THE SHIRE PRESIDENT'S REPORT November 2021

I attended a video conference information session on Golden Quest Discovery Trail Inc. with Sarah Hinton, Shire of Laverton, Shire of Leonora and Shire of Menzies CEO Brian Joiner to discuss current finances, future administration, a proposal for a way forward with a General Meeting/AGM to be held in November.



On Saturday 16th October, Election Day, with other Candidates and members of the public I attended the counting of the votes. Once the voting period had closed at 6pm and counting finalised, successful Candidates were declared, being Rural Ward JA Dwyer and G Dwyer, Town Ward P Warner, A Tucker and S Sudhir. I wish to acknowledge the contributions and commitment of Justin Lee having served 8 years on Council and Keith Mader 5.5 years.

With all new Councillors being sworn in we attended the Briefing Session on 21st October. Main information of the session for all Councillors was on procedures, protocols and Councillors' interests.

On Tuesday 26th I had my second Covid 19 vaccination at the Leonora Hospital. It was very pleasing to see procedures very much streamlined, with recipients moving through with their second dose with a shorter wait time.

November 2021

As I write this update there are only seven weeks until Christmas. It is good to see summer making an appearance although the proliferation of snakes through the area has not been as welcome. The Shire does have a couple of people who are trained in snake handling who can help out if required.

Along with the warmer weather comes our bush fire season. We are now in the prohibited period for burning until 30th April 2022. Please follow the restrictions to keep all of our communities safe.

October saw the Council elections held and some new faces on Council. I would like to thank Justin Lee and Keith Mader for their time on Council and the commitment they have given to the community. On the flip side, I welcome Cr Paul Warner, Cr Andrew Tucker and Cr Sudhir Sudhir to the Council and they have already been positive with their input.

The Old Butcher's Shop has almost completed its transformation into a Café which is tentatively scheduled for opening on Thursday 11 November. They haven't given me a name, but I wish Donna and Tom well with their new venture. I'm looking forward to dropping in for my morning coffee and sitting down to lunch in the Café.



Vaccination Costs

Vaccinations are free for pets being sterilised \$30 for Concession card holders \$50 for Non Concession card Holders

Murdoch students will carry out sterilisation and pet checks for **cats and dogs free of charge** to residents of Menzies. Registrations are to be paid for by the owner <u>prior</u> to surgery or on the day and a registration tag will be issued.

<u>Cash and EFTPOS only</u> is taken on the day. If paying by eftpos, this must be done during office hours at the Shire Admin Building.

Please contact the Shire by 15 November 2021 if you are interested in having your pet sterilised and micro chipped.

There are limited sterilisation opportunities available.

SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

- Put safety first

 Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first
- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies. Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

Obtain a Miner's Right permit when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

Obtain a 40E permit prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

- Get written permission
 from the tenement holder when prospecting on:
 a mining lease
 an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
 a prospecting licence

Comply with all legal requirements


when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

- Fill any holes that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

DID YOU KNOW

Mr. Lionel Bradley Pilkington 1856-1896

Lionel Bradley Pilkington was born in Ireland. Other records give different dates and ages — his daughter's birth certificate states he was born in Doncaster, England. Police records have him as aged 34 in 1895 and being born in Yorkshire, England and the 1861 English census shows Lionel as a 5 year old, with the date of birth as 1856.

Lionel's father was born into a prestigious English family.

His grandfather Henry Pilkington Esq, of Park Lane, was a Barrister at Law. His father, Henry Foster Pilkington Esq, was Captain of the 21st Riding of the Yorkshire Rifle Volunteers (1860). Henry Foster married widow Maria Dunsford and lived in Ireland where census records state all his children to Maria were born (including Lionel).

By 1861 they were living in West Riding, Yorkshire. Maria died in 1863 and Henry remarried Hannah C Hoyle, where they moved to Ceylon becoming acting Post Master General. Lionel, being the third son, attended boarding school in Great Grimsby, Lincolnshire, England.

Between 1871 and 1891 Lionel traveled to Australia while serving in the British Army after his father's death.

In 1891 Lionel lived in Lygong Street, Ballarat, Victoria. That same year he married Agnes Catherine McMillen. The marriage took place in the Fitzroy Town Hall. Lionel preferred to be known a Lionel Bradley, never legally changing his name.

On his marriage certificate he stated his occupation as a Clerk but on his daughter's birth certificate his occupation stated he was a Drill Instructor.


In the midst of the depression in the 1890s Lionel changed vocations and became a policeman in Western Australia. He left his family in the care of his mother-in-law in Victoria. Lionel commenced as a constable in the WA Police Force on 1

January 1895 and was transferred to Menzies in August of that year where he contacted typhoid fever and died on 27 April 1896 and was buried in the Menzies cemetery.

A few weeks after his death an article appeared in many newspapers all over Australia. Not knowing if these items claims are true or if the letters have survived:-

A Romantic History.

Details concerning Constable Bradley, who recently died of fever, reveal a most romantic story. His real name was Lionel Bradley Pilkington, and he was a possible heir to an English baronetcy. It is stated that before 20 years of age he came into a large fortune, and eloped with the wife of an English aristocrat. He squandered his fortune in America, finally landing in Australia in impoverished circumstances. His lineage is proved by a Burke's Peerage in the possession of another constable, who received letters for Pilkington in his real name.

Two doses of the Pfizer or AstraZeneca vaccine are very effective in protecting people from becoming seriously ill with the new variants, including the Delta strain.



You can choose to be vaccinated

You can make your own decision. Make sure you ask trusted people to help you find facts. False news can be very misleading and dangerous.



A microchip would not fit through the vaccine needle

This myth is based on a fake video circulating on social media.



COVID-19 vaccines can't change your DNA

The vaccines deliver instructions to your cells to build protection (immunity) against the coronavirus. This does not happen in the part of your cells where your DNA is.



Receiving a COVID-19 vaccine does not make you magnetic – anywhere on your body

COVID-19 vaccines do not contain any magnetic ingredients that could do this. You would need a lot of metal to attract a magnet. For example, people take multi vitamins which often contain iron. This doesn't make them magnetic because they are so diluted and spread through your body.

Effective 1 November 2021, the Call A Doc After Hours Doctor service available to certain Western Australian regional communities, will be replaced by Healthdirect.

Why is the service ending?

WA Primary Health Alliance has funded Call A Doc for several years, as part of the Australian Government Department of Health's Primary Health Network (PHN) program. The Department of Health has now confirmed Healthdirect as its primary after-hours advice and treatment service. As such, WA Primary Health Alliance, as the operator of the Country WA PHN will no longer fund Call A Doc. Call A Doc has been used as a stop gap to provide in hours services in areas with ongoing GP workforce shortages, however, this is not a sustainable model. The provision of regional workforce is the responsibility of agencies including WA Country Health Service and Rural Health West.

What services will the community have access to?

For those who might struggle to access face-to-face health services, particularly in the afterhours period and in rural and remote regions, Healthdirect's services are essential healthcare alternatives. Services include online health information, a symptom checker, a 24/7 helpline operated by registered nurses, and, after hours, the nurses may offer a call back or a video call from a GP who can provide advice.

How will Healthdirect localise their advice?


Healthdirect can localise advice based on their knowledge of local services.

What will people do if there is no GP within reasonable travelling distance?

If someone needs assistance and it is not an emergency, they should contact Healthdirect. Pharmacies can provide limited health advice including dispensing non-prescription medications and limited prescription medications, as well as medical certificates. In an emergency, people should always call 000 or go direct to their nearest emergency department.

Why can't telehealth be used by these communities?

Telehealth MBS item numbers often require patients to have had a face-to-face consultation within the last 12 months with the healthcare provider in question. There are some exceptions including when the area is impacted by COVID-19, at which time telehealth may be a temporary solution.

Calling 000

Police, Fire or Ambulance

When you are transferred to the correct service you may be asked the following questions: What is the address of the emergency? Street, cross reference or landmark will be required.

What is the telephone number you are calling from? This is in case your call is terminated or further information is required.

Tell me exactly what has happened? Provide a brief description of the problem.

How old is s/he? If unknown then approximate age.

Is s/he awake (conscious)? Yes or no answer required.

Is s/he breathing? Yes or no answer required.

The Communications Officer will then ask a series of further questions more specific to the problem identified. Answering these questions will ensure the most appropriate ambulance response is provided.

The Communications Officer will give you advice over the phone to assist the patient prior to the arrival of an ambulance. They may also ask you to turn on front lights if it is dark; if possible have someone wait out the front; and make sure the door is unlocked and open so the paramedics can enter.

Please remember to try and stay calm and speak slowly to the Communications Officer. Often an ambulance will be dispatched while you are still on the phone.

If in doubt you should always call triple zero (000). Sadly many people do not call for an ambulance as they are unsure of whether the situation is an emergency or they are concerned about the cost.

By calling triple zero (000), you may save someone's life.



Proposed Local Laws

The Shire of Menzies proposes to adopt the following local laws -

- Shire of Menzies Bush Fire Brigades Amendment Local Law (readvertised)
 Purpose to amend the Bush Fire Brigades Local Law so as to permit greater flexibility
 Effect amendment by removing mandatory training and specified dates to be met by bush fires brigades, and prescribing duties of officers
- Shire of Menzies Health Local Law

Purpose – to provide a statutory means of effectively controlling issues which have the potential to adversely impact on the health and well-being of the community

Effect – to allow health related issues to be controlled so as to provide an acceptable standard for the maintenance of public health in the community, and create remedies and offences for noncompliance

- 3. Shire of Menzies Public Places and Local Government Property Local Law
 - Purpose to make provisions for the management of public places, thoroughfares and all local government property

Effect – to repeal an existing local law, establish necessary controls for public places, thoroughfares and local government property, provide for permitted and prohibited use and activities, and create offences for non-compliance
