





#### Goldfields Cyclassic 2022 - 4 June and 5 June 2022

The Goldfields Cyclassic is a two-stage handicap race (the Menzies Classic and the Leonora Golden Wheels) across the Goldfields from Kalgoorlie-Boulder to Menzies and on to Leonora. For this year, it was held on 4 and 5 June.

Riders raced across the beautiful and historic West Australian Goldfields as they vied for line honours in one of four grades.

Non-competitive riders competed in Community Challenge where they completed the 132-kilometre between Kalgoorlie-Boulder and Menzies in a four-person relay. Heading off from Kalgoorlie-Boulder before the Cyclassic participants and arriving in Menzies cheering on the winners, the Community Challenge was opened to a wider variety of riders and groups. Individual riders were also welcomed.

This event is one of the richest handicap cycling events in Australia with a reputation of being one of the most professional and well organised races in Western Australia. The "Goldfields Cyclassic" event is growing from strength to strength each year.

Theo Yates and Richelle Gamble have won this year's Goldfields Cyclassic contested across two stages between Kalgoorlie-Boulder and Leonora. Yates followed up his 2019 victory with the overall fastest time this year, covering the journey in 4:54:46.





#### From the principal:

How times flies! Another term has finished, reports will be going home and school holidays are here. Term Two has been a successful term, we have seen many outreach services recommence, successful meetings with parents, an student teacher come, and many Facebook posts published.

Next term we will have school photos, a faction carnival with Mount Margaret, Interschool faction carnival and meetings about the school vision and values.

Attendance Matters! The attendance rate is dropping. Last year the attendance rate is 83.2% and currently it is 60.5%. What does that mean for us? It means that home visits will recommence next term to check that everything is ok. It also means that educationally, the educational gap will widen and that is something we don't want. The table below shows what happens when a student misses school.

This term, students from Yilpa classroom continues to build on their numeracy knowledge. They learned about number line. Now, they not only able to identify the missing numbers from the number line, they are starting to show fluency on counting on from any number. Students from Yilpa classroom also explored colours in with different mediums and observed the colour changes as they mix two or more colours together and discuss with their peers on the outcomes of different colour combinations.







#### From the Marlu Classroom:

As the first semester draws to an end, we would like to congratulate the Marlu students for their outstanding effort in their schoolwork, their superb participation in school events and kindness and compassion they show when working with younger students. Marlu students are really stepping up as role models during our Friday cooking sessions. During the Cooking Class, Marlu students adopted a leadership role during the cooking session, guiding their teams to create delicious food which was enjoyed by both students and staff.









#### From the Wanampi Classroom:

For the past two weeks, the Primary class has been participating in a Sitech STEM (science, technology, enterprise, maths) challenge. They were challenged to create a ball run using materials they found around the school and community. The students experimented with different materials and explored many different avenues of creating their ball run. This challenge encouraged students to use their team work, communication and problem solving skills. They showed great resilience and perseverance as they continued to test and reset their ball run. Overall, it was a very successful and engaging challenge!





#### **Menzies Discovery Day Event, 15 October 2022**

Earlier in the year, the Menzies CRC held a Community Catch-up to discuss ideas and things we like to happen for our great town. Collectively as a Community we discussed having more music-related events, where people enjoy a live band and have a little dance under the stars.

In March 2022, on behalf of our great community, the Menzies CRC applied for a Horizon Power Community Partnerships Grant to hold a Menzies Discovery Day event. In May, we were awarded an \$8,000 grant to help secure entertainment and advertisement.

We were very fortunate to secure the Mucky Duck Bushband to headline our community event, followed by Goldfields local, Marcus McGuire to open and MC our event.

The Menzies Discovery Day event to be held on 15 October 2022, is about incorporating First Nations history, European settlement (Menzies Foundation Day 14-16<sup>th</sup> October 1894) and other events (Emergency Day), this day of celebration will be utilised to extend the length of the tourism season and introduce others to the charms of our special region. A day to build on and enjoy community and connectedness. A day of discovery and rediscovery. Discover how and what makes this unique Goldfield town what it is. Discover your neighbour. Discover cultural variety and identity. Discover art.

This event aims in attracting around 300 to 750 people, we have around 150 people living in town, and know that other nearby towns in Leonora, Leinster, Laverton and Kalgoorlie-Boulder will also join the festivities. This event is a family-friendly event, and we encourage everyone to have a great day and night out. There is something for everyone and every age, the below are activities that we are organising leading up to the event and on the day of the event:

Nationally recognised Vocational Training has commenced within the Wiluna Community, with Carey Training delivering a Certificate II in Civil Construction this month for an 8-week duration.

#### The Mysterious Case of the Missing Doctor!!!

The mysterious disappearance of Dr Dale, who went missing on Saturday 18 September 1904 from Kookynie, this has caused great uneasiness with his friends from Kookynie. It appears that the doctor who practiced at Mr M Schneider's pharmacy during the past 5 months, went to Niagara on Saturday morning to attend a patient, and after having attended to his duties he proceeded to Jessop's Well. He stopped at the Falls Hotel for some time, and after

having had a drink, he was observed to cross the railway line about 3pm in the afternoon.

Immediately the matter was reported to police, Constable Sarori, accompanied by a black tracker, left for Jessop's Well when tracks, supposed to be those of the missing man, were picked up and followed along the railway line for six miles in the direction of Menzies, but owing to the heavy rains they could not follow further than 19 miles where there is a woodcutters camp. The men at the camp stated that they had not observed any strangers in the vicinity recently. The constable then made a detour to the right of the railway line and returned to Niagara at 7.30pm on Monday night, but without striking any fresh tracks. On Tuesday several search parties were organized, but they were unsuccessful. The search was continued yesterday but was again fruitless. Grave fears for his safety are held. However Dr Dale put in an appearance in Kalgoorlie yesterday evening after being missing for five days and was reported to be quite well. On the last occasion he walked from Kookynie to Esperance.

Jihn Dale (1885-1952), medical practitioner, was born on 2 May 1885 at Coleshill Warwickshire England. The son of James Francis Dale grocer and later chemist and his wife Mary nee Grace. He was educated at Solihull Grammar School and the University of Birmingham where he graduated M.B., Ch.B in 1908, also taking his M.R.C.S. and L.R.C.P. Next year he gained his B.Sc. (Public Health) in Birmingham where in 1911, after a two-year travelling studentship to Germany, he became assistant medical officer of health: he worked mainly in the depressed area of Smethwick. On 9 July 1914 he married Wynifred Mary Evans, a trained Montessiori kindergartener. There were four children of the marriage.

Dale served with the British Army in 1915 -19 as a major in the Royal Army Medical Corps and as deputy assistant director of medical services (sanitation) to the Second and Fourth Armies and Army of the Rhine. He was appointed O.B.E. in 1918 and was awarded a French decoration for 'overcoming a typhoid epidemic'. He took his M.D. (1919) after demobilization Dale and his family migrated to Australia and in February 1920 arrived in Perth where he was appointed medical officer of health

and assistant inspector of hospitals.

LOST IN THE BUSH.

News was received yesterday from the kalegoritie police to the effect that Dr. Dale, why was reported to have been tout in the beat, but turned up in Kelpoorile. It appears that the doctor has sweat times wandered away in a similar festion. On the lest occasion he walked from Kockynie to Exprance.

He retired in 1950. He was killed in a road accident at Venice Italy on 27 September 1952 and buried near Verona.



#### SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR **PROSPECTING**

- Put safety first

  Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)

  — it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

#### Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

#### Obtain a 40E permit

prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).

Get written permission from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- n the tenement noticer when prospecting on: a mining lease an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit) a prospecting licence

#### Comply with all legal requirements

when prospecting on a pasteral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.

Show respect when on Crown land

many purposes.

Fill any holes that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.
