THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

April 2021



Friday 26th March attended the opening of the Woodlands Centre in Norseman. Also in attendance Brian Joiner, CEO and Cr J Dwyer.

Monday 29th March CEO and I had a series of meetings in Kalgoorlie. Firstly, met with Ali Kent (MLA) and Kyle McGinn (MLC). Discussion on a range of issues including availability of land and housing and the condition of the Connie Sue and Cutline roads within the City of Kalgoorlie Boulder.

Second meeting with ABC Goldfields re Covid incentives and establishment of a Volunteer Bushfire Brigade at Tjuntuntjara.

Met with Arianne Webb to discuss events including a Rodeo.

Attended Pastoral Alliance Meeting with CEO. A request from the group was made for assistance with their fencing project and a discussion took place on the Grid Policy.

CEO and I met with Deb Miles from Eastern Goldfields Cycle Club to discuss upcoming Cyclclassic event.

13th April with Cr J Dwyer attended Cactus Working Group Meeting in Leonora, CEO (attending via video conference). Later in the afternoon a meeting with Rick Wilson MP and Senator Matt O'Sullivan to discuss CDC service provision. Following the meeting attendees met at the Whitehouse Hotel for dinner.

Attended via telephone on 16th April a meeting of WA Midwest Yilgarn Infrastructure Group Inc formally Yilgarn Iron Producers Association established in 2012. The group is working to enhance Western Australian regional infrastructure and provide fair and open access for junior and mid-tier miners and other businesses.

Cr Mader and myself attended the Briefing Session on 22nd April.

With around 30 attendees I officiated the Anzac Day Service in Menzies, followed by breakfast in the Town Hall. Many thanks to staff for organising the event and providing breakfast.

April 2021

Welcome to the May edition of Menzies Matters. Winter has suddenly hit but the good thing is that it scares away the flies. There has been a big upturn in the number of caravans coming through town as tourists take advantage of the cooler weather to come and see our great area and its attractions.

Anzac Day was held at the Menzies Memorial site with approximately 30 people in attendance. Our small Dawn Service was followed by breakfast in the town hall, cooked by your Shire staff. I was forwarded a link to a website where some photos of our Memorial have been posted. With over 300 comments it is certainly seen as a great site to reflect as well as a piece of art in its own right.

Our towns and facilities continually get praise from visitors and their photos showcase us to a wider audience. They also mention how friendly the town is to visitors and that is something we must all work on. Goldfields Cyclassic Event Overview

After the disappointment of cancelling the 2020 Goldfields Cyclassic & Community Fondo the Eastern Goldfields Cycle Club Inc is pleased to announce that the 2021 Goldfields Cyclassic will be held on 5 & 6 June 2021. The event will continue as a two-day, two-stage handicap race across the Goldfields from Kalgoorlie-Boulder to Menzies and on to Leonora coinciding with the Leonora Golden Gift Foot Race. Riders will be racing across some of the richest and historic landscapes of the Western Australian Goldfields.

Being a handicap race, riders in all grades have an opportunity to win. Held over the WA Day long weekend, the two-stage event will be run as two individual race stages - the Shire of Menzies - Menzies Classic and the Minara Resources Leonora Golden Wheels. Each rider will be assigned a finish time as the time after the lead rider crosses the line and the time the rider crosses the line for each race. Prize money is allocated on merit so the spread of prizes is equal and fair, if you win Line Honours then you are not eligible to win a grade prize. The amount of money to be won is allocated accordingly so you will always win the highest amount.

The 2019 Goldfields Cyclassic was won by Theo Yates, in a combined time of 5 hours, 17 minutes. Women's Line Honor was won by Amanda Nabi in a time of 6 hours and 4 minutes.

The Shire of Menzies writes to advise that it has prepared a local planning scheme and local planning strategy and is inviting your comment upon these documents.

The *Planning and Development Act 2005* requires local governments to periodically review their local planning schemes, and the Shire of Menzies has prepared Local Planning Scheme No.2 for comment.

The purposes of this scheme are to -

- A) set out the local government's planning aims and intentions for the Scheme area;
- B) set aside land as local reserves for public purposes;
- C) zone land within the Scheme area for the purposes defined in this Scheme;
- D) control and guide development including processes for the preparation of structure plans, precinct plans, layout plans and local development plans;
- E) set out procedures for the assessment and determination of development applications;
- F) set out procedures for contributions to be made for the costs of providing infrastructure in connection with development through development contribution plans;
- G) make provision for the administration and enforcement of this Scheme;
- H) address other matters referred to in Schedule 7 of the Act.

A local planning strategy is a strategic document that:

- a) sets out the long-term planning directions for the local government;
- b) applies any state or regional planning policy that is relevant to the strategy;
- c) provides the rationale for any zoning or classification of land under the local planning scheme.

A hard copy of both documents can be viewed at the Shire Office, Shenton Street, Menzies and at the Western Australian Planning Commission, 140 William Street, Perth, and will be available for inspection during office hours up to and including 2 July 2021.

The documents, and a submission form should you wish to make comment, can also be viewed online at www.menzies.wa.gov.au

Submissions on the local planning scheme and local planning strategy may be lodged in writing and should include the property affected and details of the submission and must be lodged with the undersigned on or before 2 July 2021.

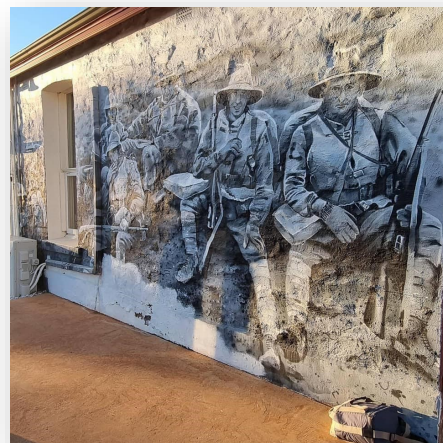

DATES TO REMEMBER IN 2020/2021

Restricted Burning Periods 1:

19 September 2020 to 31 October 2021 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Alternative firebreak applications to be submitted by 1 October 2020.

Firebreaks must be installed by 15 October 2020

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with

Prohibited Burning Period:

From 1 November 2020 to 15 March 2021 (inclusive)

All burning, including garden refuse is prohibited during this period.

Properties to be maintained clear of flammable material until 15 March 2021.

Restricted Burning Periods 2:

From 16 March 2021 to 30 April 2021 (inclusive)

Permits to burn are required during this period for hazard reduction burning.

Please note that penalties apply where burning regulations are contravened or permit conditions are not complied with. Certain climate or weather conditions may cause these periods to be extended or shortened. You must check the press for details or call the Shire office on (08) 9024 2041 before commencing to burn.

Unrestricted Season:

From 1 May 2021 to 18 September 2021 (inclusive)

Calling 000

Police, Fire or Ambulance

When you are transferred to the correct service you may be asked the following questions:
What is the address of the emergency? Street, cross reference or landmark will be required.

What is the telephone number you are calling from? This is in case your call is terminated or further information is required.

Tell me exactly what has happened? Provide a brief description of the problem.

How old is s/he? If unknown then approximate age.

Is s/he awake (conscious)? Yes or no answer required.

Is s/he breathing? Yes or no answer required.

The Communications Officer will then ask a series of further questions more specific to the problem identified. Answering these questions will ensure the most appropriate ambulance response is provided.

The Communications Officer will give you advice over the phone to assist the patient prior to the arrival of an ambulance. They may also ask you to turn on front lights if it is dark; if possible have someone wait out the front; and make sure the door is unlocked and open so the paramedics can enter.

Please remember to try and stay calm and speak slowly to the Communications Officer. Often an ambulance will be dispatched while you are still on the phone.

If in doubt you should always call triple zero (000). Sadly many people do not call for an ambulance as they are unsure of whether the situation is an emergency or they are concerned about the cost.

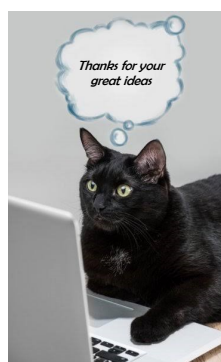

SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

1.

Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

2.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land
(\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

3.

Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement
(if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

4.

Get written permission

from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

5.

Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot
prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building
or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point
without the consent of the pastoralist.

6.

Show respect when on Crown land

because it is used by other people or set aside for
many purposes.

7.

Fill any holes

that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.
