BURTVILLE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Resolution (B).

WHEREAS by Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-12," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority, under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws; And whereas Model By-laws—Series "C"—have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th July, 1915: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Burtville Local Board of Health, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, that with the exception specified hereunder such Model By-laws be adopted for the district of Burtville.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-12," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws: Now, therefore, the Melville Road Board, being the Local Health Authority for the Melville Health District, does hereby make the following By-law:—

The keeping of any swine is forbidden in that portion of the district West of a line commencing at the river bank at the Northern part of Alfred Cove; thence to the most Northern point of Rome Road; thence South along the Eastern side of the said road to Canning Road; thence West along the Southern side of Canning Road to William Road; thence South along the Eastern side of said road to Haig Road; thence West along the Southern side of said road; thence South along the Eastern side of Stock Road, and its continuation in a South-Westerly direction to the boundary of the Fremantle Municipality.
