



If you are caught lighting fires in bins during Total Fire Bans you may be prosecuted.




## LOST OR MISPLACED POST BOX KEYS

## SEVEN GOLDEN RULES FOR PROSPECTING

- 1. Put safety first**
  - Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps and first aid supplies.
  - Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.
- 2. Obtain a Miner's Right permit** when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).
- 3. Obtain a 40E permit** prior to prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder).
- 4. Get written permission** from the tenement holder when prospecting on:
  - a mining lease
  - an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
  - a prospecting licence
- 5. Comply with all legal requirements** when prospecting on a pastoral lease. You cannot prospect within 100 metres of any occupied building or within 400 metres of any livestock watering point without the consent of the pastoralist.
- 6. Show respect when on Crown land** because it is used by other people or set aside for many purposes.
- 7. Fill any holes** that you dug and repair ground that has been disturbed.

### COVER UP

Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also covered up.



### REPEL

Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoulamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.



### CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers.



# LOCAL HERO



**Gloria Fay Brennan** was born on 12 September 1948 at Leonora, second child of James and Myrtle Brennan. She attended primary school in Leonora, Laverton and Menzies. Gloria and her siblings spent the holidays with their Aboriginal grandmothers, camping in the desert country, finding bush tucker and listening to the stories of their country.

Gloria topped the small one-teacher school at Menzies while assisting with the grades one to three students. Her parents worked and saved to send Gloria to high school in Kalgoorlie and Perth, refusing to accept a government scholarship.

Between 1966 and 1971 she worked in programming for the Australian Broadcasting Commission (ABC) in Perth.

Inspired to further her education she enrolled in 1971 as a mature aged student in the Faculty of Arts at the University of Western Australia (BA); where she majored in anthropology, and studied linguistics, English, History and Music.

- 1971 she became a member of the Aboriginal Advancement Council of Western Australia as she was concerned about a range of issues, including the welfare of woman and children.
- In the mid 1970's Gloria was a founding member of the Aboriginal Medical Service WA

Gloria travelled extensively contacting other indigenous people and studied the Inuit of Canada.

- 1977 she was a delegate to the World Black and African Festival of Arts and Culture in Lagos, Nigeria
- 1978 she transferred to the Canberra office of the Department of Aboriginal Affairs and prepared a report on interpreter services for disadvantaged Aborigines
- 1980 she joined the Equal Employment Opportunity Bureau in the Public Service Board, as an office in charge of the Aboriginal Unit
- 1981 – 1983 Gloria became President of the Aboriginal Publications Foundation
- 1983 she took up a 6 month overseas duty to investigate how language and affirmative action policy were used to increase employment and education opportunities for minority groups

Gloria was big hearted with a wicked sense of humour, she loved life and her people. Challenging stereotypes of Aboriginal people, she became a highly-respected bureaucrat, a forthright public speaker and an international traveler. In 1984 Gloria was diagnosed with Breast Cancer and then sadly on 2 November 1985 she lost her fight with Cancer.

A scholarship for Indigenous undergraduates studying at public Western Australian universities was also name after her called The Gloria Brennan Scholarship.

The Gloria Brennan Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Woman's Centre was established in East Perth to provided health and childcare information.


