FROM THE ORDINARY MEETING OF COUNCIL— THURSDAY 28 FEBRUARY 2012

LOCAL PLANNING POLICY No 8 – MOVEABLE BUILDINGS:

In November 2012, Council approved of advertising the fact that they were reviewing Local Planning Policies and invited public comments on those policies. Council have now added Local Planning Policy No 8 - Moveable Buildings to that list. Copies of that Policy are now available from the administration office and the public is invited to make submissions on this proposed policy. Council will then consider all comments before Adopting the final Policy.

SUPPLY OF LEGAL SERVICES:

Council has resolved to seek legal advice in regards the responsibility of providing power and water to lots of land in Menzies townsite. This is in response to the Water Corporation's advice that the Shire must fund not only new mains to the existing streets, but also the duplication of the existing water main leading from the storage tank on the hill for some 415 metres. Horizon Power also advise that the Shire must fund the supply of power to these lots. As these lots were surveyed and gazetted some 117 years ago, Council feels that it is the responsibility of the service providers to supply these services and will seek legal advice as to their next move.

LAKE BALLARD:

Council has been requested by the Lake Ballard Association (LBA) to seek legal advice on options regarding the Shire of Menzies taking over the Management Orders for the Lake Ballard Reserves. The current status of the Management Orders does not allow the LBA to make *Local Laws* to control the passage of vehicles onto the lake, nor does it have any control over land side issues. The Management Orders also prohibit the Shire from making these *Local Laws* as the Shire has no tenure over the land. Hopefully, these issues can be resolved in the near future to allow the site to be further developed and exercise some semblance of control over the reserves.

OPENING OF NEW COUNCIL CHAMBERS:

Council has set the date of Tuesday 23 April 2013 for the opening of the new Council Chambers. An invitation will be extended to Mr John Tonkin to officiate at the ceremony. Most people will know of Mr Tonkin who lived in the Menzies area for many years whilst owning several stations in the region. Mr Tonkin served as a Councillor on the Menzies Shire for some 40 years including 8 years as Shire President.

NATIONAL ARTHRITIS AWARENESS WEEK

17-23 March 2013

Arthritis is a name for a group of conditions affecting the joints. These conditions cause damage to the joints, usually resulting in pain and stiffness. Arthritis can affect many different parts of the joint and nearly every joint in the body.

Is rheumatism different to arthritis?

Not really. Rheumatism is just a more general word that was used in the past. It described any pain in your bones, muscles and joints. We know more about problems with bones, muscles and joints, so we use words like back pain, tendonitis and arthritis to describe these conditions now.

Are there different types of arthritis?

There are over 100 forms of arthritis. Each type of arthritis affects you and your joints in different ways. Some forms of arthritis can also involve other parts of the body, such as the eyes. The most common forms of arthritis are:

- osteoarthritis
- rheumatoid arthritis
- aout
- ankylosing spondylitis

Who gets arthritis?

Anyone can get arthritis, including children and young people. In Australia nearly one in five people has arthritis. Many people think arthritis is a normal part of getting older. This is not true. In fact two out of every three people with arthritis are between 15 and 60 years old. Arthritis can affect people from all backgrounds, ages and lifestyles.

Arthritis and Osteoporosis WA

The objective of Arthritis & Osteoporosis WA is to reduce the incidence and disabling effects of arthritis, osteoporosis and related conditions in the people of WA.

Support Groups

Arthritis WA has a number of support groups which are led by a trained volunteer leader. These groups provide participants with the opportunity to meet regularly with others in a similar situation. If you would like the opportunity to:

- Talk freely about your experiences and feelings in a safe non-judgmental environment
- Share helpful hints and practical tips
- Receive and give encouragement and support to others
- Socialise and make new friends

- The vacant land between the old Western Power Station site and the Pioneer Store in Shenton Street



EARTH HOUR

International Women's Day has been observed since in the early 1900's, a time of great expansion and turbulence in the industrialized world that saw booming population growth and the rise of radical ideologies.

The first National Woman's Day (NWD) was observed across the United States on 28 February. Women continued to celebrate NWD on the last Sunday of February until 1913.

At the second International Conference of Working Women held in Copenhagen in 1910, a woman named a Clara Zetkin (Leader of the 'Women's Office' for the Social Democratic Party in Germany) tabled the idea of an International Women's Day. She proposed that every year in every country there should be a celebration on the same day - a *Women's Day* - to press for their demands. The conference of over 100 women from 17 countries, representing unions, socialist parties, working women's clubs, and including the first three women elected to the Finnish parliament, greeted this suggestion with unanimous approval and thus International Women's Day was the result. The date decided upon was 19 March.

In 1911, the first IWD on the new date was held, in Austria, Denmark, Germany and Switzerland and was attended by more than one million men and women. However less than a week later on 25 March, the tragic 'Triangle Fire' in New York City took the lives of more than 140 working women, most of them Italian and Jewish immigrants. This disastrous event drew significant attention to working conditions and labour legislation in the United States that became a focus of subsequent International Women's Day events.

On the eve of World War I campaigning for peace, Russian women observed their first International Women's Day on the last Sunday in February 1913. In 1913 following discussions, International Women's Day was transferred to 8 March and this day has remained the global date for International Women's Day ever since. In 1914 further women across Europe held rallies to campaign against the war and to express women's solidarity.

Since its birth in the socialist movement, International Women's Day has grown to become a global day of recognition and celebration across developed and developing countries alike. For decades, IWD has grown from strength to strength annually. For many years the United Nations has held an annual IWD conference to coordinate international efforts for women's rights and participation in social, political and economic processes. 1975 was designated as *'International Women's Year'* by the United Nations. Women's organisations and governments around the world have also observed IWD annually on 8 March by holding large-scale events that honour women's advancement and while diligently reminding of the continued vigilance and action required to ensure that women's equality is gained and maintained in all aspects of life.

2000 and beyond: IWD is now an official holiday in throughout the world. The tradition sees men honouring their mothers, wives, girlfriends, colleagues, etc with flowers and small gifts. In some countries IWD has the equivalent status of Mother's Day where children give small presents to their mothers and grandmothers.

The new millennium has witnessed a significant change and attitudinal shift in both women's and society's thoughts about women's equality and emancipation. Many from a younger generation feel that 'all the battles have been won for women' while many feminists from the 1970's know only too well the longevity and ingrained complexity of patriarchy. With more women in the boardroom, greater equality in legislative rights, and an increased critical mass of women's visibility as impressive role models in every aspect of life, one could think that women have gained true equality. The unfortunate fact is that women are still not paid equally to that of their male counterparts, women still are not present in equal numbers in business or politics, and globally women's education, health and the violence against them is worse than that of men.

However, great improvements have been made. We do have female astronauts and prime ministers, school girls are welcomed into university, women can work and have a family, women have real choices. And so the tone and nature of IWD has, for the past few years, moved from being a reminder about the negatives to a celebration of the positives. Annually on 8 March, thousands of events are held throughout the world to inspire women and celebrate achievements. A global web of rich and diverse local activity connects women from all around the world ranging from political rallies, business conferences, government activities and networking events

through to local women's craft markets, theatric performances, fashion parades and more.

Many global corporations have also started to more actively support IWD by running their own internal events and through supporting external ones. For example, on 8 March search engine and media giant Google some years even changes its logo on its global search pages. Year on year IWD is certainly increasing in status. The United States even designates the whole month of March as 'Women's History Month'.

So make a difference, think globally and act locally!! Make everyday International Women's Day. Do your bit to ensure that the future for girls is bright, equal, safe and rewarding.

Kalgoorlie has been described as the Gold Capital of the world and it is the area of Australia's biggest gold rush, which drew thousands of people to the twin towns of Kalgoorlie and Boulder in the late 1800's and early 1900's.

Today the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder has a population of approximately 30,000 people. Gold was first discovered in 1893 by Paddy Hannan at nearby Coolgardie. The region is still one of the world's richest gold producers as modern mining methods are used to reach the deeper deposits.


Goodbye and thank you to Marilyn

<u>Kookynie</u>

Kookynie, has an area of two and a quarter miles, was incorporated on May 22, 1902 and is governed by 9 Councillors, exclusive of the Mayor. Half a mile [of the two and half miles of streets within its boundaries] has been formed at a cost of 23 pounds per chain.

The total number of buildings in the municipality is 400. The population is 2,320 which is made up of 1,693 males, 331 females and 296 children. The municipal rate is 1 shilling and 3 pence in the pound. The sanitary system employed is that of sealed pans.

There are 7 hotels and a workman's club, 5 general stores, 3 drapers and 4 confectioners and greengrocers etc, beside stationers, tobacconists and so on. There is a State School, a hospital, and post and telegraph and money order offices. The water supply is derived from wells, and mains are being laid down for service in case of fire and for street watering. The water is fresh and of good quality, and the town has an excellent swimming bath, which is a great boon in summer months..

An electric light installation to comprise, 7 arc lamps for street lighting, supplemented by 15 kerosene lights, is at present being established.

The maximum shade temperature recorded last summer was 112F, and the minimum, in winter 46F.

The town supports 2 newspapers, one published once and the other twice a week. Fruit and vegetables of all descriptions are plentiful.

Banks also have branches in the town, and some very handsome brick buildings adorn the streets; which are very level, as the town is in flat country.


In contrast to each other may be cited Campbell's Kookynie Hotel [the first hotel in Kookynie] and McAdam's National Hotel of which buildings illustrations are hereby given.

Although the front of the Kookynie Hotel is not as imposing as that of the National, numerous additions in brick have been made in the back, but as a landmark of the early days,

the front remains almost identical with what it was before anybody guessed that within a year and a half, the town would become what it is now.


Last, but not least, the town has an excellent recreation ground and racecourse, and on the latter the Kookynie Turf Club holds 3 meetings annually.
