BY-LAWS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vict., No. 23), and of "The Cemeteries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 38), for the management of the Kookynie Public Cemetery (Reserve [^]₇₈₃₉).

BY-LAWS FOR THE REGULATION OF THE KOOKYNIE CEMETERY.

1. That the duties of the Secretary shall be to keep the cemetery register, collect all fees, and pay the same to the Board, make returns to the Board at such times and in such manner as the Board may from time to time direct; to dig or cause to be dug all graves, and generally to supervise the cemetery under the direction of the Kookynie Cemetery Board.
2. That the salary of the Secretary shall be fixed from time to time by the said Board.
3. The area of ground allotted for each grave shall not exceed eight feet by six feet, except in ground obtained under right of exclusive burial.
4. The area of ground enclosed by any fence or tomb shall not exceed eight feet by six feet, except in ground obtained under right of exclusive burial.
5. No fence, headstone, or other erection shall be placed within the above-named cemetery until first approved of by the Cemetery Board or its officers, as provided by "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."
6. Four hours' notice must always be given to the Secretary previous to any burial taking place.
7. Any person or persons ordering a grave in the above-named cemetery shall hand to the Secretary a written order from one of the trustees on the Board of such denomination or head of such denomination authorising the Secretary to open a grave in the portion of the cemetery set apart for such denomination.

8. No burial shall take place in the above-named cemetery before sunrise or after sunset, except by special permission of the Board or its officers.

9. All graves shall be dug to a depth of not less than six feet.

10. No grave shall be dug in the above-named cemetery except by permission of the Secretary, or by special permission of the Board or its officers.

11. This Board hereby grants to the several churches and bodies among whom the above cemetery has been divided the right to make such further rules or laws as they may deem desirable for the further regulation of their several portions thereof; subject, however, to the By-laws of this Board and to "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

12. No carriages, traps, carts, or other vehicles, excepting the hearse and mourning carriages, shall be permitted to enter the above-named cemetery without an order from the Board or its officers, and any person violating this By-law will be prosecuted.

13. The Board shall meet on the second Monday in each month, at 7.30 p.m., in the Kookynie Municipal Chambers, or at such other place and at such other time as may be directed by the Board, after due notice given.

14. Notice of motion must be given in writing at the previous ordinary meeting of this Board before any of these By-laws can be altered.

For the erection of headstones and railings—

Minimum charge of 7s. 6d. to a value of £7 10s.; from £7 10s. to £25, 5 per cent.; and over £25, 7½ per cent. on cost, including cost of erection. Fees to be paid in advance. Applications to be made to the Secretary before erection.
