacey relocated to Port Hedland aged 22 and attended Pundulmurra College to study for an Office and Business

Technology Certificate. By the time Stacey moved to Port Hedland she already had two daughters. Her third daughter was born whilst they were in Port Hedland. The family remained in Port Hedland for 5 years.

During this time she was employed at the Yandeyarra Community outside South Hedland as a Payroll/Office worker. It was also during this period of time in her life that Vashti Sambo came to live with her. Stacey and Vashti remained closely linked ever since.



After a break-up Stacey moved back to Menzies but eventually ended up in Kalgoorlie where she was employed at BEGA Garnbirringu Health Services as a Finance clerk. Whilst employed there she applied for and was successful in obtaining the position of Link-up Officer. This work reunited stolen generation with their families and required her to travel all around Australia. This service was so successful that when a reunion was held in Mt Margaret in later years almost 8,000 people attended. She continued in this role until Government funding dried up which ended the program.

The next move saw Stacey living and working in Laverton where she was employed at the Murrin Murrin mine where she worked in the stores. During this employment she obtained a Forklift and Bobcat license and loaded and unloaded trucks but eventually ended up as Personal Assistant to a Director of the mine.

Throughout her entire career Stacey has continued to study and obtain qualifications and she eventually completed her Degree in Education. At different times Stacey has been a Teacher, Truancy Officer for up to four schools in Kalgoorlie, an Aboriginal Islander Education Officer (AIEO), a Personal Assistant to a Mine Manager, worked with the School of the Air, been an Environmental Health Worker and Principal but her journey has always brought her back to schools. She has taught in Menzies, Laverton, School of the Air in Kalgoorlie, South Hedland, East Kalgoorlie and Mt Margaret.

During her time at School of the Air it was normal for teachers to travel to visit their students for a week each visit. She visited students in Esperance, Wiluna and was even sent to Mundrabilla which is where she saw her first wombat.



During her last posting at Mt Margaret School Stacey applied for Long Service Leave. It lasted just 1 day before she was seconded to assist at Menzies. She was Acting Principal from January 2018 and was appointed to the position full-time in November 2018. Stacey readily acknowledges this has been a learning curve but has been hugely rewarding. She also acknowledges that without the unwavering support of her sister, her mother and passing of her daughter she would not have been able to have achieved so much.



### SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR **PROSPECTING**

- Put safety first
   Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)

   it may turn out to be your most important safety device.
- **Obtain a Miner's Right permit** when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office)
- Obtain a 40E permit
- prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).
- Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

  - a mining lease
  - an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit) a prospecting licence
- Comply with all legal requirements when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.
- Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.
- Fill any holes you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

# \* FGHT the BITE

### Prevent mosquito bites





#### **COVER UP**

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bit through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



#### REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltouluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



#### **CLEAN UP**

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.











### 1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

WARNING SIGNS ARE PLACED WHERE APPLICABLE, HOWEVER THEY MAY BE DAMAGED, REMOVED, VANDALISED OR DESTROYED

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

# Prohibited Burning Period: From 1 November 2018 to 15 March 2019 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period. Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

# Restricted Burning Periods 2: From 16 March 2019 to 30 April 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened.

You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

# Unrestricted Season: From 1 May 2019 to 18 September 2019 (inclusive)

# Restricted Burning Periods 1: 19 September 2019 to 31 October 2019 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2019.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2019.


