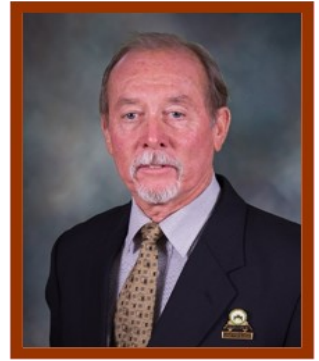

## JUNE 2022



This month has been relatively quiet without any external meetings to attend.

We had a Budget Workshop on Tuesday, 10th May, which was attended by the majority of Councillors.

The Briefing Session on 19th included presentations from Claire Bateman, KALSEC Creative and Bodean Buckingham, Outback Rodeo Assoc. Inc.

The Goldfields Cyclassic event is only just over a week away, with attendance looking to be around 180-200, final numbers will be available next week. Tents will be set up on the Basketball Courts for people to stay overnight in Menzies. Hoping for good weather and another successful event to showcase the Shire of Menzies. Everyone is welcome to attend the Community Breakfast, provided by the Shire of Menzies on Sunday morning 5th June prior to farewelling the cyclists on the last leg of the race the Leonora Golden Wheels.

# CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

## JUNE 2022

This weekend is the annual Cyclclassic running from Kalgoorlie to Menzies on Saturday and then Menzies to Leonora on Sunday. The event showcases some of the best cyclists in WA and interstate with a handicap system that makes for some very exciting finishes. The weather last year saw some fast racing and the long-range forecast is looking OK albeit a bit cooler than last year.

An Arts Advisory Group has been established and has met on several occasions. This group is focussed on providing advice to Council on the community's views on all matters related to the arts. The group meets once a month and new members would be welcome.

Our annual Harmony Day celebration was held during May and was very well attended. The range of food was fantastic, and we celebrated our diversity in style. I would like to thank the crew who did the organising and everyone who participated in the event and the businesses who donated to the raffle.

The Shire has just completed the interim part of its annual audit as required by our legislation. I'm pleased to report that there have only been a couple of minor findings. These audits provide assurance to ratepayers and residents that the Shire staff are acting in a responsible fiscal manner and operating in an accountable manner.

The Shire has become a member of a Regional Climate Alliance with eight other local governments within the Goldfields-Esperance region. This group was set up when we successfully applied for government funding for a two-year period. We are looking at several projects to either analyse the impact or minimise the impact of climate change.

Our works crew has been busy this month tidying up the tips and some of our tourist sites. I visited Niagara Dam last weekend and it is looking as good as I've seen the area. Our crew has also been assisting in logistics for projects out at Tjuntjuntjara through road transport. As this edition goes to print we should have completed the installation of CCTV throughout Tjuntjuntjara.

My final note this month is a bit sad for Eve and me. I have resigned from Council to take up the CEO role with the Cook Shire Council in Queensland. We have loved our time here and will look back on the Shire with fond memories. We finish here in July so, I'm sorry to say, you will have one more dose of my rambling before I go.

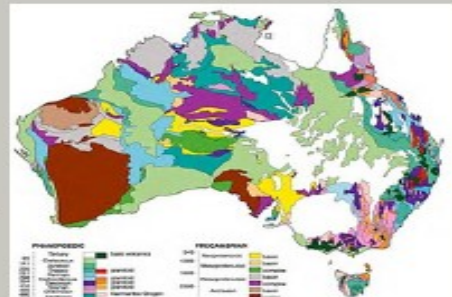

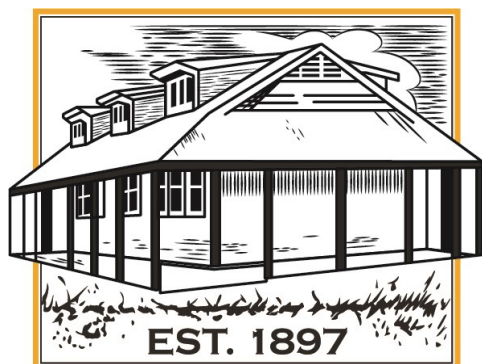

We enjoyed a relaxing afternoon completing craft activities organised by Bega Garnbirringu.



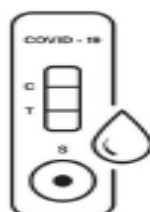
### From the Wanampi Classroom:

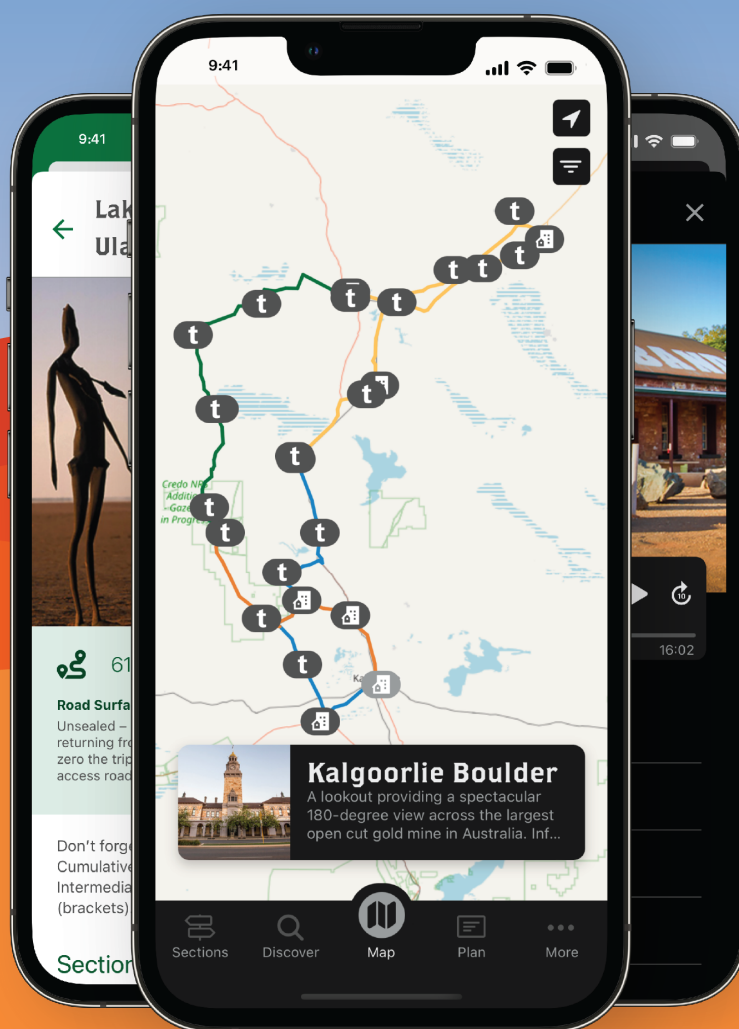

## Goldfields Cyclclassic 2022 94th Year

The Goldfield Cyclclassic the nation's Richest handicap cycle race, celebrated its 94th years on the first weekend of June 2022.



In 1928 a committee was formed to organise a long-distance event. They named it the Menzies Road Classic. The starting point was in the small mining town of Menzies and finishing 81 miles (132kms) away in Kalgoorlie. The date for the first race was the King's birthday in June 1928 .

The first race was won in the time 5hrs 55mins and 45secs.

The first five years route described as a bush track which was rough, ripply and sandy. The stretch from Menzies to Comet Vale was a cyclist nightmare, almost axle deep in sand. By the late 1930's the road improved having bitumen was from Broad Arrow to Hannans Street Kalgoorlie.

The Secretary of the bike club Chas (Charlie) Egan tragically died two days before 1932 race, all the riders worn black armbands as a token of respect. It was decided that future race would be known as the "Chas Egan Memorial Race".

In 1934 the trophy consisted of tubes & tyres. By 1939 the prize was more rewarding, for coming first was £75 cash, a Swansea cycle frame and a silver Prince cup, for the fastest time. The prize list included trophies for the first 15 men and 12 consolation prizes.

Prizes for the 90th Year in 2018 are a total of \$40,000 this is shared between line honours, fastest time, Grades A, B, C, D the young rider award last rider home and the oldest rider.

In 2011 combining the Menzies Cyclclassic with the Leonora Golden Gift, now held over two days. Starting in Kalgoorlie on the Saturday and finishing in Menzies, the Sunday is from Menzies to Leonora. The riders and official's stay in Menzies overnight and enjoy the evening meal where they have first day awards ceremony. After the evening meal is a fireworks show. On Sunday before they depart fore the ride to Leonora a big hearty Community breakfast is served for the community, riders and supporters.

### **Mining Boom gives Menzies rates boost**

The increased activity by gold exploration companies in the Menzies Shire over the 12 months to June 30 1986 was reflected by the rates raised on mining tenements.

The shire president said \$123,269.00 in rates had been raised on mining tenements at the recent electors meeting. Being well up on the year before.

A voluntary contributions made by Edjudina Gold Mines with the successful operation at Porphyry placing extra stress on the Kalgoorlie Yarri Road.

Other principal sources of income during the 12months had come from grants Commission (\$108,805.00), Main Roads reimbursements (\$149,620.00) and mining companies (\$12,000.00).

Expenditure was incurred on road construction and maintenance, \$192,000.00 was spent.

A new grader was also purchased for \$140,000.00 they have budgeted for further upgrade of plant for the financial year.

Other important jobs undertaken in 1986-87 substantial upgrading of the town hall and council chambers. A big improvement and certainly will secure a beautiful old historical building, one of the best of its type in WA. the upgrade and restoration will continue as fund become available.

Another notable event that year was the resolution of the water supply problems. A roving contract grader had been employed.

### **Project success**

Four people and a supervisor are employed on a 26 week programme through the Menzies Community Employment Project (CEP)

The group are cleaning up the Menzies cemetery and when that is finished than they will start restoring the footpaths.

For the first time in Menzies history street signs have been installed under the (CEP). The programme also involved in planting trees on the recreation ground and restoring the cricket pitch.

The Federal Government allocated \$47,000.00 and the council contributing \$17,000.00 towards the project.





## Mining boom gives Menzies rates boost

**THE increased activity by gold exploration companies in the Menzies Shire over the 12 months to June 30 last year was reflected by the rates raised on mining tenements.**

In its report to the recent annual electors' meeting, shire president Councillor John Tonkin said \$123,300 in rates had been raised on mining tenements. This was well up on last year.

The council appreciated the voluntary contributions made by Edgumina Gold Mines, which had acknowledged its successful operation at Porphyry. This had placed extra stress on the Kalgoorlie-Yarri Road.

Cr Tonkin said other principal sources of income during the 12 months had come from the Grants Commission (\$108,805), Main Roads Department reimbursements (\$149,620) and mining companies (\$12,000).

"Principal expenditure was incurred on road construction and maintenance. In which we spent \$192,000," he said.

"We also purchased a new grader for \$140,000 and budgeted at the end of the year to further upgrade the plant this financial year."

Cr Tonkin said the other important job undertaken in 1986-87 had been the substantial upgrading of the town hall and council chambers.

"It has been a big improvement and certainly will secure a beautiful old historical building, one which I believe is among the best of its type in WA," he said.

"We intend to continue with the upgrading and restoration as funds become available."

Cr Tonkin said the council had no outstanding loan commitments apart from the \$462, which was self-funding.

Menzies would be one of the few local authorities in the State in that position.

It meant that, with interest rates at such high levels, every dollar received was used to maximum advantage.

"Another notable event during the year was the resolution of water supply problems due to some fortuitous rain and a successful drilling programme which should ensure we do not get into similar difficulties again," Cr Tonkin said.

Steps were put in motion for a joint local authority-funded crematorium in Kalgoorlie to service the region.

"Cr Dave Bellar has done a lot of hard work on our behalf."

Cr Tonkin said that for the first time in his memory, the council had employed a contract grader with a moving maintenance trail.

This had relieved the permanent gang of some of the stress involved in trying to keep a massive area of roads in good order.

"The future looks sound as far as activity and rate revenue is concerned," Cr Tonkin said.

"However, with the increasing financial stringency at the Federal level, I would not be surprised to see some tightening of grants."

"There are moves about to have more money spent on metropolitan roads to the disadvantage of country roads."

"For this reason, I believe it is important we preserve the Country Shire Councils' Association in its present form and not get sucked into a single association where the country voice could well be lost."

## Project success

THE Menzies Community Employment Project (CEP) scheme is proceeding well.

Four people and a supervisor are employed on the 26-week programme.

Shire clerk Mr Pat Rodgers said the group was cleaning up the Menzies cemetery.

When that finished in four to six weeks they would start restoring footpaths.

"Under the project street signs have been installed for the first time in Menzies' history," Mr Rodgers said.

The programme also involved planting trees on the shire's recreation ground and restoring the cricket pitch.

The Federal Government allocated approximately \$47,000. The council is contributing \$17,000 towards the current project, which started on February 2.

## SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

### 1.

#### Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

### 2.

#### Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

### 3.

#### Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

### 4.

#### Get written permission

from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- a prospecting licence

### 5.

#### Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

### 6.

#### Show respect when on Crown land

because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.

### 7.

#### Fill any holes

that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

Baits are not intentionally laid in public areas such as road reserves, parking bays, rest stops or roadhouses however can be inadvertently moved into these areas by animals and birds.
