Sunday 26TH Jan

Attended Australia Day in Menzies at the Youth Centre and Park with Community Members and visitors for a Breakfast Barbeque.

Thursday 30th Jan

With Cr Dwyer and the CEO we travelled to Esperance to attend the GVROC Dinner that evening, Minister, Alannah MacTiernan and Kyle McGinn MLC were present.

Friday 31st Jan

With Cr Dwyer and the CEO attended the GVROC Meeting at which Minister MacTiernan (Regional Development, Agriculture, Food and Ports) and Minister David Templeman, (Local Government, Heritage, Culture and the Arts) made presentations.

Other presentations included establishing a Camel Hub Operation (Milk, Meat and Meat Meal) and Australia's Golden Outback – Tourism in the GVROC Region. Council business of interest was the Terms of Reference for GVROC Drought Relief Committee, Bushfire Mitigation Strategy and Preparedness and the Cashless Debit Card Program.

Wed 5th Feb

Whilst in Perth Cr Dwyer and I met with Modular WA for a prestart meeting to choose colours and fittings for the two Caravan Park Units.

Thurs 20th Feb

Attended the Briefing Information Session in the Council Chambers in preparation for the Ordinary Meeting of Council 27th February 2020.

At the Shire we have been busy preparing for many works for 2020.

PROJECTS

The two new accommodation units in the Caravan Park and building is underway. The new ablution building in the Truck Bay is underway. A new house is to be built and should be finalized in a few months.

Also finalised were the tender for the next 5 kilometres of the sealing of the Menzies NW Road. Shortly tenders will be called for further roadworks on the eastern areas of the Shire and it is planned to have these works completed in the next few months.

The Menzies Hotel has been approved by the Council to sell fuel this will be ready sometime in the next few months.

BUDGET 2020/2021

In March/April we will be preparing for the 2020/2021 budget which Council wants to adopt by June 30th. If you have any areas you would like to see work happening, or projects you would like to see, small or large, please talk to your Councillors.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

In March will be a series of public consultation workshops in which all members of the community can have a say in what you would like to see happening within the Shire over the next few years. This is very similar to budget preparation except this consultation will cover the next 5 years.

There will be survey forms available for anyone who does not want to attend public meetings or public workshops.

NO CHILDREN IN THE HOTEL – A REMINDER

Parents, children are not allowed to enter the Hotel unless accompanied by an adult. This includes the area at the rear bar where the fridges are located. This is also a licensed area.

The licence of the Hotel can face severe penalties if a child enters the hotel area without an adult they have no choice to order them out – it is the law.

A child cannot come in the hotel even to buy an ice cream, sandwich or whatever. The hotel has every right and should refuse service if the child is not with an adult.

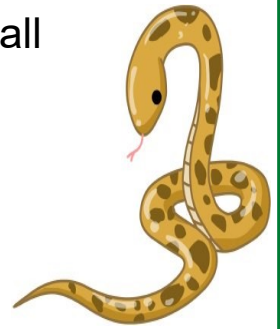

RETURNING FROM OVERSEAS SELF-ISOLATION GUIDELINES

LEVEL 1

CRITERIA:

HAVE RETURNED FROM OVERSEAS TRAVEL.

LEVEL 1 ACTIONS:

- Immediately return to your place of residence and self-isolate for 14 days.
- Do not leave your property. That means don't go to the shops, walk the dog or go to the gym.
- Any other household residents who haven't travelled do not need to self-isolate.
- Minimise close contact with other household residents. Avoid sharing dishes, utensils, towels and pillows. Wash them thoroughly with soap and water. Avoid face-to-face contact closer than 1.5 metres.
- If you remain well for the 14 day period, you may then return to your normal activities on day 15.
- If you become unwell during the 14-day self-isolation period progress to Level 2.

LEVEL 2

CRITERIA:

HAVE RETURNED FROM OVERSEAS TRAVEL AND BECOME UNWELL DURING THE 14-DAY SELF-ISOLATION PERIOD.

LEVEL 2 ACTIONS:

- You should attend your nearest COVID-19 clinic if you live in the Perth metropolitan area. In regional areas, ensure you notify your health service prior to arriving at a public hospital, health service or remote health clinic.
- Go directly to the testing location from your place of residence and return immediately home.
- Remain in self-isolation until a test result is received. Other household residents can undertake their normal activities while your test result is awaited.
- Minimise close contact and avoid sharing items with other household residents.
- If the test result is negative you will be required to remain in self-isolation until the 14-day period is up. You can resume normal activities on day 15.
- If you have a positive test result for COVID-19 progress to Level 3.

LEVEL 3

CRITERIA:

HAVE RETURNED FROM OVERSEAS TRAVEL, BECOME UNWELL AND TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19.

LEVEL 3 ACTIONS:

- If COVID-19 test returns a positive result, you are to remain in self-isolation until you recover and are cleared by the Department of Health to resume your normal activities.
- An interview will be conducted to determine if you have any close contacts, including household contacts.
- Any close contact with others in your household or outside, while you were infectious, need to self-isolate (as in Level 1).
- Household residents deemed to be close contacts who remain well must continue to self-isolate for a full 14 days after the last contact with the positive case and can resume normal activities on day 15.

ENFORCEMENT

**PENALTIES OF UP TO \$50,000
WILL APPLY FOR BREAKING
SELF-ISOLATION.**

NOTE:

If you have received a positive result and require medical attention because your condition has changed, you must call ahead to your nearest health service and advise that you need medical assistance PRIOR to arriving. The health service will then provide instructions you must follow upon your arrival.

HOW TO PROTECT AGAINST MOSQUITO BITES

★ FIGHT the BITE ★

Prevent mosquito bites

★ COVER UP. REPEL. CLEAN UP. ★



COVER UP

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from



SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

1.

Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

2.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

3.

Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

4.

Get written permission

from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

5.

Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

6.

Show respect when on Crown land

because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

7.

Fill any holes

that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

1080 BAITING IN THIS AREA IS A RISK TO DOMESTIC PETS

Please be advised that baiting programs using 1080 poison are carried out across Western Australia, including this area, and are aimed at controlling wild dogs, feral cats, feral pigs, foxes and rabbits. The poison baits remain toxic for many months. You need to exercise caution. Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. Owners may consider the use of leads and muzzles for their domestic pets.

DO NOT RELY ON WARNING SIGNS

WARNING SIGNS ARE PLACED WHERE APPLICABLE, HOWEVER THEY MAY BE DAMAGED, REMOVED, VANDALISED OR DESTROYED

1080 baiting is part of an integrated pest management program protecting livestock from death and injury; reducing the impact on pastoral and agricultural production; and helping to preserve the unique flora and fauna of WA. Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.

1080 is an S7 Poison

DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2019/2020

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period:

From 1 November 2019 to 15 March 2020 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period.

Properties are to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2019.

Restricted Burning Periods 2:

From 16 March 2020 to 30 April 2020 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with.

Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened.

You must check the press for details

or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

Unrestricted Season:

From 1 May 2020 to 18 September 2020 (inclusive)

Restricted Burning Periods 1:

19 September 2019 to 31 October 2020 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2019.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2019.

Notable people born in Menzies

Sir Thomas William Meagher (1902-1979), surgeon and Lord Mayor of Perth

Sir Colin Hannah (1914-1978), RAAF officer and Governor of Queensland

Edward Evans (1939-1981) State Labor MLA

Sir Thomas William Meagher

Birth 26 March 1902 Menzies Western Australia

Death 27 June 1979 Shenton Park Perth Western Australia

Occupation General Practitioner , Local government councilor, Local government head, Olympics administrator

After his schooling at Christian Brothers College Perth (1911-19) and one year completing first-year science at the University of Western Australia he then moved to Victoria to study Medicine at the University of Melbourne (M.B., B.S., 1925). During this time he completed in its athletics, football, swimming and rowing teams, winning college colours in 1923.

Returning to Western Australia, he worked as a house surgeon at the Perth (1925) and Children's (1926) hospitals before establishing a general practice at Victoria Park in 1927.

Marrying Marguerite Winifred Hough a school teacher on 8 March 1927 having six children. Marguerite died in 1952.

In 1937 he was elected to represent Victoria Park Ward on Perth City Council and in 1939 he was appointed Lord Mayor, and honorary Captain in the Australian Army Medical Corps Reserve, declared unfit for service in World War 11.

He was knighted in 1947, a councilor of the Order of St John, he was appointed a knight of grace in 1955.

The pace and scope of his public activities did not decrease after the war. From the mid 1940s to the early 1970s he played a key role in a wide range of state and civil organisations. He was not only a figurehead , but an active office-bearer and skilled chairman, keen to foster development, well informed and astute in his judgements, and to benefit the organisations he led.

Sir Thomas lent his status as patron of several ex-service organisations, including the State branch of the Totally and Permanently Disabled Soldiers Association of Australia, the Ex- Prisoners of War and Relatives Association. President of the Western Australian branch of the Royal Empire Society (1955-58), President of the Royal Automobile Club of Western Australia (1945-47), He help set up the R.A.C. Insurance Pty Ltd and the National Safety Council of Western Australia., President of the King's Park Board and oversaw the introduction of new attractions to the park.(1954-1979). He became involved in the management of Karrakatta Cemetery (trustee 1951, chairman 1971)and Pinnaroo Valley Memorial Park (trustee 1962, chairman 1971).

Chairman of trustee (1959-73) of Western Australian Museum, working closely with its director to develop the museum. He stayed involved in sport, administration of amateur athletics. President of Western Australian division of Australian Olympic Federation (1947-71), and vice president of the state division of the Australian British Empire and Commonwealth Games Melbourne and chief timekeeper for athletics at 1962 British Empire and Commonwealth Games in Perth.

In the course of all these public activities he continued to Practice medicine.

Colin obtained his junior certificate and excelled in sport. In 1933 he joined the Militia, serving as a gunner with the 8th Battery, six months later he took a post as a junior clerk in the State Public Service and was employed in the Crown Law Department.

January 1935 he enlisted in the Royal Australian Air Force,. In 1936 he gained his flying Badge as an air cadet at the No.1 Flying Training School in Victoria and commissioned the next month. His first posting in Richmond New South Wales with the No. 22 Squadron. In 1937 he moved to Laverton Victoria joining No. 23 Squadron as adjutant. In 1938 his unit transferred to the new base at Pearce, Western Australian.

He married Patricia Treacey Gwynneth Gordon in 1939.

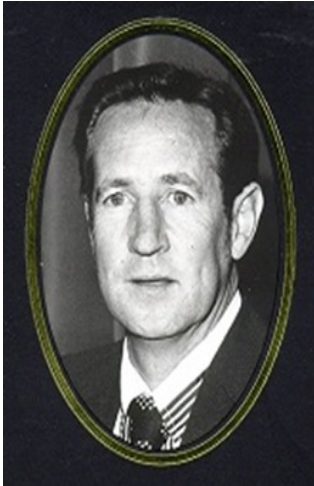
In 1939 He travelled to England for armament training with the Royal Air Force; beginning the course less than a week before the outbreak of World War II. He returned to Australia in 1940, employed at No.1 Armament School Point Cook, and at base Laverton Victoria. He was then posted to Melbourne Air Force Headquarters for duties on the technical staff. He was promoted to acting squadron leader. In 1941 he was deputy director of armament , he rose to temporary wing commander in 1942.

Arriving at Milne Bay, Papua 1943 he Joined NO.6 Squadron, Beaufort bomber unit operating against Japanese. During a familiarisation flight his aircraft strayed over Kiriwina Island and was fired at, receiving nothing but a nick to the forehead. He assumed command of the squadron and was made temporary group captain and led No. 71 Wing in 1944. Evacuated ill spending 6 weeks in hospital before rejoining No.6 Squadron at Goodenough island. He became senior air staff officer on the headquarters of Western Area of Perth, and held command from 1945 to 1946.

1947 he attended the R.A.F Staff College, Andover England, and was subsequently S.A.S.O at R.A.A.F. Overseas Headquarters London. Back home in 1949 he took over the base at Amberley Queensland. 1950 he was given temporary command of No.82 Wing (Lincoln bombers). 1951 he was appointed O.B.E. He was posted to R.A.A.F. Headquarters as director of personal services; from 1952 he was director general of personnel.

Appointed an aide-de-camp to Queen Elizabeth II, he was largely responsible for planning R.A.A.F. involvement in the royal tour of 1954; that year he was elevated to C.B.E. While studying at the Imperial Defence College, London, Promoted air commodore 1955. He was S.A.S.O., headquarters, Far East Air Force, Singapore, from 1956 appointed C.B. 1959 for his services during the Malayan Emergency. Returned to Melbourne 1959 he became director-general of plans and policy, and led an advance party which began the Department of Air's transfer to Canberra. In 1961 he was appointed deputy Chief of Air Staff, 1962 was promoted acting Air Vice Marshal. 1963 Heading Operational Command at Penrith New South Wales, 1965-1967 He took charge of Support Command in Melbourne. 1970 promoted to Air Marshal and made Chief of Air Staff for a three- year-term. He was appointed K.B.E. in 1971.

In 1972 it was announced that he would be the next governor of Queensland the first R.A.A.F member to attain such a position.
